Q: Will parishioners user emails and passwords still work?

A: Passwords are being phased out. Parishioner emails will still work. Parishioners do not need to re-register to sign in.





Please consider participating in this Mass to join together in prayerful solidarity with our brothers and sisters who have lost a loved one in the past year.

All Souls Day Novena

All Souls Day Novena envelopes are now available throughout the church. These envelopes are a meaningful way for you to have your deceased loved ones prayed for in the Novena of Masses for All Souls Day. Take an envelope, fill out the name of the deceased, and return the envelope with your donation. Envelopes may be returned either in the collection basket or at the rectory. Special Masses will be offered for nine (9) days for these intentions for the deceased.

BOOK OF THE NAMES OF THE DEAD

Beginning November 1 a special book will be placed in the Divine Mercy Chapel for members of our parish community to write down the names of loved ones who have died. The names in this book will be remembered at our Masses throughout the month of November.






St. Dominic de Guzman was born in Spain in 1170. He studied theology for six years and the arts for four years. When there was a famine in Spain he sold all of his things, even his clothes, furniture, and books to study so he could buy food for the poor. He loved teaching people how to be a good Catholic and was sent to the south of France and then to Rome to start the Order of Preachers. His Order grew quickly across Europe.




A DAY OF SERVICE

New York State Proposes to Deny Religious and Private Schools Control Over Curriculum

While 30 states presently dictate the content of teaching core academic subjects (science, English, social studies, math) for religious and private schools, New York State has proposed a version of control that includes a much wider range of subjects and much more oversight. The proposed NYS law, S6589, known as “Substantially Equivalent Instruction for Nonpublic School Students,” would require public school administrators to oversee private schools within their border, whether or not their own schools are achieving academic proficiency, and would unconstitutionally force compelled speech, content discrimination, and viewpoint discrimination.

Leaders of Jewish, Catholic and other private schools explain that they already undergo accreditation by groups such as the NYS Association of Independent Schools. “Our schools go through a very thorough process, the gold standard of accreditation,” said the Association director. “To do anything in addition is redundant, unfunded and doesn’t make sense.”

“The proposed regulations disregard the long history of success demonstrated by private schools across NY State, they undermine the choices made by parents who choose private schools for their children, and they substitute the education bureaucracy in Albany for the private school leadership sought by parents and students,” wrote Parents For Educational and Religious Liberty in Schools (PEARLS).

Kellenberg Catholic High School principal Brother Kenneth M. Hoagland S.M., wrote, “New York State Education Dept. (NYSED) is attempting to drastically expand its authority over non-public schools... [Catholic schools] have always maintained a comprehensive educational program, equal or superior to the program of studies dictated by the NYSED. Under the proposal the [local school district] would oversee...lesson plans, testing scores, report cards and the like...No public school should have the authority to oversee our academic program.”

The immediate targets of the regulations are 39 Yeshivas that, for religious reasons, reject much of secular education and teach mostly in Yiddish rather than English. Many Jewish leaders see this law as a violation of religious rights, a threat to the traditional religious focus of their schools. The Catholic School Administrators Association of New York State argue that “the oversight of Catholic Schools by a [public school local district] is a clear conflict of interest and the proposed regulations are ill conceived and unacceptable.”



PREPARING FOR

Sunday, October 20, 2019

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus said, "Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily."

Luke 18:7-8a

Exodus 17:8-13

Moses intercedes for his people using the staff he previously used when God parted the Red Sea to allow the Israelites to escape from Egypt. This time he uses it as Joshua leads them in battle with the Amalekites who are trying to deny them entry into the land God promised them. Noticing that Israel has the better of the battle whenever Moses has his hands raised, Aaron and Hur help him keep his arms up during the long hours of the battle. What we see here is the importance of persistence in prayer. Moses, the nation's leader, not on his own but with the help of assistants, asks for God's help and mercy for the people who give their lives to protect the Promised Land. God hears his persistent prayer by giving Israel the victory.

2 Timothy 3:14 – 4:2

Paul speaks to his protégé Timothy lovingly and wisely about the role God's Word can (and should) play in his life. His words are just as powerful today to anyone who remains open to his Word and desires that it become the fuel that drives their heart. Paul writes from prison anticipating death on account of preaching the Word, so he is speaking of what he knows. He speaks of the power and awesomeness of the Word. "All Scripture is inspired by God," he says, and then goes on to list the many ways it is useful and can enrich our lives. Knowing it intimately equips us for every good work so that we can make a difference in our world by patiently sharing it with others.

Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks in a parable today about the necessity to pray always without becoming weary. An unjust judge feared neither God nor man but he gave a widow justice because she was persistent in her prayer. At an even deeper level, Jesus is asking us to be persistent in faith, not simply in saying prayers. We must return to God again and again, not with long discourses, but with simple faith that in humility of heart and in plain language places our needs before him with confidence in his merciful love. Our all-merciful God will indeed respond to the faith of earnest and humble believers.

Gospel Reflection Questions....

After reading next Sunday's readings and Gospel, take some time to pray on them before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.

1. What does Jesus' injunction, "Pray always ..." mean to you? Do you think Jesus means only prayers of petition? What does Jesus want to make clear to you about petitioning God? Discuss this statement: "When you pray for rain, take an umbrella."

2. In his address for the "Angelus," Pope Francis asks, "Why does God want us 'to cry out day and night' to the Lord? Doesn't God already know our needs?"

"And this is a good question, that leads us to deepen a very important aspect of the Faith: God invites us to pray with insistence, not because he doesn't know what we need, or because he doesn't listen to us. On the contrary, he always hears and knows all of us, with love. In our daily journey, especially in difficulties, in the fight against evil outside of ourselves and within us, the Lord is not far away, he is at our side; we fight with him beside us, and our weapon is prayer, which makes us feel his presence alongside of us, his mercy, even his help."


