

Third Sunday of Easter

It's still Easter Time, and it will be until Pentecost! Don't let your Easter joy wane! Let your shouts of "Alleluia!" continue to be as strong this Sunday (and throughout these entire fifty days) as they were on Easter Sunday!

The Collect (Opening Prayer) for the Mass of this Third Sunday of Easter expresses well this tone of joy: the prayer describes how God's people have been "renewed in youthfulness of spirit" and rejoice "in the restored glory of our adoption." Such references to youthfulness, restoration, and adoption maintain the imagery of the new life given to us at Baptism, and also as recalled in the Rite of Blessing and Sprinkling of Water with which we begin all our Easter Time Sunday Masses. The Collect ends by reminding us that such Easter joy goes beyond the present moment — there is a fitting reference to the end times, the future fulfillment at Christ's Second Coming, as the prayers asks that "we may look forward in confident hope to the rejoicing of the day of resurrection." We must always remember that our present participation in the mystery of Christ's Death and Resurrection (the Paschal Mystery) cannot be separated from the way that participation points toward its future fulfillment.

The Prayer after Communion picks up this same theme when it asks that we may attain in our flesh "the incorruptible glory of the resurrection."

The Prayer over the Offerings continues to echo the joyful tone of Easter by describing us, as the Church, as "exultant" in offering the gifts (offerings) of this Mass, again asking that the offerings "may bear fruit in perpetual happiness."

As always, the prayers of the Mass highlight for us the meaning of what we are celebrating, and, by praying over them and reflecting on them ahead of time in preparation for Mass, we can gain a deeper immersion in the mysteries being celebrated when we are at Mass.

Mother's Day Novena of Masses

Allow me to highlight our custom of the Novena of Masses for Mother's Day, and to invite you to participate in this beautiful way to remember and pray for your living or deceased mother, grandmother or godmother, or for a mother-to-be. Use the Mother's Day cards and envelopes that have been placed around the church or that have been mailed to you; your intention will be remembered in the Mother's Day Novena of Masses. Be sure to return your envelope and share in the prayers and blessings of this Novena.

First Communions

Next weekend, April 29-30, and also the following Sunday, May 7, and the weekend after that on Saturday, May 13, we are celebrating First Holy Communions at certain Sunday Masses. There is no better way for children to celebrate First Holy Communion than within the Sunday assembly, as the Church celebrates the Eucharist on the Lord's Day, our primary holy day! I am thrilled that over the years since we introduced this option more and more families are making this important connection and are taking advantage of this option. So many parishioners love it, too, as you comment to me how much you enjoy seeing the children, and how being a part of the celebration enriches your own faith and your appreciation of the Eucharist. I hope you are fortunate to be at a Mass at which we are celebrating First Holy Communion!

In addition, we will also celebrate First Holy Communion at an additional Mass on Saturday, May 6. Please remember to pray for all of this year's First Communicants.

Parish Wedding Anniversaries Mass

You've seen the bulletin ad announcing our annual Parish Wedding Anniversaries Mass, the occasion when we affirm the graces and blessings married couples give to the Church, and to this parish in particular, through their living out of the Sacrament of Matrimony. A special Mass will be celebrated on Friday, May 19 at 7:30 p.m., followed by a reception in the auditorium. As you know, this celebration is geared toward couples celebrating an anniversary on any five-year mark (5, 10, 15, 20, etc.), and couples married any year over 50 years. If you are celebrating an anniversary "on one of the fives" this year or are married more than 50 years and you would like to attend, please be sure to get your response in as soon as possible, so we can plan appropriately. We ask you to limit attendance to immediate family members only, due to space limitations. Also, while we're happy to provide this free of charge, if you would like to make an extra donation to help cover the costs for the reception following the Mass, we would gratefully accept your generous offering.

To all married couples: THANK YOU for your Sacrament of Matrimony, and for the way you give witness to Christ's love through your love for each other.

Some spiritual thoughts about the season of Easter Time

Finally, allow me to supplement my thoughts in the first section of this column by providing you with some spiritual food-for-thought concerning the liturgical season of Easter Time.

It has been said that Catholics are good at doing the season of Lent but bad at doing the season of Easter Time, and I think there is some truth to that. Think about it. We understand Lent rather easily, and it seems easy to get into the spirit of it. We think about what we're going to do for Lent, whether it's giving something up, and/or doing spiritual reading, and/or attending the Stations of the Cross, and so on. Somehow, though, we don't seem to be as resolute and determined about celebrating the fifty days of Easter Time. I think we need to get better at doing Easter!

