PASTOR'S PAGE

Pentecost

What a great day this Solemnity of Pentecost is! I love it and I am always renewed, energized and joy-filled by its celebration, because each year I feel like I really experience the fire and presence of the Holy Spirit. I hope you do, too, and that Pentecost is a really special and joyful day for you!

The Greek word for Pentecost (*Pentekoste*) means “fiftieth,” and in early Christianity it referred to the entire fifty days of Easter. The roots of Pentecost can be found in the Jewish festival of Weeks (Shavu’ot), the fifty-day celebration following Passover (Exodus 23:16). It was a harvest festival in which the first fruits of the harvest were offered to God in gratitude. It eventually became associated with the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. Early Christians reinterpreted the Jewish festival as a commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit, since Acts records that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples when the festival of Pentecost was fulfilled (see Acts 2:1-11).

Interestingly, by the end of the fourth century in the West, Pentecost had become a time for the initiation of those not baptized at Easter. Thus developed a night vigil, just like the Easter Vigil, for this purpose. This is the origin of the festive Vigil of Pentecost we celebrated at this weekend’s Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass. We offer our congratulations to those who received the Sacrament of Confirmation at that Mass, the Pentecost Vigil, as they completed their initiation into the Catholic Church. What a beautiful manifestation of the Spirit we witness each time Confirmation is celebrated!

Pentecost celebrates the fullness and fruition of the days of Easter Time as we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. The words of the Preface at the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer sum up well for us the meaning of what we celebrate today as these words are addressed to God the Father: *“For, bringing your Paschal Mystery to completion, you bestowed the Holy Spirit today on those you made your adopted children by uniting them to your Only Begotten Son. This same Spirit, as the Church came to birth, opened to all peoples the knowledge of God and brought together the*

many languages of the earth in profession of the one faith.”

These, then, are the themes we celebrate today and which should be the basis for our spiritual reflections — the completion of the Paschal Mystery; the Holy Spirit; adoption through union with Christ; and oneness in the community of the Church and in faith. Those themes are also the basis for our joyful renewal!

Return to Ordinary Time

Now, after the celebration of Pentecost, the Church returns to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time; you’ll notice the change in our liturgical environment. By “ordinary,” we do not, of course, mean “commonplace” or “banal,” but rather “ordinary” meaning “ordinal,” or “counting,” as we count off the weeks of the liturgical year celebrating the Paschal Mystery of Jesus’ death and resurrection, but not by highlighting any one special or particular aspect or focal point of that mystery.

All these great young people did a fantastic job during their training period, and we look forward to their beginning to serve. You will see them as they serve at their first Masses throughout June. May God bless them as they serve us in this important ministry, and may their liturgical service to the parish bring them into a deeper union with Jesus!

Please mark your calendar and save the dates now for two upcoming celebrations here at OLPH — “the place to be!” — which promise to be very beautiful and spiritually rewarding:

• **Sunday, June 18, 12:00 Noon Mass:** That Sunday is the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**, and our 12:00 Noon Mass will end with a **Procession with the Blessed Sacrament** outdoors, followed by a period of Exposition, ending with Benediction and Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament. Please be sure to join in this celebration in which we give public testimony and witness to the Real Presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament.

• **Sunday, June 25, 12:00 Noon Mass:** The Feast of Our Lady of Perpetual Help is traditionally celebrated on June 27, but, upon the recommendation of the Liturgy Committee which I have accepted, beginning this year we will move the celebration of our Patronal Feast to the Sunday before the 27th, so that more people can participate in the Mass. So, the 12:00 Noon Mass on Sunday, June 25 will be our **Patronal Feast Mass**, where we will offer praise and thanksgiving to God in the Eucharist in a special way for the gift of our parish and our oneness as a community. This year, we will also add a special element because immediately following the Mass we will all move in procession to two “stations” for blessings: we will bless the bricks which have been memorialized along our walkway to the Blessed

Mother, and we will bless a new statue which will grace our grounds, a statue representing children coming to Jesus, and dedicated to all the unborn and to all children.

Please be sure to join us for these special Masses, as such occasions are so vital in building up our sense of community and oneness in the Lord. Remember: belonging leads to believing!

29th Anniversary of Ordination to Priesthood

On a final note, if you have a moment, perhaps you could offer a quick prayer for me as today, June 4, I celebrate my 29th anniversary of ordination to priesthood. 

RESTORATION OF HISTORIC TABERNACLE





RESTORATION OF HISTORIC TABERNACLE

We would like to replace the tabernacle we currently have in the church with the HISTORIC TABERNACLE pictured here. This tabernacle is the ORIGINAL tabernacle which was in the ORIGINAL CONVENT on 8th Street “back in the day,” and which has now been in the Chapel in the Convent on Wellwood Avenue.

We used this tabernacle on the altar of repose this past Holy Thursday and realized what a TREASURE it is. Given its HISTORIC VALUE to the parish, and seeing its DESIGN AND GRANDEUR, we thought it would be appropriate to use it as our tabernacle in the church.

Notice how its height and circular design fit so well with the baldachino in the church. It looks like it was made for this space! This will be a most fitting tabernacle in which to reserve the Blessed Sacrament, the Real Presence of Our Lord, and will add even greater majesty and beauty to our already-magnificent church.



