

PASTOR'S PAGE

Pentecost

What a great occasion the Solemnity of Pentecost is! I love it and I am always renewed, energized and joy-filled by its celebration, because each year I feel like I really experience the fire and presence of the Holy Spirit. I hope you do, too! There's something magnificent about celebrating the fullness and fruition of the liturgical season of Easter Time. Our Masses on Pentecost are always great celebrations of this fullness and joy, especially our great Vigil of Pentecost celebrated at the Saturday night 5:00 p.m. Mass. Congratulations, by the way, to all the adults who celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation at our Vigil of Pentecost! What a powerful manifestation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit the Sacrament of Confirmation is!

The Greek word for Pentecost (Pentekoste) means "fiftieth," and in early Christianity it referred to the entire fifty days of Easter. The roots of Pentecost can be found in the Jewish festival of Weeks (Shavu'ot), the fifty-day celebration following Passover (Exodus 23:16). It was a harvest festival in which the first fruits of the harvest were offered to God in gratitude. It eventually became associated with the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. Early Christians reinterpreted the Jewish festival as a commemoration of the coming of the Holy Spirit, since Acts records that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples when the festival of Pentecost was fulfilled (see Acts 2:1-11).

Interestingly, by the end of the fourth century in the West, Pentecost had become a time for the initiation of those not baptized at Easter. The Church developed a night vigil, just like the Easter Vigil, for this purpose. This is the origin of the festive Vigil of Pentecost we celebrated at this weekend's Saturday 5:00 p.m. Mass that I mentioned above.

Pentecost celebrates the fullness and fruition of the days of Easter Time as we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit. The words of the Preface at the beginning of the Eucharistic Prayer sum up well for us the meaning of what we celebrate today as these words are addressed to God the Father: *"For, bringing your Paschal Mystery to completion, you bestowed the Holy Spirit today on those you made your adopted children by uniting them to your Only*

Begotten Son. This same Spirit, as the Church came to birth, opened to all peoples the knowledge of God and brought together the many languages of the earth in profession of the one faith."

These, then, are the themes we celebrate today, and which should be the basis for our spiritual reflections — the completion of the Paschal Mystery; the Holy Spirit; adoption through union with Christ; and oneness in the community of the Church and in faith. Those themes are the basis for our joyful renewal! May you have a happy and Spirit-filled Pentecost!

Return to Ordinary Time

Now, after the celebration of Pentecost, the Church returns to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time; you'll notice the change in our liturgical environment after today. By "ordinary," we do not, of course, mean "commonplace" or "banal," but rather "ordinary" meaning "ordinal," or "counting," as we count off the weeks of the liturgical year celebrating the saving power of the Paschal Mystery of Jesus' death and resurrection in our time.

We're taking down the Easter decorations after the 5:00 p.m. Mass this Sunday; why not come down and help us? With enough hands, it should take no more than an hour or so. In the past we've had families come down together; what a great thing to do as a family on a Sunday evening, before or after going out for pizza or ice cream or Italian ices!

OLPH Website

I'm very proud that we have a very wonderful, professional and classy website; I believe that it's an important tool for evangelization, and many, many people use the website on a regular basis. I'm very grateful to **Joselyn Kalt**, who manages the website and who does such a fantastic job doing so. I thought it would be interesting for you to know of some statistics and information concerning the website, so I asked Joselyn to put something together for the bulletin. So now, I turn my column over to Joselyn...take it away, Joselyn!

My name is Joselyn Kalt, and I have been a parishioner for almost 5 years at OLPH. I am on the Pastoral Council, and I am also a Reader. My husband and I were married here in April of 2015. I wanted to provide information regarding traffic on the OLPH website, which I hope is useful. This traffic is good, I promise!

Since the website was updated back in 2016, it has had the most traffic during the Lent and Advent seasons. Weekly visits increase on an average of 25% during the Lenten season, which is exciting to see the faith community interested in what is the culmination of what being a Catholic is all about! Following Easter and Christmas, other topics most frequented are Sacraments, Holy Days of Obligation, concerts, and Summer Bible Camp.

The year 2019 thus far has seen a 37% increase in visits, with 50,488 page views as of May 20th. By the end of 2019, we will have reached the 100,000 mark for visits to the website since it was updated in January 2016. Presently, we're at 96,172 and climbing. The bulletins are one of the most visited aspects of the site, followed by parish information and marriage. (Now there's some great news — more people are interested in getting married!)

Those who visit the website average 3 pages per visit. If you do the math, that means that by the end of 2019, 300,000 pages will have been viewed!

If you haven't visited the website in a while, now is a great time for a refresher. Some minor adjustments have been made and we're constantly tweaking pages. So, come on back and visit www.olphlindenhurst.com

(It's Msgr. Joe again!) Thanks, Joselyn, for that great presentation, and for your ongoing work and commitment to the website! I urge everyone to remember that we have this great resource on the web, and to explore its many features. Get into the habit of checking out the information there and using it.

