



PASTOR'S PAGE

Fifth Sunday of Easter

We continue to celebrate these fifty days of Easter Time “overcome with paschal joy,” as the words of one of the choices for the Preface in the Eucharistic Prayer tell us, and, on this Fifth Sunday of Easter, the liturgical season still reverberates with the joy and enthusiasm of the sacramental initiation that occurred at the Easter Vigil, and also with the theme of our sacramental initiation in general. The Collect (Opening Prayer) for this Sunday’s Mass makes explicit reference to “those you [God] were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism.” The prayer goes on to ask that the baptized will “bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal.” Notice how the meaning of Baptism continues to be center stage in the liturgical meaning of Easter Time! To further highlight the meaning of Baptism, in that prayer we also ask God to “constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us,” so that all of us as the baptized may “bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal.” The work of our renewal and redemption through Christ’s death and resurrection continues to be at work within us!

The saving work of the Paschal Mystery is what takes place at each and every Mass; thus, our Prayer over the Offerings acknowledges “the wonderful exchange effected in this sacrifice” that makes us “partakers of the one supreme Godhead.” I am always deeply struck by that word “exchange” whenever it is used in the liturgy; it is such a powerful image! We bring the offering of our life, uniting our offering with Christ’s offering, in the offering of the celebration of the Eucharist, and particularly through the concrete offerings of bread and wine. Then, God gives those offerings back to us, transformed, in the transformed bread and wine which become the Body and Blood of Christ. As a result of this heavenly “exchange,” we have new life in Christ! Our newness of life in Christ must show itself in our living a worthy way of life — in the words of the Prayer after Communion, passing “from former ways to newness of life.”

Continue to reflect on the newness of life that comes to us through Christ’s death and resurrection and through the Sacrament of Baptism, and on what it means to be baptized. The glorious fifty days of Easter Time give us a special season to unpack the meaning of the mystery of being baptized and of being sharers in Christ’s life, death and resurrection. Also reflect on the new life you have experienced this Easter Time — how the Risen Christ has given you new life and deeper joy in different ways.

Communal Evening Prayer has resumed!

Remember that we have returned to our pre-pandemic practice of praying Evening Prayer communally and in-person following the 5:00 p.m. Mass each Saturday night. Read the full details in the blurb elsewhere in this bulletin about this, and about the other times we celebrate the Liturgy of the Hours.

Combined Pastoral Staff/Pastoral Council Meeting

I’m thrilled that this year we can return to our pre-pandemic custom of once every year holding a combined meeting of the Pastoral Staff and the Pastoral Council! This year’s meeting will take place this coming Tuesday, May 17. The format of the meeting is that we pray Evening Prayer, then have a festive dinner together, and then have the meeting itself.

I always place a high value and a great deal of importance on this annual meeting with these two leadership and advisory boards of the parish. Aside from the value of having the members of the two groups interact and get to know each other a little better, these meetings have always provided important input for me, and even specific recommendations and plans of action, concerning the direction of the parish for the upcoming year and beyond. I’m sure that this year’s meeting will once again be valuable time spent together, and I’m confident it will bear good fruit for the ministerial life of the parish. Please offer a prayer for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as the Pastoral Staff and Pastoral Council meet together this Tuesday evening.

Next set of memorialized bricks is being sent out

I want to keep reminding you that our most recent set of memorialized bricks is now being prepared to be sent out for engraving; we are looking to do the next installation and blessing of the bricks sometime at the end of August or in the first half of September this year. (Those who have ordered bricks will be kept informed accordingly.)

The deadline for getting in on this set of bricks is Tuesday, May 31, 2022. If you would like to have a brick included in this year's August/September installation and blessing, you must submit your form and payment before May 31.

However, **this does not mean there are no more bricks available; just the opposite! There are still plenty of bricks available for memorialization!** Our brick memorialization program is ongoing. We will accumulate the next batch and, when we have accumulated enough, we will send those out, as a group, for engraving and installation. So, even if you missed out this time around, send in your order! This ongoing fund raiser is a big help to us, so your continued support is appreciated.

By the way, **just because the brick is in the "Let the Children Come to Me" Prayer Garden, the memorialization does not have to be for children only! The memorialization can be for any**

memory or prayer intention. Also, help us out by spreading the word to your family and friends, and encourage them to memorialize a brick. You don't have to be a parishioner of OLPH (or even Catholic!) to do this. You may even want to do more than one brick; I myself have memorialized several!





Sixth Sunday of Easter

*Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you.
Not as the world gives do I give it to you.
Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid."*

John 14:27

Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, 22-29

The indispensable mark of the old covenant was circumcision. But with Jesus offering a new covenant, was circumcision and all the rules of Mosaic Law still necessary? That was the question that was dividing the fledgling Christian communities composed mostly of Gentiles (non-Jews). We see in today's reading a model for discerning important points of Church discipline. As the question couldn't be resolved at the local level, it was "kicked upstairs" to the leaders Jesus himself chose in Jerusalem. These apostles and elders discussed and prayed and, most importantly, appealed to the Holy Spirit for an answer. What they got was an answer that displayed great pastoral sensitivity rather than rigid adherence to a law that, while still upheld as important, was fulfilled in Jesus and his law of love.

Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

By the time the Book of Revelation was written, the Roman occupiers had destroyed Jerusalem and its Temple, which occurred in 70 A.D. in response to a Jewish rebellion. That tragedy was a disorienting experience of profound proportions because the city and her Temple were the very heart of Israel and the Jewish people. Losing them caused people to question their identity and even God's faithfulness. In addition, Christians were being persecuted for their faith to the point of death. In the midst of this time of distress, John experiences a vision of a "new Jerusalem," untouched by violence and adorned as a beautiful bride. It needs no Temple because God resides in the very hearts of his people. This is surely a vision of great peace, hope, and glory.

John 14:23-29

This reading is set at the Last Supper. Jesus has been with these men for three years, teaching and mentoring them with power, humility, and authority. Now he is about to leave them so he offers assurance that they will lose nothing of what they've learned since he will send them an Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will help them to remember and understand all that he taught them. He also leaves them a special peace that far surpasses any that can be found in the world. The good news for us today is that Jesus offers his Holy Spirit and his peace to us as well, if we but keep his word.


Gospel Reflection

After reading next Sunday's readings and Gospel, take some time to pray on them before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.

1. "Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid." What gift did Jesus leave us to prevent the Church from being closed in on itself and acting in fear all the time?
2. "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." According to Pope Francis, how do we keep our faith from becoming "static," to make sure it is always "growing"?

"He teaches us: he teaches us the mystery of faith, he teaches us to enter into the mystery, to understand the mystery a bit more. he teaches us Jesus's doctrine ... so that the doctrine grows, but always in the same direction: it grows in comprehension. ... Faith is not something static; doctrine is not something static, it grows. It grows like trees grow, always the same, but bigger, with fruit, but always the same, in the same direction. And the Holy Spirit prevents doctrinal error: he prevents it remaining stuck there, without growing in us. ... He will make the doctrine of the Lord grow in us until it reaches maturity."




