

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Seventh Sunday of Easter

It's the Seventh Sunday of Easter, and we are at a very special time in our liturgical year - the time between the Ascension and Pentecost. The Collect (Opening Prayer) for the Mass for this Sunday acknowledges the paradoxical nature that Christ is both with the Father in glory and, at the same time, present among us; the prayer therefore asks that "...we who believe that the Savior of the human race is with you in your glory, may experience, as he promised, until the end of the world, his abiding presence among us." Though on face value the words "Ascension" and "abiding presence" may seem to contradict each other, theologically they are actually different aspects of one and the same reality — namely, that Jesus has assumed His rightful place as Lord of the universe, both in heaven and on earth. The other main prayers of the Mass also ask that one day we will be with Christ in His heavenly glory: the Prayer over the Offerings asks that "we may pass over to the glory of heaven," and the Prayer after Communion asks that "there will be accomplished in the body of the whole Church what has already come to pass in Christ her Head."

In these last days of Easter Time, as we move closer and closer to the great Solemnity of Pentecost, continue to reflect on the glorious life we are destined to share with our crucified and risen Lord who now sits "at the right hand of the Father," and how that glorious life is available to us now through grace, especially as God's grace comes to us through the sacraments.

Novena to the Holy Spirit

So, we are in the midst of the nine days from Ascension to Pentecost, the time when we urgently and fervently pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit. Are you in some way offering special prayers for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost? If you are able, join in our communal praying of the special Novena to the Holy Spirit. Look elsewhere in this bulletin for the schedule of times for that Novena. If you can't join in the communal prayer, pray a Novena to the Holy Spirit, or other prayers to the Holy Spirit, on your own, or with your

family members at home.

Happy Mother's Day!

Blessings and best wishes to all mothers celebrating Mother's Day today! May God bless you for the many sacrifices and offerings you make for your children and for your family. We should be grateful to you not just on one day, but all year long, for the important role you play. Let's also keep in our prayers today those who might find Mother's Day to be a difficult day — mothers who have lost children; children who have lost their mothers; women who are having difficulty becoming mothers; mothers and children who are estranged from one another; mothers whose children are ill and suffering.

First Holy Communions

We finish up our "First Holy Communion season" this weekend, with the last of our First Communions taking place at the 5:00 p.m. Mass on Saturday and at the 12:00 Noon Mass on Sunday. I want to once again congratulate all our First Communicants and their families. It is my fervent prayer that these children and their families will participate in Mass each and every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation, and that through the Eucharist they will always deepen their relationship with Jesus.

Ministry of Consolation

As you heard from the speaker at all the Masses this past weekend, and as you can see from the bulletin ad, we are looking for more people to join the Ministry of Consolation. This is one of the most beautiful and important ministries we offer here at OLPH, and I ask you to take the time to read the bulletin ad and to seriously consider joining the ministry. We are very much in need of new offerers to work in this ministry.

This ministry impacts peoples' lives at a very important time and, because of the wonderful work that is done, it is often a vehicle for bringing people back to Mass after they have been away for a long time. As I always say, the liturgy of the Church, when

done well, is the best form of evangelization there is, and that's especially true of the funeral rites when they are celebrated in all their fullness. Even though the Ministry of Consolation ministers to people at the time of the Funeral Mass, it is far from a depressing ministry; in fact, it is life-giving and life-affirming in the way it touches people on a deep level.

Also, it's not as intense as you might think; serving as a greeter or an altar server at Funeral Masses, and/or coordinating behind-the-scenes details and making assignments of ministers, and/or baking a cake for a family — all very necessary jobs — don't involve a tremendous amount of time.

Please see the ad concerning the Ministry of Consolation, and please give serious and prayerful consideration to coming on board. If you are recently retired or suddenly find yourself with some extra time on your hands, you're a perfect fit for this! Feel free to contact me, or Ken Hale, the Overall Administrator of the ministry, if you have any questions.

I'm extremely grateful to all who currently serve in this ministry. All the ministers of consolation do an amazing job and are extremely generous with their time and their energy. It's time once again to see about expanding the ranks, so that a great deal of work does not wind up falling on just a small number of people. That's why we're waiting for YOU to join the Ministry of Consolation!

Meeting of combined Pastoral Staff and Pastoral Council

On Tuesday night of this week we will hold our annual meeting of the combined Pastoral Staff and Pastoral Council. This is always an important meeting which I look forward to each year, a meeting that is of great value to me as Pastor. We will pray Evening Prayer together, then share a festive dinner, and then hold the meeting, the agenda for which is determined by members of the Staff and the Council.