Wind, Fire, and the Fury of Pentecost

People who have experienced a hurricane or a tornado understand the force of wind. Wind that moves with hurricane force can topple trees rooted in the ground for centuries. The fierce winds of a tornado can flatten homes and rid entire towns of their buildings.

Likewise, those who have experienced a house fire or a wildfire know the power of fire to devastate and destroy.

Wind and fire are mysterious and unpredictable. They stop people in their tracks because they command attention, move them, and usher in a future that can look altogether different from the past.

Throughout Scripture, God is portrayed through the images of wind and fire. In Hebrew, the word for wind, *ruach*, also means “spirit.” In the Old Testament, *ruach* was interpreted as God’s life force or breath. The following are examples of Scripture’s portrayal of God through breath:

Then the LORD God formed the man out of the dust of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being. (Genesis 2:7)

Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: Listen! I will make breath enter you so you may come to life. (Ezekiel 37:5)

When God made a covenant with Abram, smoking braziers appeared in the sky. The Lord appeared to Moses as fire flaming from a bush, and a pillar of fire led the Israelites through the wilderness to the Promised Land.

For the people of Israel, wind and fire were manifestations of the life-giving presence of God. They knew that the presence of God was, like wind and fire, a mysterious and unpredictable life force that commanded their attention, moved them, and ushered in a future that looked altogether different from the past.



Pentecost summons the faithful to be like wind and fire, like God’s Spirit, a driving force that ignites the world with love.

On Pentecost Sunday, the reading from Acts portrays God as wind and tongues of fire and the Gospel shows the Spirit coming through Christ’s breath:

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. (Acts 2:1–3)

Jesus said to them again, “Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, “Receive the holy Spirit.” (John 20:21–22)

Pentecost reminds us that God continues to animate and inspire the people God has called. Pentecost summons the faithful to be like wind and fire, like God’s Spirit, a driving force that ignites the world with love.



Please join us for a special Holy Hour devoted to praying for world peace within our own country and throughout the world.



God is my strength...

And my strengths are the path to my relationship with God.

Here at OLPH we participate in the Clifton Strengths Finder Program, to help us discover our God-given strengths. Once we know them, we can better understand how God is calling us to use these strengths to serve Him and others. All the Pastoral Staff members and over 175 parishioners have already taken the survey and discovered their strengths. What about you? Have you taken advantage of this parish program to deepen your relationship with God?

*We are presenting testimonials from each of the members of the Pastoral Staff who will share how they use their gifts in service to the parish. This week, **Deacon Doug Smith** shares with us his strengths and how he uses them in ministry.*

I always knew that God gives everyone strengths to help build His kingdom but until I took the strengths finder I was never able to identify them. Now after taking the course I realize that God has put me in right places to use the strengths he has given me. My individual strengths are: **includer, achiever, adaptability, connectedness and restorative**. For anyone who knows me you know I do not like conflict, and here is where four of my strengths as includer, adaptability, connectedness and restorative come into play. In the ministries where I am involved these strengths are extremely important, especially with the Hospitality and the St Bernard's, connectedness and adaptability are a must for these ministries. When I minister to the home bound I feel like the restorative gift that God has given me helps me to help heal people who are homebound and connect them back to the church they so long to be in. When you realize the gifts that God has given you it enables you to focus your attention on specific ministries so you can utilize these gifts to get the maximum benefit. Knowing the gifts that God has given me let me grow closer to God and makes me realize the work he is asking me to do for Him on earth.

Using Our Strengths to Serve God

As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord. Joshua 24:15

Serving the Lord does not mean giving up activities that bring you satisfaction. In fact, if we serve the Lord using the strengths which He has given us, we find ourselves feeling rewarded. The singular arrangement of strengths in each of us makes us unique, but our uniqueness does not mean we will not enjoy working in ministry with other parishioners. In fact, when we choose the right ministry through which to serve the Lord we enjoy the satisfaction that comes from acting in communion with others, as well as the deep personal satisfaction that results when we are true to our "natural" selves.

For example, people blessed with the strength of **Achiever** have been given an internal energy that pushes them to do more. However, there are times when that drive to do is neither focused nor logical. For **Achievers**, satisfaction comes from completing tasks and projects, although Achievers may find it difficult to articulate goals for their action.

At OLPH, **Achievers** can find satisfaction by:

- Serving in the Usher Ministry
- Joining or leading the Christmas Lighting and Easter Exterior Decorating Ministry
- Organizing material to support the Community Meal or Van Ministry
- Leading or participating in the Catholic Ministries Appeal
- Serving on planning committees for celebrations such as the 150th Anniversary





Military Sees Conflicts Over First Amendment Freedoms

An increasing number of military members are discovering their own rights to free speech and religious expression are being curtailed within the very institution whose primary purpose is to protect those same rights for the rest of us.

