

PASTOR'S PAGE

Pastor's Annual Report 2020

As you are no doubt aware, this weekend I presented my Pastor's Annual Report at all the Masses. I thank you for your kindness and attention in receiving this information; I think it is vitally important for me to do this as your Pastor, so I can be transparent and accountable to you. In next weekend's bulletin I will print a re-cap of my remarks, and the four-page summary hand-out of the numbers and graphs which was available at Mass is or very soon will be available on our website on-line, and there are probably some copies remaining in the church and/or at the rectory office.

I want to thank all of you for your wonderful stewardship of our parish, and for the way you constantly support it both financially and ministerially. It is extremely important that everyone have a sense of ownership of, and take responsibility for, our parish life together.

Meeting for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion

This Tuesday evening I will be meeting with the Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (with masks and proper social distancing, of course!). Of all our liturgical ministers, it's the E.M.'s and the choir members who have been most impacted by the adjusted procedures we have to follow due to the pandemic. Readers, Ushers, Cantors and Altar Servers have all returned to functioning in their ministries. Unfortunately, at this time, gathering the choir members to sing together as a choir is not possible, and we are not yet needing the service of our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.

This will be an important meeting since I'll be discussing with the E.M.'s our future direction as we continue to navigate

the celebration of liturgy in these coronavirus times. I want the E.M.'s to know that even though they are not currently active, we value their offering and their ministry, and we will discuss how they might be able to begin to function. I hope all E.M.'s will attend the meeting, which will, of course, include prayer time together, too. I look forward to seeing you there.

Our homebound parishioners

One aspect of parish life which I feel terrible about is that it is not yet possible for us to have our ministers to the homebound resume bringing Holy Communion to our sick and shut-in parishioners. After consultation with health care professionals, I have reached the conclusion that it is not yet safe to resume this practice. The sick and the shut-ins are an extremely vulnerable population, and having ministers going in and out of their houses is not safe for them and, quite frankly, not safe for the ministers, insofar as there is no way to control exposure to the virus from others who may also be in and out of the house and in contact with either the minister and/or the homebound person. This is a most regrettable situation, indeed, and it is one which we will continue to re-evaluate on a regular basis.

In the meantime, I want to assure all our homebound parishioners that you are not forgotten, and that we pray for you regularly. You continue to be a much-loved and much-valued part of our parish family.

All Souls Day, The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, November 2

Looking ahead in the calendar, I take this opportunity to invite you to make plans to attend Mass on Monday, November 2, All Souls Day (official liturgical name of the day: The Commemoration of All the

Faithful Departed). It's the day for us to pray in a special way for our beloved dead, and you could do so by celebrating Mass at our regular 6:30 a.m. or 12:15 p.m. parish weekday Mass that day, or at our special Parish Mass of Remembrance at 7:30 p.m. that evening; details about that special Mass are elsewhere in the bulletin. What a beautiful thing it is for us to do, to remember our beloved dead in this way. Please notice, too, how we are commemorating November as a special month of remembrance of, and praying for, our beloved dead in several different ways described in this bulletin.


ALTAR OF REMEMBRANCE



SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR BEING IN CHURCH

FOR THE SAFETY OF EVERYONE, ALL WHO ENTER MUST:

- ▶ **WEAR A FACE MASK OR FACE COVERING — NO EXCEPTIONS**

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

Confessions are being celebrated in the school building, in classrooms in the “new school” annex along High Street every Saturday, 4:00 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. until further notice.

Each priest will be in his own classroom.

These are the protocols that must be followed for going to Confession:

- ▶ **Entry is only via the blue doors at the north end of the hallway (off of the small parking lot)**
- ▶ **Exit is only via the doors at the south end of the hallway (into the large parking lot)**
- ▶ **Everyone — priests and penitents — is required to wear face masks or face coverings**
- ▶ **Lines on the floor will indicate a 6-foot social distance between those waiting on line outside each classroom**
- ▶ **Signs on easels outside the classroom will indicate the name of the priest who is in the classroom**
- ▶ **Social distancing and plexiglass dividers will keep a safe distance between priest and penitent, whether the penitent celebrates anonymously or face-to-face (both options are available)**





Keeping the American Republic with Its Judeo-Christian Values (continued)

As he walked out of the Constitutional Convention in 1787, Benjamin Franklin was asked, "Dr. Franklin, what have we got, a republic or a monarchy?" He answered, "A republic, if you can keep it."

