## PASTOR'S PAGE

### *Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity*

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. It is sometimes referred to in liturgical circles as an “idea feast” because it focuses on a particular doctrine of our faith rather than on a specific moment in the life of Christ, the Blessed Mother, or one of the saints. This Solemnity allows us to focus on the central belief of Christianity, that of the Trinity, the dogma of the triune God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Think of how often we say those words: “In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.” It is hoped that the frequency with which we say those words does not cause us to lose sight of the powerful mystery they express. The Mass prayers for this Solemnity give us deeper insight into the mystery.

The Collect (Opening Prayer) expresses the meaning of the mystery not in terms of some dry theological doctrine, but rather in terms of the active, dynamic power of the triune God: the Father sends into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification and, in so doing, reveals to the human race his own “wondrous mystery.” The prayer affirms that through the Trinity we know the very life of God Himself.

The Prayer over the Offerings makes the important liturgical point that as we make the offering of our lives at this liturgy — “this oblation of our service” — its ultimate purpose is that by it we might be made “an eternal offering” to the Father. The prayer expresses how in the liturgy we are swept up into the life of the Trinity so that our entire life might be lived with the same self-emptying, self-giving love as exists between the divine Persons. (Think of one of the dismissals used at the end of Mass: “*Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.*”)

The Preface (the section of the Eucharistic Prayer before the “Holy, Holy”) emphasizes the theological truth of God being “*one God, one Lord, not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance.*” It also emphasizes how each Person of the Trinity is equal in majesty. Finally, the Prayer after Communion also gives voice to the basic statement about the Trinity being “undivided Unity.”

So, while we may never fully comprehend every last aspect of the doctrine of the Trinity, our Mass prayers can help us to understand it more completely.

### *We felt the power of the Holy Spirit!*

WOW!!! I think we all felt the power and presence of the Holy Spirit in an incredible way at all our Masses last weekend, the Solemnity of Pentecost, but especially at our special Vigil of Pentecost on Saturday night. Thanks to all who attended that special Mass and to all the ministers who worked to put the details of that Mass together and to serve at it. Just as your family gathers for special occasions such as birthdays, anniversaries, weddings and other significant occasions, we as a parish family should give special emphasis to certain Masses throughout the year as special occasions to come together in an exceptional way to celebrate our faith.

Congratulations to our five parishioners who celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation at the 5:00 Mass, the Vigil of Pentecost, last Saturday: **Jeanine Cea, Jean Marie DeWitt, Jaime Gubisch, Juan Gubisch, and Austin Sherman.** As we prayed in the prayer during the Laying on of Hands, may the Holy Spirit you received through the anointing with the Sacred Chrism truly conform you more fully to Christ, the Son of God!

### *Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ next weekend*

Next weekend is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, and as noted elsewhere in the bulletin, we are celebrating with

a Eucharistic Procession after the 12:00 Noon Mass, followed by Adoration and then Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. Please note the schedule for the afternoon and make it a point to celebrate the day by participating in the Mass and especially in the Procession (what a great expression of our faith and devotion!) and by taking some time for prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. We will be including in the 12:00 Noon Mass a blessing of our newly-restored "historic tabernacle" which will go into use that weekend.

***Don't forget our special Patronal Feast Mass on Sunday, June 25, 12:00 Noon!***

Although the Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is traditionally celebrated on June 27, we're using the 12:00 Noon Mass on Sunday, June 25 to celebrate our special and festive **Patronal Feast Mass**, where we will offer praise and thanksgiving to God in the Eucharist in a special way for the gift of our parish and our oneness as a community. This year, we will add to the solemnity and festivity of the celebration by moving in procession at the end of Mass to two "stations" for blessings: we will bless the

bricks which have been memorialized along our walkway to the Blessed Mother, and we will bless a new statue which will grace our grounds, a statue representing children coming to Jesus, and dedicated to all the unborn and to all children.

We should all make the attempt to be at this Mass, since it celebrates our oneness as a parish family in the Body of Christ, and, if you have memorialized a brick, please make a special effort to be there! Hospitality and light refreshments will be offered, too. Mark your calendar now!

***In conclusion...***

Together, let's aim high in Christ. Together, let's bring out the best in each other. Together, let's be the best we can be in Christ.

And let's always remember: LOVE IS A GIFT.

## RESTORATION OF HISTORIC TABERNACLE



### MEMORIALIZATION OF OUR HISTORIC TABERNACLE

As we have previously announced, we are in the process of replacing the tabernacle we currently have in the church with the HISTORIC TABERNACLE pictured here. This tabernacle is the ORIGINAL tabernacle which was in the ORIGINAL CONVENT on 8<sup>th</sup> Street “back in the day,” and which has now been in the Chapel in the Convent on Wellwood Avenue.

The tabernacle needs to be refurbished and restored, due to age and years of not being used. **We are offering the opportunity for four individuals or families to partially memorialize the restoration for \$2,500 each for a total of four shares of the memorialization. We already have commitment for two shares but there are currently two shares still available. 

