PASTOR'S COLUMN

Third Sunday of Easter

It's still Easter Time, and it will be until Pentecost! Don't let your Easter joy wane! Let your shouts of "Alleluia!" continue to be as strong this Sunday (and throughout these entire fifty days) as they were on Easter Sunday!

The Collect (Opening Prayer) for the Mass of this Third Sunday of Easter expresses well this tone of joy: the prayer describes how God's people have been "renewed in youthfulness of spirit" and rejoice "in the restored glory of our adoption." Such references to youthfulness, restoration, and adoption maintain the imagery of the new life given to us at Baptism, and also as recalled in the Rite of Blessing and Sprinkling of Water with which we begin all our Easter Time Sunday Masses. The Collect ends by reminding us that such Easter joy goes beyond the present moment — there is a fitting reference to the end times, the future fulfillment at Christ's Second Coming, as the prayers asks that "we may look forward in confident hope to the rejoicing of the day of resurrection." We must always remember that our present participation in the mystery of Christ's Death and Resurrection (the Paschal Mystery) cannot be separated from the way that participation points toward its future fulfillment.

The Prayer after Communion picks up this same theme when it asks that we may attain in our flesh "the incorruptible glory of the resurrection."

The Prayer over the Offerings continues to echo the joyful tone of Easter by describing us, as the Church, as "exultant" in offering the gifts (offerings) of this Mass, again asking that the offerings "may bear fruit in perpetual happiness."

As always, the prayers of the Mass highlight for us the meaning of what we are celebrating, and, by praying over them and reflecting on them ahead of time in preparation for Mass, we can gain a deeper immersion in the mysteries being celebrated when we are at Mass.

Parish Wedding Anniversaries Mass

This week we're starting to run the bulletin ad announcing our annual Parish Wedding Anniversaries Mass, the occasion when we affirm the graces and blessings married couples give to the Church, and to this parish in particular, through their living out of the Sacrament of Matrimony. A special Mass will be celebrated on

Friday, May 17 at 7:30 p.m., followed by a reception in the auditorium. As you know, this celebration is geared toward couples celebrating an anniversary on any five-year mark (5, 10, 15, 20, etc.), and couples married any year over 50 years. If you are celebrating an anniversary "on one of the fives" this year or are married more than 50 years and you would like to attend, please be sure to get your response in as soon as possible, so we can plan appropriately. We ask you to limit attendance to immediate family members only, due to space limitations. Also, while we're happy to provide this free of charge, if you would like to make an extra donation to help cover the costs for the reception following the Mass, we would gratefully accept your generous offering.

To all married couples: THANK YOU for your Sacrament of Matrimony, and for the way you give witness to Christ's love through your love for each other.

The Blue Door Boutique is a first-class thrift shop for those who shop there, and it also provides assistance to the poor and needy. It's a great ministry in the parish, and I am very grateful to all those who so faithfully and generously give of their time and energy to make the Blue Door Boutique the success that it is.

The auction and trivia night this Friday will be a great event, and I hope you will be there. I have once again been called upon for my unique game-show hosting skills to help run the auction and the trivia game, and I'll do my best to make it entertaining for everyone! At the same time, we'll be helping to raise some money for the thrift shop. So, as they say on a certain other game show, "Come on down!"

On Saturday night of this week I'll be pleased to be at the Testimonial Dinner honoring Past Grand Knight Steve Strigaro. Steve did an exemplary job during his tenure as Grand Knight, years which included navigating the Knights of Columbus through the pandemic, and I am extremely grateful for his leadership and his witness of faith. Steve is active in the parish in other ways, too, most visibly as a Cantor at Mass. I'll be happy to be one of the many at the dinner that evening who will pay tribute to Steve and his accomplishments with the Knights.

I am also extremely grateful to our parish Knights of Columbus Council as a whole, for the service they give to the parish, and, even more importantly, for the public witness of faith they provide to the Lindenhurst community. They truly are men of faith who have the Church at the center of their mission.

Some spiritual thoughts about the season of Easter Time

Finally, allow me to offer some additional spiritual food-for-thought concerning the liturgical season of Easter Time.

It has been said that Catholics are good at doing the season of Lent but bad at doing the season of Easter Time, and I think there is some truth to that. Think about it. We understand Lent rather easily, and it seems easy to get into the spirit of it. We think about what we're going to do for Lent, whether it's giving something up, and/or doing spiritual reading, and/or attending the Stations of the Cross, and so on. Somehow, though, we don't seem to be as resolute and determined about celebrating the fifty days of Easter Time. I think we need to get better at doing Easter!

The fifty days of Easter Time is the oldest liturgical season we have. It is both more ancient and more important than Lent. Lent only exists as a preparation for Easter! Maybe one of the ways we can get better about celebrating Easter Time is by focusing on the resurrection of Christ, and by being more joyful.

Easter celebrates Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Jesus Christ is alive! Our Lord has conquered death, and through his resurrection he offers us new life, supernatural life, eternal life. How often do we think and pray about that? How often do we let that truth of our faith color and influence everything we say and do?

Because of that, we should be more joyful. Why is it that some people, and sometimes all of us, find it easier to feel guilt rather than joy? Why do we sometimes think that holiness must be equated with somberness and suffering? I think we Catholics need to be better at joy — especially when it comes to being joyful when we're at Mass together (sometimes it's difficult to tell the difference between a Mass and a wake!).

So, how can we keep Easter Time better? Maybe one way is to allow Easter to be a preparation for Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit, the way Lent is a preparation for Easter. Maybe we need to really pray over the Mass prayers during Easter Time. Maybe we could read the Acts of the Apostles, and the Book of Revelation, books which are read at Mass during Easter Time. Maybe we need to take more prayer walks and make the connections between the spring renewal in nature and the supernatural renewal of new life in Christ that comes to us at Easter.