There's another reason why this is such a great tabernacle to use in the church: it is decorated with symbolism that matches our altar! On the door of the tabernacle is the symbol of the PELICAN. A pelican is an ancient symbol of Christ, because a mother pelican would pierce her breast with her beak, to feed her young with her own blood—an obvious parallel to Christ's saving sacrifice. This same symbolic representation of Christ using the pelican feeding her young is depicted on the front of our current altar (look for it the next time you are in church!).

UPDATE

The tabernacle needs to be refurbished and restored, due to age and years of not being used. **We are offering the opportunity for four individuals or families to partially memorialize the restoration for \$2,500 each for a total of four shares of the memorialization.**

The newly-refurbished tabernacle will be used for the first time on the weekend of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, June 17-18. It will be formally blessed at the 12:00 Noon Mass on Sunday, June 18.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Boniface: 675-754 ; Feast: June 5th
 “Apostle of the Germans”

Boniface was an English Benedictine monk who devoted his life to the conversion of the Germanic tribes. Christianity had become mixed with paganism and was full of errors. The uneducated clergy perpetuated these errors as did the local bishops. The Pope sent Boniface to educate the German church, aided by Charles Martel, the Frankish ruler. He found the mission of reform difficult, as the clergy were resistant to change their ways. He was guided by two principles: restore the obedience of the clergy to the Pope, and establish houses of prayer. These became the great German monasteries; many nuns and monks followed Benedict and became educated. While preparing Confirmation candidates, Boniface and 53 others were massacred.

Court Upholds Conscience Rights of Business Owner

Five years after Hands On Originals t-shirt company was sued for declining to print t-shirts for the Lexington homosexual "Pride Festival," the Kentucky Court of Appeals ruled that no one should be forced to engage in speech they disagree with—including small business owners. "Christians should not be forced to violate their consciences in order to make a living," said Concerned Women for America legal counsel.

Initially, the city's Human Rights Commission found Blaine "guilty" of breaking the town's "fairness" ordinance and sentenced him to "diversity training." At the time, the Commission's Executive Director said it's time for Christians in the marketplace "to leave their religion at home." However, Blaine believed, "I don't leave my faith at the door when I walk into my business."

"Americans should always have the freedom to believe, the freedom to express those beliefs, and the freedom not to express ideas that would violate their conscience," said Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF) Senior Counsel. "Protecting Blaine's freedom affirms everyone's freedom, no matter the nature of their beliefs or convictions. The government shouldn't be able to force citizens to create speech that conflicts with their deepest convictions, and the court's decision rightly affirms that." PREPARING FOR Sunday, June 11, 2017—**THE MOST HOLY TRINITY**

*God so loved the world that he gave his only Son,
so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.*

John 3:16

Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

What we hear today in this first reading is stunning: God reveals his very self to a mere human. Just prior to this meeting between the Lord and Moses, the Israelites had gravely sinned by making a golden calf for themselves to worship as an idol. As a result, Moses interceded on their behalf to ask for forgiveness. He also asked to see God's glory, that is, to see deeply what God looked like. Although God answered that Moses could not see his face, for no one could live after seeing that, he did show Moses his essence, shrouded in a cloud, and announce his own name as "Lord." He also proclaimed what he is like: merciful, gracious, slow to anger, and rich in kindness and fidelity. How comforting to hear, straight from God himself, that ours is a God of mercy and forgiveness.

2 Corinthians 13:11-13

These are the final words of the second letter Paul wrote to help the struggling church at Corinth. That community had great challenges caused by in-fighting, jealousies, and bad behavior. He gives them a few simple, solid rules to live by, asking them to rejoice since he knows they will experience joy and peace if they follow his counsel. Then he ends with a blessing most fitting for today: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." Since the Trinity is the fount of all grace, love, and communion, God is, was, and will be the source of profound peace and unity, both in the churches of Paul's day and our own here today.

John 3:16-18

How much does God love us? If you've ever wondered that, you're hearing the answer today in perhaps the most famous words in all the Gospels. "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." Jesus originally spoke these words to Nicodemus, a Pharisee who came to Jesus by night to find out who he was. Jesus responded by revealing that his purpose in the world is not condemnation but eternal life offered to all freely. Some may not choose this and by their own action bring condemnation on themselves, but God's plan in sending his own Son is that the whole world may believe in him and live in a loving relationship with him, both here on earth and in eternal life. The choice is up to each of us.

Gospel Reflection Questions....

After reading next Sunday's Gospel take some time to pray on it before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.

1. What did the Father do that tells us that he "so loved the world"? What did the Son do? What is your response to God's immense love for the world and for you personally?

2. According to Pope Francis, how did God reveal himself as the Trinity?

Let us recognize that God is not something vague, our God is not a God "spray," he is tangible; he is not abstract but has a name: "God is love." His is not a sentimental, emotional kind of love but the love of the Father who is the origin of all life, the love of the Son who dies on the Cross and is raised, the love of the Spirit who renews human beings and the world. ... The Most Holy Trinity is not the product of human reasoning but the face with which God actually revealed himself, ... walking with humanity ... with his people in the history of the people of Israel and Jesus has always walked with us and promised us the Holy Spirit who is fire, who teaches us everything we do not know and from within us guides us, gives us good ideas and good inspirations.