The fifty days of Easter Time is the oldest liturgical season we have. It is both more ancient and more important than Lent. Lent only exists as a preparation for Easter! Maybe one of the ways we can get better about celebrating Easter Time is by focusing on the resurrection of Christ, and by being more joyful.

Easter celebrates Jesus' resurrection from the dead. Jesus Christ is alive! Our Lord has conquered death, and through his resurrection he offers us new life, supernatural life, eternal life. How often do we think and pray about that? How often do we let that truth of our faith color and influence everything we say and do?

Because of that, we should be more joyful.

Why is it that some people, and sometimes all of us, find it easier to feel guilt rather than joy? Why do we sometimes think that holiness must be equated with somberness and suffering? I think we Catholics need to be better at joy — especially when it comes to being joyful when we're at Mass together (sometimes it's difficult to tell the difference between a Mass and a wake!).

So, how can we keep Easter Time better? Maybe one way is to allow Easter to be a preparation for Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit, the way Lent is a preparation for Easter. Maybe we need to really pray over the Mass prayers during Easter Time. Maybe we could read the Acts of the Apostles, and the Book of Revelation, books which are read at Mass during Easter Time. Maybe we need to take more prayer walks and make the connections between the spring renewal in nature and the supernatural renewal of new life in Christ that comes to us at Easter.

May we all keep the fifty days of Easter Time in the most complete and spiritually-fulfilling ways possible!

In conclusion...

Together, let's aim high in Christ. Together, let's bring out the best in each other. Together, let's be the best we can be in Christ.

And let's always remember: LOVE IS A GIFT.





Participating in the Children's Liturgy of the Word continues to teach children how to participate in Mass, since they do the same things that are being done in the main body of the church



IMPORTANT NOTICE AFFECTING ALL CHILDREN OF THE PARISH

As required by the Diocese of Rockville Centre, Sacraments of Initiation are to be celebrated in the home parish of the child. Therefore, all families of OLPH with children celebrating First Communion and Confirmation are to have their children celebrate those sacraments at OLPH. As Catholics, our faith identity is centered in our Eucharistic identity, namely, the Sunday worshipping community we belong to (where we celebrate Mass Sunday after Sunday). This community is our primary community and the community in which our faith is lived, day in and day out.

Because of this, and because each year of religious formation builds on the prior one, all school-aged children who are parishioners of OLPH, regardless of where they attend school, must be registered with our Religious Education Office for all years of religious formation (not only for sacrament-preparation years).

- Children in all grades who attend public school attend religion classes in our Religious Education Program, and they and their parents also participate in various non-classroom religious formation experiences.
- Children in all grades who attend a Catholic elementary school need not attend the Religious Education classes, but they must be registered in the program, and they and their parents participate in all the non-classroom religious formation experiences, especially but not only in sacrament-preparation years. These children celebrate the sacraments here at OLPH, not at the parish of their elementary school.
- Children in all grades who are homeschooled must also be registered with the Religious Education Office. They may or may not be required to attend the Religious Education classes, depending on their homeschool curriculum, but regardless, the homeschooled children and their parents are to attend the various non-classroom formation experiences, especially but not only in sacrament-preparation years. These children celebrate the sacraments here at OLPH.

If you are a parishioner with children in a Catholic elementary school or who are homeschooled and you are not yet on record with our Religious Education Office, please contact the office immediately. If you know of anyone who should be registered, please let them know of this policy. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.



FOCUS ON RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Threaten Religious Liberty: Their Only Goal, They State, Is to Remove the Rights of Priests

A New Threat to Religious Liberty for Catholics by Matt Lamb

Delaware and Vermont legislators are debating bills that would do away with what is called the "seal of confession," a teaching of the Catholic Church that forbids priests from divulging what is heard during confession, when a Catholic shares his or her sins with a priest and seeks absolution.

Efforts to force Catholic priests to reveal admissions of child abuse heard in the confessional, the location where the Sacrament of Reconciliation is heard, are a threat to religious liberty.

While it is not clear if anti-Catholic animus is behind this legislation, it is also unclear what this bill would accomplish besides targeting Catholic priests for further questioning and forcing them to choose between going to jail or breaking a sacred promise they made never to divulge what is said in confession.

A priest who shares what someone told him in confession is automatically excommunicated, forbidden from accessing the other sacraments.

TERCER DOMINGO DE PASCUA (Ciclo A)

Primer Lectura (Hechos 2,14.22-33): El Señor ha Resucitado y Vive para siempre

Lleno del Espíritu Santo, el día de Pentecostés, Pedro proclama el centro y corazón del mensaje cristiano: Cristo murió, pero vive como nuestro Señor resucitado. Éste es el fundamento de nuestra fe. Por eso Jesús puede estar ahora con nosotros.

