PASTOR'S PAGE

Happy Father's Day!

Allow me to offer blessings and best wishes to all fathers celebrating Father's Day today! May God bless you for the many sacrifices and offerings you make for your children. We should be grateful to you not just on one day, but all year long, for the important role you play. The role of a father giving witness as a Christian man within the family is one that is unique and irreplaceable. I ask that all fathers never underestimate the important role they play in the faith formation of their children. Unfortunately, in some families, raising the children in the faith is something that is relegated to the mother alone, and that is extremely unfortunate. I ask all Christian fathers to take seriously their role and responsibility in being a witness to their faith to their children, and perhaps especially to their sons. I'll say it again: no one can replace the importance of the father in the life of a family.

Let's also keep in our prayers today those who perhaps find Father's Day to be a difficult time — fathers who have lost children; children who have lost their fathers; husbands and wives who are having difficulty conceiving a child; fathers and children who are estranged from one another; fathers whose children are ill and suffering.

Two Day Pastoral Staff Retreat / Meeting

On Monday and Tuesday of last week, the members of the Pastoral Staff went away on our annual Pastoral Staff Retreat and Meeting, held off-site. We went for two days (an overnight) to the Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington for some spiritual time together, some social time, and plenty of work, as we looked at the "ministerial year" that just passed, and as we did some pastoral planning for the year ahead and even beyond.

As always, these were very productive days both in terms of work and in terms of spending some down-time together to share spirituality and friendship. We came away from the days refreshed and renewed, all so that we

can serve you better, and be more deeply engaged in the mission of the parish

I thank all the members of the Pastoral Staff who were able to set aside the time for these days. The truth is that things like administration, planning, coordinating calendars, evaluating programs, etc., which were a part of the discussions, are not always the most glamorous parts of parish ministerial life, but they are necessary and important if the mission of the parish is going to continue to move forward. You should know that the members of the Pastoral Staff take their jobs very seriously, for the good of the parish. We continue to press forward, in Christ and trusting in Him, trying to build on past successes, and also trying to meet ongoing challenges.

Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist

This coming Saturday, June 24, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist. Because of its important rank on the liturgical calendar, we will celebrate the day with the appropriate festivity by having music at our 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday morning.

John the Baptist was the great prophet and herald of Jesus the Messiah. He prepared the way of the Lord and revealed Jesus to others as both the Messiah and the Lamb of God (think of one of the texts we use in the Mass, during the Communion Rite: "Behold the Lamb of God..."). St. John exemplifies the Christian life as one who proclaims the Gospel message of healing and repentance while he points out Christ to others and shows them the way to become united with God.

This Solemnity is an ancient one, dating back to the fourth century, although the actual date of the celebration varied in the East and the West. In the East, John's birth was celebrated on January 7, the day after Epiphany, because of the association of that feast with the Baptism of the Lord. In the West (our tradition), it was celebrated on June 24, in keeping with Luke 1:36, which notes that

Elizabeth was six months pregnant at the time of the Annunciation of the Lord.

The Mass prayers for this Solemnity deepen our understanding of John the Baptist's role in salvation history and provide spiritual food for thought for our own prayer.

At the Mass for the Solemnity, the Collect (Opening Prayer) speaks about the preparatory role of the Baptist as one who was raised up *"to make ready a nation fit for Christ the Lord."* This prayer prays that we may be directed *"into the way of salvation and peace."*

The Prayer over the Offerings during this Mass expresses why it is fitting to celebrate the nativity of St. John: it is because he *"both foretold the coming of the world's Savior and pointed him out when he came."*

This Mass's Prayer after Communion uses the imagery of the Lamb so closely associated with John the Baptist's announcement of Jesus (see my earlier comment), and in so doing this prayer gives voice to a rich Eucharistic theology with its phrase, *"Having feasted at the banquet of the heavenly Lamb..."* The image of Jesus as the Lamb of God shines brightly behind these thoughts.