The principles of American Judeo-Christian values honor God-given life and liberty and are the foundation-stone of our Republic. Foundational values include:

#3. Since God gives life, all human life is especially precious. "The Lord called me from the womb; from the body of my mother he called me." (Isaiah 49:1)

#4. Since God gives liberty, all rights such as freedom of religion and freedom of speech are God-given.

#5. The family is critically important and the "building block" of society, with parents responsible for raising and educating their children.

#6. In a republic, power rests with the citizens and the representatives they vote for, thus supporting a limited central government.⁽¹⁾

As Catholics obliged to contribute to the public good, we are called to support the principles and public policies that preserve these values. It is our responsibility to think carefully and decide:

- Am I able to look beyond partisan interests and personalities to support policies which:
- Protect the sacredness of life at all stages
- Assert the right to praise God and practice our faith openly without fear
- Support the right to freely assemble for prayer and other peaceful purposes
- Empower parents to choose the best school — public, private, religious, charter — for their children
- Ensure the right of Americans to voice differing opinions freely, without censure or retaliation
- Preserve life and liberty through the rule of law and order
- Secure our borders and safety in accord with Pope Francis' statement on Jan. 22, 2017, that, "Yes, every country has the right to control its border, who comes and who goes, and those countries at risk from terrorism or such things – have even more right to control them more."⁽²⁾

PREPARING FOR Sunday, October 25, 2020
Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time
You shall love the Lord, your God,
with all your heart, with all your soul,
and with all your mind.

Matthew 22:37

Exodus 22:20-26

In this reading the author reminds us that we are all responsible for each other. Concern for each other is evident in how we treat strangers (aliens), widows, and orphans, and in how we conduct our business. Because they did not have the protection of their tribe or clan or the same rights as the local citizenry, strangers, aliens, and other people displaced by war, famine and /or disease were susceptible to maltreatment. To motivate them in their concern for and treatment of aliens, the Israelites were to remember their years as displaced foreigners in Egypt and to exercise toward others the same compassion with which their cries had been heard and their needs had been met by God.

Thessalonians 1:5c-10

Thessalonica was a thriving crossroad city in the Roman Empire. As a result of Paul's anointed preaching a dynamic Christian church was founded and nurtured. In fact, this small Christian community became a wonderful example for many others, "a model for all believers in Macedonia and Achaia." Their "lived faith" sounded forth to all around them. People everywhere could see by their lifestyle how they had embraced Jesus and his teachings. Can the same be said of our church today?

Matthew 22:34-40

This week, the Pharisees are trying to entrap Jesus once again by having an expert in the law ask him a question about which of the 613 laws was the most important. This was a question often discussed among the leaders and an issue on which there was lots of disagreement. No matter what answer Jesus gave, the Pharisees thought that he would lose some credibility as a teacher with some of the people. When Jesus responds by saying that the whole law could be summarized in the love of God and neighbor, he wasn't saying anything new (see Deuteronomy 6:4-5). What is new about Jesus' response is that he made the love of God and neighbor of equal importance. He placed both together and also said both were equally important. Later, St. John in his first epistle would stress the equal importance of both commandments by asking: "How can you say that you love God whom you do not see if you do not love your neighbor whom you can see?" Loving with all our strength precludes part-time love and half-hearted service. With all our strength demands the same full-time effort that Jesus modeled for us during his ministry with us. If all this seems a bit daunting we must remember that all our strength for loving and serving comes from God.

Gospel Reflection

After reading next Sunday's readings take some time to pray on them before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.

1. You were made in God's image and likeness, and every good thing you have comes from God. What does God ask in return? Whatever your answer, is it always easy? Discuss whether "love your neighbor" includes your arrogant neighbor or just your kind neighbor.

2. Pope Francis made remarks about love and one of the first steps toward that love. In overcoming anger or rivalry, etc. he suggests praying for the other person. Would that help you accept the other as brother or sister?

What is the law of the People of God? It is the law of love, love for God and love for neighbor according to the new commandment that the Lord left to us (cf. Jn 13:34). It is a love, however, that is not sterile sentimentality or something vague, but the acknowledgment of God as the one Lord of life and, at the same time, the acceptance of the other as my true brother, overcoming division, rivalry, misunderstanding, selfishness; these two things go together. ... We must ask the Lord to make us correctly understand this law of love. How beautiful it is to love one another as true brothers and sisters. How beautiful!