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

*St. Anthony of Padua*

*Feast Day: June 13th*



Saint Anthony was born Fernando Martins in Lisbon, Portugal. He joined the Franciscans as a young man, changing his name to Anthony. He was known for his moving and eloquent preaching. When his special book of Psalms and notes was stolen by an angry novice, Anthony prayed for it to be found; the thief not only returned the book, but returned to the Order! When heretics would not listen to him, he preached to the fish. His critics saw the fish beginning to gather and were converted. He died at only age 36 and was canonized a year later by Pope Gregory IX. In 1946, he was declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII. He is the patron of lost items and is often depicted with a book and the Infant Jesus.



## Lecturas del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo - Ciclo A Domingo 18 de Junio del 2017

Jesús nos dice hoy en el Evangelio:

### **Primer Lectura (Deuteronomio 8,2-3, 14-16):** Un Alimento para el Pueblo Necesitado

A su pueblo en necesidad en el desierto Dios le dio maná del cielo para comer y agua de la roca para beber, y así pudieran marchar hacia la tierra prometida. Hoy Dios nos da a nosotros la eucaristía, en nuestro camino hacia él.

### **Segunda Lectura (1 Corintios 10,16-17):** Un Pan, un Cuerpo

Celebremos este sublime misterio ahora en esta eucaristía.

Recordemos que nuestra primera misión es en nuestro hogar con nuestra familia. Aquí hay unos puntos importantes en cómo ser un buen padre o una buena Madre para sus hijos adolescentes

**1** No eres su amigo, así que no te comportes como tal. Los adolescentes ya no son niños, tu autoridad tiene que hacerse sentir.

**2** Discúlpate. Cuando cometes un error, pídele perdón. Recuerda que las buenas conductas empiezan por el ejemplo.

**3** Honestidad. Cultiva este valor en casa, que no hay lugar para las mentiras. Solamente así tu hijo confiará en ti.

**4** Salir juntos. Dedicarle algunos minutos de tu tiempo le demostrará a tu hijo que realmente te preocupas por él.

**5** Dar razones. Lo ideal es explicar el porque de nuestras decisiones, para que nos comprendan mejor.

### School to Teacher: Don't Pray for your Colleagues:

Maine: H.S. educational technician Toni Richardson filed charges of religious discrimination and retaliation with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) in May, after being instructed to never use phrases like, "I will pray for you" and "You are in my prayers" in private conversations with coworkers.

Toni had tried to privately encourage a coworker with whom she attends church, by saying, "I will pray for you." Yet months later, after a falling out, this coworker lodged a complaint against her and the school gave Toni an official "coaching memorandum" which told her that stating, 'you were in my prayers', is not acceptable. The memorandum said that she could not use "phrases that integrate public and private belief systems" while at school. The memo specifically explains she will face discipline or dismissal in the future for using these phrases.

"What Augusta Public Schools did by punishing Toni for discussing her faith in a private conversation with a coworker is unconscionable," said a Maine law firm. "The law is clear: employers cannot discriminate against employees who privately discuss their faith while at work."

"School employees are not required to hide their faith from each other while on campus," said First Liberty Senior Counsel. (apnews.com, 5/16/17; mainepublic.org, 5/17/17; frc.org, 5/19/17)



**PREPARING FOR Sunday, June 18, 2017—  
THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST**

*Jesus said, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life,  
and I will raise him on the last day."*

John 6:54

**Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a**

Moses speaks to the Israelites from the plains of Moab as they are poised to enter the Promised Land. Although this is not the generation that left Egypt forty years earlier, Moses speaks to them as if they were. He reminds them how God saved them time and again as they wandered in the desert, especially as he fed them with manna from heaven and brought forth water from a rock. He did this to show them that "not by bread alone does one live, but by every word that comes forth from the mouth of the Lord." Remembering is a means of reassuring them that he will continue to save them in the present and the future. Remembering is also a way of calling people of every generation, then and today, to obedience and fidelity.

**1 Corinthians 10:16-17**

The church at Corinth was beset by factions and rivalries that threatened to tear it apart. Paul writes to remind them that they are a single community called to fellowship with each other in Christ. How can they see this? God has given them a way by which they can experience it – the Eucharist. Sharing in one loaf of bread, the very Body of Christ, makes the community into one body as well.

**John 6:51-58**

Jesus speaks to the crowds after the miracle of the loaves and fishes and after declaring himself to be the Bread of Life. We hear in this selection how he makes his meaning very clear: the bread he will give is his flesh for the life of the world. He says four times how his flesh is food and his blood is drink – his Real Presence in the Eucharist every time we celebrate Mass. We will share, through eating and drinking, in the very fullness of who Jesus is. By doing this, Jesus has promised that we will have eternal life and be raised on the last day. What good news indeed!

**Gospel Reflection Questions....**

*After reading next Sunday's readings take some time to pray on them before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.*

**1. When Jesus gives us himself in the Eucharist, does he give us his presence, or does he give himself in the whole Paschal Mystery (passion, death, resurrection)? Discuss.**

**2. God was with his people on their journey, nourishing them with manna and water. How does God respond to your needs on your journey? What is different about the food God gave the people in the desert and the food he gives us?**