Finally, the Preface (beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer) for this Solemnity recalls the events associated with St. John the Baptist's life and echoes the Scripture passages associated with him: how was consecrated *"for a singular honor among those born of women;"* how *"his birth brought great rejoicing;"* how *"he alone of all the prophets pointed out the Lamb of redemption;"* how *"he baptized the very author of Baptism;"* and how he gave witness to Christ by the shedding of his blood.

What rich and varied themes for us to reflect on as we celebrate this important saint! St. John the Baptist, pray for us!

Summer Appeal

It's the time of year when we are again starting up our annual **SUMMER APPEAL**. You will soon be receiving your 2023 **SUMMER APPEAL** letter. I respectfully and humbly ask that everyone take this **SUMMER**

APPEAL very, very seriously and participate in it by making your contribution, and, I hope, by being able to offer the requested amount, \$150, if not more. If necessary, you can feel free to send the amount in installments over the summer; just be sure each payment is clearly marked "2023 Summer Appeal."

As you know, this annual **SUMMER APPEAL** is always a direct request from me, as your Pastor, to you, with no meetings, no time commitment on your part, and no phone calls. **Every dollar you give stays right here in the parish**, unlike with bazaars and other events where fees must be paid to vendors. Allow me to say **THANK YOU** to all who have made the **SUMMER APPEAL** so successful in prior years! I am very, very grateful, and I am once again pleading for your help. I personally give to this appeal each year; I ask you to do so, too.

The **SUMMER APPEAL** continues to be absolutely essential to the financial solvency of OLPH. I know full well how difficult it might be for you to consider giving to the **SUMMER APPEAL** at this time, because the economic conditions in our country are so terrible, and so many of you have found it necessary to cut back on so many things. Yet, the parish financial struggles continue as well, as costs for everything continue to rise, and so it is with tremendous urgency that I beg for your support in the 2023 **SUMMER APPEAL**.

I recognize — and deeply, deeply appreciate — that many of you already give to OLPH on a regular basis all year long and that you support other parish appeals. However, this **SUMMER APPEAL** continues to be necessary for our ongoing financial health, and so I do not hesitate to beg for your generosity. **THANK YOU** to all who have supported the **SUMMER APPEAL** in prior years and to those who will do so again this year.

Some big-money necessary repairs are on the horizon

So, speaking of why our financial health is so important, I'll mention that we're looking at some significant capital repair projects that are on the horizon. We're hoping to use money

from the sale of the convent for part or all of them (and the sale is still in process...it's just taking a LONG time for many different reasons), so we'll have to see how much we can do, and prioritize our projects.

Some of them we have had on the docket for a while now, such as new air conditioning for the church and roof repair in the school (there are leaks). We need to repave parking areas around the church and rectory (only the south parking lot at the corner of South High Street and Gates Avenue was redone several years ago, and thankfully it's still in good shape), and we would like to repaint the church ceiling, and possibly fix up the red carpeted steps leading up to the sanctuary in the church.

However, as any homeowner knows, there are always unexpected things that happen. We have just recently discovered that the steeple on the school building is sagging, so we need to look into that and will have to get that repaired, and, while we're at it, we might as well check out the church steeple, to try to avoid any imminent problems with that.

The members of the Finance Committee are already working on these projects, assessing the jobs, getting bids, *etc.*, so that when we have the money we will be ready to go with whichever of the projects we will undertake. I will keep you informed, and I'll give you more detailed information once the convent is sold and our plans for the funds and the projects are firmed up.

OLPH Market at Gazebo

Allow me to remind you that an OLPH Market is taking place at the Gazebo on the corner of Wellwood and Hoffman this Saturday and Sunday. This is a fund raiser for the parish, so stop by and help us out, and share in some community spirit at the same time!

Chamber Concert for Patronal Feast

Speaking of community spirit, let me call your attention to the Chamber Concert being hosted at OLPH this Friday night, June 23, at 7:30 p.m. Full details are elsewhere in this bulletin. It promises to be a really uplifting and

inspiring evening, and proceeds will benefit our parish Friends of Music Program. It's being done in conjunction with our "Patronal Feast weekend" (see the next item), so I look forward to seeing you there. (Don't worry...I'm not singing, I'm just attending!)