As mentioned, I always place a high value and a great deal of importance on this annual meeting with these two leadership and advisory boards of the parish. Aside from the value of having the members of the two groups

interact and get to know each other a little better, these meetings have always provided important input for me, and even specific recommendations and plans of action. concerning the direction of the parish for the upcoming year and beyond. There is usually a "take away" for the Pastoral Staff to continue to discuss when we go away overnight on our annual two-day retreat and planning meeting in June. This combined meeting is a very rich and energizing evening, and I know that much good fruit will come out of it. I am grateful to all the Pastoral Staff and Pastoral Council members who participate in and work on these advisory boards.

Vigil of Pentecost, this coming Saturday, May 18, 5:00 p.m. Mass

Next Sunday we celebrate the beautiful Solemnity of Pentecost. At the conclusion of that day, Easter Time ends and we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. (Look for the change in our liturgical environment once Easter Time ends!) At Pentecost we commemorate three interconnected realities: the gift of the Holy Spirit being given to the Apostles; the beginnings of the Church; and the start of the Church's mission to all peoples and nations.

The Church encourages all parishes to celebrate a special Mass as a Vigil of Pentecost. The character of this Pentecost Vigil is not baptismal in nature, as is the Easter Vigil, but rather its focus is one of urgent prayer, after the example of the Apostles and disciples, who persevered together in prayer with Mary, the Mother of Jesus, as they awaited the Holy Spirit.

The 5:00 p.m. Mass this coming Saturday, May 18, will be a special celebration of the Vigil of Pentecost. This is one of the major liturgical events which takes place in the life of our parish, and those who participate in the beauty and solemnity of these parish "principal" or "major event" liturgies always come away deeply spiritually enriched and uplifted. Therefore, I ask you to make every effort to attend our special Vigil of Pentecost on Saturday, May 18 at 5:00 p.m.

The Mass will feature several special

aspects. Our Entrance Procession will express the richness of our sacramental life as we include onlv liturgical ministers. but also parishioners who have celebrated sacraments over the past year. We will celebrate a special Vigil of Readings that includes four Old Testament readings; not all of them will be proclaimed in English, so that we might reflect the cultural backgrounds of the members of OLPH and express our oneness in the Holy Spirit even in the midst of speaking in different tongues. Readings will be proclaimed in English, Polish, Spanish and French. We will also celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for five (5) adults, one of whom will also be celebrating her First Holy Communion.

It promises to be an uplifting, grace-filled liturgy where, in the words of the invitation which will be prayed at the beginning of the Mass, we will "meditate on how many great deeds God in times past did for his people" and during which we will "pray that the Holy Spirit, whom the Father sent as the first fruits for those who believe, may bring to perfection his work in the world."

We look forward to seeing you at the 5:00 p.m. Mass this coming Saturday, so that, "by the bright rays of the Holy Spirit, the light of [God's] light may confirm the hearts of those born again by grace" (taken from the Collect of the Vigil Mass).

Wear the color red next weekend for Pentecost!

We're asking everyone to wear red when you come to Mass next weekend, at both the Saturday night Vigil and the Sunday Masses. Red is the color for Pentecost, since it is the color of the Holy Spirit; it's the color of the vestments the priest and deacon will be wearing. Let's make our entire church assembly aflame and aglow with the color of the fire of the Holy Spirit next weekend at all the Masses for Pentecost!

Last chance to get in on the next set of bricks!

Reminder: The deadline for getting in on the next set of bricks is Friday, May 31, 2024. This next set of new bricks will be installed and blessed sometime at the end of August or the beginning of September, so you must submit your form and payment before May 31 if you want to be in on this batch.

However, this does not mean there are no

more bricks available after that day; just the opposite! There still will be plenty of bricks available for memorialization! Our brick memorialization program is ongoing. We will accumulate the next batch and, when we have accumulated enough, we will send those out, as a group, for engraving and installation. This ongoing fund raiser is a big help to us, so your continued support is appreciated.

Have you signed up to take a turn carrying a corner of the Canopy for the Eucharistic Procession?

Looking ahead to our Eucharistic Procession on June 2, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ — have you signed up to take a turn to carry a corner of the Canopy over the Blessed Sacrament during the Procession? If not, why not? Don't wait for others to offer to do it — I'm looking for YOU! It's OK if you've done it in the past — you can do it again (and again and again!). Contact me to sign up.

In conclusion...

Together, let's aim high in Christ. Together, let's bring out the best in each other. Together, let's be the best we can be in Christ.

And let's always remember: LOVE IS A GIFT.

If you are, or if someone you are with is, unable to walk in procession to receive Holy Communion, please alert one of the Ushers **before Mass begins**. The Usher will be glad to arrange to have one of the ministers bring Holy Communion to the pew. Please remember to inform an Usher before Mass begins; do not wait until the time of Communion. Also, if at all possible, please sit in the front half of the church, to make it easier for the minister to come to you. Thank you.