Segunda Lectura (1 Pedro 1,17-21): El Señor Resucitado es el fundamento de Nuestra Esperanza.

Pedro anima a los fieles: Dios es nuestro Padre; él envió a su Hijo para salvarnos por su muerte y resurrección. Esto da sentido a nuestras vidas; éste es el fundamento de nuestra fe y de nuestra esperanza.


Evangelio (Lucas 24,13-35): Le Reconocieron al Partir el Pan

Lucas aprovecha la ocasión del desaliento de dos discípulos y su encuentro con Cristo para decirnos esto: El Señor resucitado sigue viviendo entre nosotros, sus fieles, por la Palabra que nos proclama y por la Eucaristía.

Las Escrituras, llamadas con la expresión: "Moisés y los profetas" son el antecedente necesario para conversión y la fe en Cristo. Lo había dicho Jesús en una severa advertencia: "Si no escuchan a Moisés y los profetas, no se convertirán ni aunque resucite un muerto" (Lc 16,31). Más argumento de fe es la atención a la Palabra de Dios que la resurrección de un muerto. Por eso interesaba menos que los discípulos reconocieran a Jesús en el camino: lo que interesaba es que comprendieran que su muerte era parte del plan salvífico anunciado por Dios, es decir, que "era necesario que padeciera eso y entrara así en su gloria". Y así lo estaban comprendiendo, pues sentían que "les ardía el corazón dentro del pecho cuando les hablaba y les explicaba las Escrituras".

Pero sus ojos se abrieron y lo reconocieron "cuando se puso a la mesa con ellos, tomó el pan, pronunció la bendición, lo partió y se lo iba dando". Es el gesto que ellos citan expresamente cuando refieren el hecho a los apóstoles: "Contaron lo que había pasado en el camino y cómo lo habían conocido en la fracción del pan". Ya no tenían dudas. Se han convertido radicalmente por el contacto con la Palabra y la Eucaristía. En lugar del abatimiento y la tristeza que los llevaba a alejarse de Jerusalén, están ahora llenos de gozo que les hace arder el corazón y vuelven corriendo a Jerusalén. En lugar de confiar en un caudillo terreno, confiesan al Señor de la gloria.

Este cambio tan radical es lo que se llama "ser evangelizado". Mientras no se haya vivido esto, no se habrá recibido aún la Buena Nueva. Y la evangelización acontecerá siempre por el examen de "todo lo que dice la Escritura acerca de Cristo" y por el contacto directo con El en la Eucaristía.

PREPARING FOR

Sunday, April 30, 2023 **FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER**

I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly.

John 10:10

Acts of the Apostles 2:14a, 36-41

Today we hear roughly the second half of Peter's speech (we heard the first half last week) to fellow Jews in Jerusalem soon after the apostles' Pentecost experience of the Holy Spirit. Peter explains that the Jesus who was executed has been made both Lord and Messiah (Christ). Clearly Peter had the power of the Spirit within him since saying this openly was offensive both to the Jewish leaders and the Romans. But proclaiming Jesus this way had an amazing effect on his listeners: about three thousand people were baptized as a result. Speaking with the conviction of the Holy Spirit really is powerful!

1 Peter 2:20b-25

The Second Reading for today, as for all the Sundays after Easter, is taken from a letter attributed to Peter. He writes to Christians who were facing some unnamed trials and sufferings in order to encourage them and strengthen them in the faith in their hour of need. He tells them, "If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good, this is a grace before God." Then he gives us Jesus as a model. Although he committed no sin, he bore our sins patiently in his body on the cross so that we might be free from sin and live for righteousness. With such an example as this, it puts our day-to-day troubles into perspective.

John 10:1-10

John portrays Jesus as the Good Shepherd who was promised to appear at the fulfillment of God's plan of salvation. As a good shepherd, Jesus protects his sheep from harm and acts as the "gate" to allow his flock to go in and out safely and find pasture. Only those who belong to his flock, though, can enter and leave by the gate. Who are in his flock? Those who believe in Jesus belong to him, hear and respond to his voice, and so have life. Jesus promised his sheep life but not just ordinary life – he promised them abundant life. This is something wonderful and truly to be desired. The question for all of us is, though, do we recognize the Shepherd's voice?

Not only does he keep his doors open, but he also goes to seek out those who no longer wish to enter them.

In the heart of the Good Shepherd, the Father's love shines forth. There I know I am welcomed and understood as I am; there, with all my sins and limitations, I know the certainty that I am chosen and loved.

The heart of the Good Shepherd tells us that his love is limitless. It is never exhausted and it never gives up. There we see his infinite and boundless self-giving. There we find the source of that faithful and meek love which sets free and makes others free."