Patronal Feast Mass next Sunday


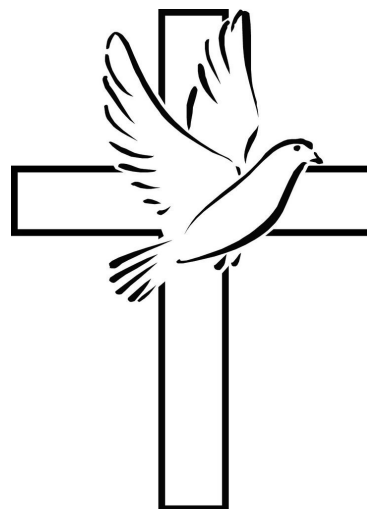

ICON OF OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP

As we celebrate our Patronal Feast next weekend, we present to you an explanation of the elements in the image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help.



- ◆ Greek initials for “Archangel Michael” who holds the lance and the sponge. “Michael” means “who is like God” (on left, immediately above the figure)
- ◆ Greek initials for “Mother” (“MP”, top left)
- ◆ Mary’s mouth is small, symbolizing her few recorded words and the depth of her contemplation
- ◆ Greek initials for “Archangel Gabriel” who holds the cross of Christ. “Gabriel” means “God is strong” (on right, immediately above the figure)
- ◆ Greek initials for “of God” (top right)
- ◆ Greek initials for Jesus Christ (next to Christ-child)
- ◆ The mother’s supporting hand
- ◆ The Christ-child clings trustingly to his mother
- ◆ The falling sandal indicating his alarm at the thought of his Passion and death
- ◆ Red tunic: the color worn by virgins at the time of Christ
- ◆ The color blue worn by mothers in Palestine
- ◆ Gold background symbolizes heaven

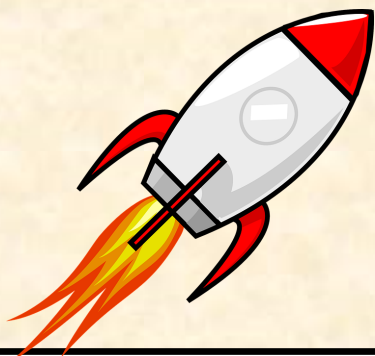

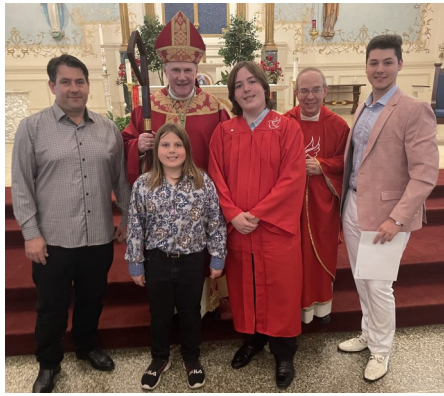

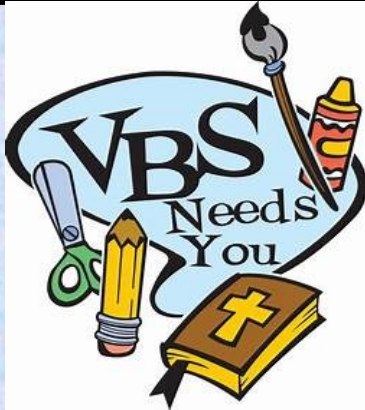

† AN EXPANSION OF OUR MEMORIAL CARD PROGRAM

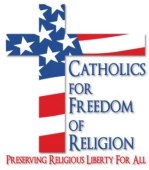

Religious Freedom Week 2023: Embracing the Divine Gift of Freedom

Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all. Beginning June 22, the feast of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher, the USCCB invites Catholics to **pray, reflect, and act** to promote religious freedom.

Pray-Reflect-Act

June 22 - Respect for Sacred Spaces—Pray that Christian witness in the face of attacks on our churches will convert hearts to faith in Jesus Christ, and that people of all faiths would be free to gather in sacred spaces without fear.

June 23 - Seal of Confession—Pray that governments would respect the seal of confession, as the Church in the United States continues to work to remove the scourge of clergy abuse.

June 24 - Nicaragua—Pray for our Catholic sisters and brothers who are suffering in Nicaragua.