- **A Bible was recently returned to a Missing Man table at a Veterans Hospital in New Hampshire.** It had been removed following a complaint from the anti-religion Military Religious Freedom Foundation (MRFF) founded by atheist attorney Mikey Weinstein, who claimed displaying a Bible was unconstitutional. The Bible had belonged to a U.S. Air force TSgt. who was a captive in a German prisoner of war camp during World War II.

On behalf of the POW/MIA Network, First Liberty Institute assured the hospital that "The VA is absolutely within the law in its decision to allow the display of a donated Bible."

"The Bible was used as a symbol of freedom, hope, home, love & togetherness by all POWs, no matter what religion or no religion all," said a spokesman for the Veterans Hospital.

- **Airmen at the Grand Forks Air Force Base in North Dakota were under attack by MRFF at Christmas for volunteering to help the Salvation Army hand out baskets of food and gifts to families in need.**

"(Volunteer) participation is not only permissible, but is consistent with the highest standards of the Air Force mission," wrote First Liberty Institute. "The Constitution does not prohibit active duty service members, reservists or Department of Defense employees from voluntarily participating in community service events with the Salvation Army."

- **MRFF is calling for an investigation of the commander of Edwards Air Force Base in CA for his private website, *Prayer at Lunchtime for the United States*, that is designed to "encourage Bible-believing Americans to take time to specifically pray for our nation at lunchtime every day."**

"This general, on his own time, as an expression of his faith, with a non-military website from a non-military computer can state his beliefs," said the executive director of Chaplain Alliance for Religious Liberty. The general isn't forcing his religion on anyone since "you have to go to the website, no one is forced to go and you can turn it off at any moment."

PREPARING FOR Sunday, June 16, 2019

The Most Holy Trinity

*“The love of God has been poured out into our hearts
through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.”*

Romans 5:5

Proverbs 8:22-31

One theme of the readings for today is that of the Spirit as God's wisdom. In this selection from Proverbs, we hear part of a longer poem in which Wisdom is personified as a woman who was present with God during the entire process of creation. Indeed, she was with God even before that as “the beginning of his ways” when she was “poured forth, at the first, before the earth.” In this account of creation, Wisdom stands by observing God's creative activity and identifies herself as God's “craftsman” or artisan, an intermediary who brings God's gifts to humanity, contributing beauty and order to the universe. How refreshing it is to hear how the wisdom of God was “playing” before him and found “delight in the human race,” that is, found delight in us!

Romans 5:1-5

Paul gives us two pieces of Good News. The first is that Jesus has restored peace between God and humanity. The second is that faith in Jesus gives us access to that peace by the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. United in Christ by faith, with the Spirit, we can hope to share in the glory of God. Because of this faith, all life is changed, even suffering. Paul says we can *boast* in suffering, something the world would view as foolish. Paul believes that if Christ makes a difference, he makes a difference in *all* things. The Holy Spirit is a consuming fire that can transform anything, even suffering, into a sacrifice of praise.

John 16:12-15

This reading is taken from Jesus' discourse at the Last Supper before his Passion. Jesus knows that the events of the next few days will be hard for the disciples, so he carefully prepares them to hold onto their faith and to wait for the Holy Spirit who will guide them “to all truth.” The Spirit continues to witness to the truth even to us today. On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we celebrate that God, who is the source of all truth, has revealed it to Jesus, his Son, who gives it to us through his Spirit.

Gospel Reflection Questions....

After reading next Sunday's readings and Gospel, take some time to pray on them before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.

1. Does the Spirit add anything to God's revelation? Does the Spirit change your understanding of revelation? When you receive new insights, what is the source of them? Can understanding of divine love be exhausted? Have you ever reached a place where “you could not bear” more knowledge of love?

2. Jesus said to his disciples: “I have much more to tell you, but you cannot bear it now. But when he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth.” According to Pope Francis could the Holy Spirit be “telling us” (enlightening, guiding, directing) things all the time? Does the Spirit know what is needed in every time and place? What might happen if we don't control everything to the last detail?

279. ... The Holy Spirit works as he wills, when he wills and where he wills; we entrust ourselves without pretending to see striking results. ... Let us keep marching forward; let us give him everything, allowing him to make our efforts bear fruit in his good time. ...


280. Keeping our missionary fervor alive calls for firm trust in the Holy Spirit, for it is he who “helps us in our weakness” (Romans 8:26). ... Yet there is no greater freedom than that of allowing oneself to be guided by the Holy Spirit, renouncing the attempt to plan and control everything to the last detail, and instead letting him enlighten, guide and direct us, leading us wherever he wills. The Holy Spirit knows well what is needed in every time and place. This is what it means to be mysteriously fruitful!

The deadline to sign up for Bible Camp and Service Camp is **Sunday June 23, 2019**. You can come by the Religious Education Office for the registration forms.