BRINGING FORWARD THE OFFERINGS OF BREAD AND WINE

If the announced intention at Mass is for your intention, or if you have memorialized the



bread and wine, and you would like to carry those offerings forward at the Presentation of the Gifts during Mass, please be sure to let the ushers know this before the Mass begins. They will be happy to have you do this. If no one steps forward to specifically request this, then they will select people from the assembly.

FOR THOSE WITH CELIAC DISEASE

Special hosts are available for those with Celiac Disease who cannot receive Holy Communion using the usual bread. These hosts contain less than 0.001% gluten content and are approved for the Roman Catholic Church by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. If you need to receive Holy Communion using one of these hosts, please stop in the sacristy before Mass begins to discuss this with the priest. We will be happy to accommodate you.



Pro-Life Prisoners of Conscience

"When the just cry out, the Lord hears them, and from all their distress he rescues them."
—Psalm 34

Rick Hinshaw served the Catholic Church as editor of The Long Island Catholic and as Communications Director for the Catholic League and the New York State Catholic Conference. He also spent three years as spokesman for Nassau County District Attorney Denis Dillon. Here Rick writes about the ordeal his brother John Hinshaw and other pro-life prisoners of conscience are currently undergoing.

Why are my brother and eight other pro-life prisoners of conscience — having already spent eight months in jail — about to be sentenced, probably to *years in federal prison*?

Because in October 2020 they engaged in peaceful, prayerful civil disobedience at a notorious late-term Washington, D.C. abortion clinic that the Daily Wire's Michael Knowles has labeled an "infanticide factory." And because, a year-and-a-half later, two of their group retrieved the remains of five late-term or full-term aborted babies in that clinic's trash, and challenged authorities to investigate whether the abortionist was violating the federal ban on partial birth abortions, or the federal Born Alive Infants Protection Act.

Instead, the FBI re-arrested all nine pro-lifers from the October 2020 sit-in, upgrading local trespassing offenses to federal charges of violating the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances (FACE) Act. This law was enacted during the Clinton era precisely to enable draconian sentencing for peaceful pro-life civil disobedience.

All nine pro-life defendants, convicted last September, face up to 11 years in prison and fines of up to \$350,000 when they are sentenced May 14 and 15 for their peaceful, prayerful action.

My brother John's participation in this pro-life rescue is consistent with a lifetime spent intervening for vulnerable people — from his professional service for those struggling with mental illness, to volunteering at pro-life pregnancy centers, to his caring interaction with homeless people on the street; and to protecting the unborn, without regard for the potentially devastating consequences to himself.

My brother and his fellow prisoners of conscience need our prayers.

They also need **our presence** of peaceful and prayerful witness for life and justice on May 14 and 15 at E. Barrett Prettyman U.S. Courthouse, 333 Constitution Ave. NW, Washington, D.C. 20001.

Individual sentencings will begin at 9 a.m. and continue with a different defendant each hour. If you can possibly be there for any time during those two days, please consider doing so.

In any event, **please pray** for these brave rescuers, for their families, and for all the unborn babies they are trying to save.

Aunque enfrentarán dificultades, Jesús confia en que el Espíritu Santo los acompañará hasta el final de los tiempos.

PREPARING FOR SUNDAY, MAY 19, 2024 PENTECOST SUNDAY

Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them.

And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit.

Acts 2:3-4a

Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

"Pentecost" was the Greek name for the Jewish "Feast of Weeks" that celebrated God's giving of the Law to Moses on Sinai. The Apostles had just bid farewell to Jesus at the Ascension but now, after praying for nine days in what was the first novena, Jesus' promise to send them "another advocate" is fulfilled with the Spirit's sudden arrival. The Spirit comes as a rushing, violent wind that shakes the house and makes their hearts tremble, yet emboldens them to take to the streets to proclaim the wondrous good news of Jesus' death and resurrection. The people in the streets are from many nations yet each one hears this good news in their own language and in their hearts. The message to us is clear: despite our differences, we are one in God's Holy Spirit.

1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Today's message of unity is continued in the letter from Paul to the Corinthians. Paul acknowledges our differences: we possess different spiritual gifts, engage in various forms of service, and are occupied in a variety of activities. All are good. But these differences don't negate our oneness because all our ministries are inspired and guided by God. God's Spirit takes possession of us, says Paul, not for our own benefit, but for the benefit of all. Each of us serves the community.

John 20:19-23

Jesus offers "peace" not once, but twice, to the disciples who have hidden themselves behind the locked doors of the house where they had gathered. They were afraid, and with good reason since the authorities had just crucified Jesus. But when Jesus comes to them, he offers the one antidote to this fear that the world cannot give – a unique peace, one that surpasses all understanding. Just as the creator God had breathed on Adam to give him life, so too does Jesus breathe on the Apostles and give them the Spirit which is new life. As Jesus imparts the Spirit, he also bestows the power to forgive sins. The Risen Lord has not only wished them peace, he has also shared the surest way to sustain it.


Gospel Reflection