June 25 - Religious Student Groups—Pray that religious student groups would be free to be faithful to their distinctive missions.

June 26 - Religious Freedom in Nigeria—Pray that herders and farmers in Nigeria, whose conflict over access to land and resources has fueled religious tensions, may find the means to compromise and work out their differences in a non-violent manner.

Primera Lectura (Éxodos 19,2-6a): Elegidos por Dios Como Su Pueblo Santo

Dios eligió a Israel como su pueblo, los liberó y se vinculó a ellos en una unión de alianza, unión de amor y vida permanentes. La misión sacerdotal de este pueblo era reflejar la santidad de Dios y darla a conocer a todos.

Segunda Lectura (Romanos 5,6-11): Somos lo Que Somos por el Amor de Dios

Dios nos hizo tal como somos por su amor. La prueba de la profundidad de su amor es que su Hijo Jesucristo murió por nosotros para reconciliarnos con Dios mismo y para hacernos partícipes de su vida.

Evangelio (Mateo 9,36 – 10,8): Enviados a proclamar la Buena Noticia de Salvación

Jesús envía a sus apóstoles en una misión que habrá de ser la misión de todo el Pueblo de Dios: llevar a todos el amor compasivo de Dios, que nosotros mismos hemos experimentado. Esta misma parece ser la preocupación de Jesús. Por eso el Evangelio nos transmite sus sentimientos íntimos al considerar la multitud abandonada: "Al ver a las muchedumbres, sintió compasión de ella, porque estaban abandonados, abatidos como ovejas que no tienen pastor". La muchedumbre que Jesús vio y por la cual sintió compasión no se reduce a sus contemporáneos, sino que abraza a la humanidad de todos los tiempos y lugares. Ante este espectáculo de desolación y desorientación "como ovejas sin pastor"- que se presentaba a sus ojos Jesús dice a sus discípulos: "La cosecha es mucha y los obreros son pocos". Esta afirmación expresa la desproporción entre la magnitud de la tarea y la escases de obreros. Jesús entonces recomienda a sus discípulos: "Rogad, pues, al Dueño del campo que envíe obreros a la cosecha". El campo es ciertamente la humanidad entera, toda la historia humana. El Dueño es entonces Dios mismo. A él hay que rogar que envíe obreros en número suficiente.

TWELFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord,
for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked!* Jeremiah 20:13

Jeremiah 20:10-13

Jeremiah was a prophet in Jerusalem during the time King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon captured and then later destroyed the city (587 BC.) For calling on Jerusalem's King Zedekiah to trust in the Lord for protection rather than the Egyptian Pharaoh as his counselors advised, Jeremiah was mocked, abandoned, beaten, and imprisoned. The prophetic mission that God gave him resulted in intense suffering and persecution. Today we hear him lamenting, or praying while in agony and torment, about those who are trying to harm him. But the prayer ends on an extraordinary note of confidence and praise. Since the Lord is with him "like a mighty champion," his persecutors will not succeed. What wonderful words for all who feel downtrodden and in despair: "Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked!"

Romans 5:12-15

While Paul's writings can sometimes be hard to understand, his message can also be pretty simple and straightforward, as it is today. He contrasts Adam and Jesus. Beginning with Adam, sin and death spread throughout the world like a virus because of his actions. But the grace of God is far more powerful than sin. Because of Christ's actions we receive something so much greater: redemption. "For if by the transgression of the one (Adam) the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many." How good it is that we are among the "many!"

Matthew 10:26-33

Three times today we hear Jesus tell his disciples not to be afraid as he instructs them for their mission to preach the Good News to the world. Though many people will oppose them, just as they did Jeremiah, he reassures them that their heavenly Father will take care of them. Just as God takes care of the sparrows and all of his creation, how much more will he take care of those people who acknowledge him. He knows us so intimately and loves us so well that even the hairs on our heads are counted. Who can stand against him? No one, so rejoice and don't be afraid!

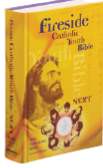

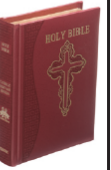