May we all keep the fifty days of Easter Time in the most complete and spirituallyfulfilling way possible!

In conclusion...

Together, let's aim high in Christ. Together, let's bring out the best in each other. Together, let's be the best we can be in Christ.

And let's always remember: LOVE IS A GIFT.



As usual, the meeting will include the opportunity for prayer, ministerial formation, and discussion of some important business items. All Lectors are expected to attend, as this is one of the required semi-annual meetings for ongoing formation. Thank you.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

Join us next Sunday at the 10:00 a.m. Mass Children 1st Grade and older can join in the Children's Liturgy of the Word every 1st and 3rd Sunday during the 10:00 a.m. Mass.



Participating in the Children's Liturgy of the Word continues to teach children how to participate in Mass, since they do the same things that are being done in the main body of the church.



As required by the Diocese of Rockville Centre, Sacraments of Initiation are to be celebrated in the home parish of the child. Therefore, all families of OLPH with children celebrating First Communion and Confirmation are to have their children celebrate those sacraments at OLPH. As Catholics, our faith identity is centered in our Eucharistic identity, namely, the Sunday worshipping community we belong to (where we celebrate Mass Sunday after Sunday). This community is our primary community and the community in which our faith is lived, day in and day out.

Because of this, and because each year of religious formation builds on the prior one, all school-aged children who are parishioners of OLPH, regardless of where they attend school, must be registered with our Religious Education Office for all years of religious formation (not only for sacrament-preparation years).

- Children **in all grades** who attend **public school** attend religion classes in our Religious Education Program, and they and their parents also participate in various non-classroom religious formation experiences.
- Children in all grades who attend a Catholic elementary school need not attend the Religious Education classes, but they must be registered in the program, and they and their parents participate in all the non-classroom religious formation experiences, especially but not only in sacrament-preparation years. These children celebrate the sacraments here at OLPH, not at the parish of their elementary school.
- Children in all grades who are homeschooled must also be registered with the Religious Education Office. They may or may not be required to attend the Religious Education classes, depending on their homeschool curriculum, but regardless, the homeschooled children and their parents are to attend the various non-classroom formation experiences, especially but not only in sacrament-preparation years. These children celebrate the sacraments here at OLPH.

If you are a parishioner with children in a Catholic elementary school or who are homeschooled and you are not yet on record with our Religious Education Office, please contact the office immediately. If you know of anyone who should be registered, please let them know of this policy. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

I am the good shepherd.

John 10:11

Acts of the Apostles 4:8-12

Peter and John were arrested by the leaders of the Jewish Temple in Jerusalem for preaching about Jesus and healing a crippled man in his name. The leaders questioned the apostles about what authority they had for doing these things. Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, proclaims that it is in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazorean that power was given to them to work this miracle. The physical healing of this man is also a sign of God's healing of all of us spiritually. Because Jesus died on the Cross for us and rose again, we are all saved. "There is no other name under heaven given to the human race by which we are to be saved." Good news indeed!

1 John 3:1-2

John writes to a first-century audience but his words speak to us as well. We, too, are God's children because of the love that God has bestowed on us in Christ Jesus. But even more than that (although what could be better than that?), we shall be something more. There will come a time when we shall know God face to face and then we shall be like him. The richness of God's love for us is never exhausted and always gets better!

John 10:11-18

John portrays Jesus as the Good Shepherd who was promised to appear at the fulfillment of God's plan of salvation. As a good shepherd, Jesus protects his sheep from the wolves that would harm them. Who are in his flock? Those who believe in Jesus belong to him, hear and respond to his voice, and so have life. Jesus lays down his life to protect us and lead us into everlasting life. This is something wonderful and truly to be desired. The question for all of us is, though, do we recognize the Shepherd's voice?

For whom would you lay down your life?

We know that the challenges of an unplanned pregnancy can seem insurmountable. This is especially true when it feels like there is no support for a pregnant woman struggling to appreciate the precious gift of life she carries and may compel her towards a regrettable decision. But genuine empowerment of women comes only through recognizing the dignity of the human person at every stage of life and this is most poignantly illuminated through the blessings of motherhood.

In this, it is with great joy that I announce the **FIAT Pregnancy Support Program** at Catholic Health. This program, in partnership with the Diocese of Rockville Centre, comprises a dedicated help line designed to assist women access the **counsel**, **resources**, and **encouragement needed to choose life** when facing a pregnancy with unexpected or difficult circumstances. **The Pregnancy Support Team is available 24x7**, 365 days of the year to assist callers in accessing the services needed to help them see that every new life is a blessing, even when there are challenges.

Any expectant woman in need of help can call the FIAT Pregnancy Support Program and be confident that, **regardless of age, religion, immigration status or ability to pay**, she will receive compassionate, non-judgmental, and *life-affirming* care. Most of all, she can be assured that she will not be alone through her pregnancy, and she will not be abandoned after she delivers her child. If she is overwhelmed by an unexpected pregnancy, contemplating abortion pills on her college campus, distressed with an adverse prenatal diagnosis, experiencing a miscarriage, worried about feeding her child, regretting a past abortion or other pregnancy-related distress, FIAT is there to help her sort things out and get the care she needs. It is my prayer that the **FIAT Pregnancy Support Program** be recognized across the Diocese of Rockville Centre as the first step a woman takes when facing challenging circumstances during pregnancy. There are promotional materials available at every parish and on-line, but we ask for your help to make this resource known widely through your prayers, your witness, and your word-of-mouth, for every one of us has an important and serious responsibility to spread the Gospel of Life. Let FIAT lead the way.


