

## PASTOR'S PAGE

### *150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Year Patronal Feast Mass*

The central liturgy of our 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Year is coming quickly, and you won't want to miss it: it's the celebration of our Patronal Feast on Sunday, June 27 at the 12:00 Noon Mass. We are honored to have our diocesan bishop, Bishop Barres, coming to preside, so obviously it's going to be a very, very special event. See the ad elsewhere in the bulletin, and plan on being there.

### *Pastoral Staff Meeting this week*

This is the time of year when, under normal conditions, the Pastoral Staff would go away for a two-day combined retreat and planning meeting, looking at the "ministerial year" which is ending and looking ahead to the upcoming "ministerial year." This year, since we are still emerging from everything associated with the pandemic, we made the decision to not go away for an extended meeting, but we will be meeting here on Monday night of this week. We'll be discussing continuing to return to normal, both in our liturgies and in parish operations. If you get a chance, offer a prayer for us on Monday, asking that the Holy Spirit will both inspire us and guide us in our discussions and deliberations, particularly as we look ahead to the rest of 2021 and into 2022.

### *Annual Calendar Call Letter*

Since we're talking about pastoral planning, let me remind all the heads and leaders of all of our ministries and organizations about the annual Calendar Call Letter which I sent out to them recently. While requests for use of facilities and for permission for events to take place in the parish can be made at any time, this letter, sent out at this time each year, gives the heads and leaders the opportunity to submit requests far in advance and, if needed for regular events, on a recurring basis. There are many moving parts to OLPH when we're in full swing, so something like this helps us to put together the "jigsaw puzzle" of parish life in large chunks, which helps us to avoid conflicts and problems later on. I urge all the ministry heads and leaders to request their

bookings as far in advance as possible.

***Brick Memorialization in the "Let the Children Come to Me" Prayer Garden***








## **FATHER'S DAY NOVENA OF MASSES**



## THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION

**These are the protocols that must be followed for going to Confession:**

- ▶ **Entry is only via the blue doors at the north end of the hallway (off of the small parking lot)**
- ▶ **Everyone — priests and penitents — is required to wear face masks or face coverings**
- ▶ **Maintain social distance while waiting on line.**
- ▶ **Signs on easels outside the classroom will indicate the name of the priest who is in the classroom**
- ▶ **Social distancing and plexiglass dividers will keep a safe distance between priest and penitent, whether the penitent celebrates anonymously or face-to-face (both options are available)**




## Registration for 2021-22



### Concern About Religious Freedom Protections in the Military

Americans paused again on the last Monday in May to celebrate Memorial Day as they honored those who died in the nation's wars. We love and are grateful for all those who are prepared to confront threats to our nation and even die to keep us free.

Recently, both members of Congress and retired military leaders have voiced concern about protecting the rights and freedoms, including Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech, for our current service members. This concern was in part prompted by Department of Defense Secretary Austin who said, "Extremism presents a complex and unique challenge to DoD. We must meet this head on, working to stamp out extremism among the ranks, permanently."<sup>(1)</sup>

"The U.S. Army produced training materials that labeled Christians and Catholics as religious extremists alongside Hamas and al Qaeda, never mind the fact that evangelicals and Catholics continue to comprise the majority of those serving in uniform today. Labeling religious and political beliefs that are held by tens of millions of Americans as extremist is to declare them unwelcome and unfit to serve..." said First Liberty Institute in testimony before Congress.<sup>(2)</sup> "At a time of turmoil and instability, during which our nation faces many external threats, [this] message is inappropriate and offensive to our service members and those they defend."<sup>(3)</sup>

"We are in a fight for our survival as a Constitutional Republic like no other time since our founding in 1776. The conflict is between supporters of Socialism and Marxism (that opposes religious belief and practice) vs. supporters of Constitutional freedom and liberty," wrote over 120 retired generals and admirals in an open letter.<sup>(4)</sup>

Catholics can be thankful that, per the Archbishop for Military Services, Timothy P. Broglio, "the military is the largest single source of vocations to the priesthood" in the United States.<sup>(5)</sup>



**Job 38:1, 8-11**

God loves and rewards us only when we obey Him, and punishes us whenever we choose evil? Are success and misfortune in life given or forbidden to us based upon our behavior, and clear signs to the world of our virtue or sinfulness? These questions and various proposed answers have been swirling around in the world throughout history, as they do throughout the Book of Job. Through being tested by God, Job learns that God is sovereign—and He rules not by force or by whim, but by grace. Everything He does or allows is under His control and even suffering has a purpose in His plan for our good. The only proper response to God’s sovereignty is to obey; the only proper response to His goodness is to trust.

**2 Corinthians 5:14-17**

Jesus died for us all so that we would all have the ability to die to ourselves, to our sins. He became like us and became sin for us so that we could become like Him—and therefore we are all His new creations. And if we ourselves are new creations in Christ, we like Paul cannot help but live the way Christ lived and love as Christ loved.

**Mark 4:35-41**

In the Apostles’ fear for their lives, and in their fear that Jesus had deserted them in spite of His being present with them, we are reminded of the despair that washed over Job when He also supposed that God had forgotten Him. To their amazement, Jesus rebukes the wind and subdues the turbulence of the sea by a mere word, just as had done to silence demons.
