

## PASTOR'S PAGE

### *Pope Francis' Catecheses on the Holy Mass*

*Msgr. Joe's regular Pastor's Column is on hiatus for the summer, but in its place we continue with our series presenting Pope Francis' catecheses on the meaning of Mass, given at his Wednesday audiences in 2018. This excerpt is taken from the Holy Father's audience of Wednesday, March 21, 2018; it continues to reflect on the meaning of Holy Communion at Mass.*

\*\*\*\*\*

Although we are the ones who stand in procession to receive Communion — we approach the altar in a procession to receive Communion — in reality it is Christ who comes toward us to assimilate us in him. There is an encounter with Jesus! To nourish oneself of the Eucharist means to allow oneself to be changed by what we receive. Saint Augustine helps us understand this when he talks about the light he received when he heard Christ say to him, “I am the food of strong men; grow, and you shall feed upon me; nor shall you convert me, like the food of your flesh, into you, but you shall be converted into me.” Each time we receive Communion, we resemble Jesus more; we transform ourselves more fully into Jesus. As the Bread and the Wine are converted into the Body and Blood of the Lord, so too those who receive it with faith are transformed into a living Eucharist. You reply “Amen” to the priest who distributes the Eucharist saying “The Body of Christ;” that is, you recognize the grace and the commitment involved in becoming the Body of

Christ. Because when you receive the Eucharist, you become the Body of Christ. This is beautiful; it is very beautiful. As it unites us to Christ, tearing us away from our selfishness, Communion opens us and unites us to all those who are a single thing in him. This is the wonder of Communion: we become what we receive!

The Church strongly desires that the faithful also receive the Lord's Body with Hosts consecrated at the same Mass; and the sign of the Eucharistic banquet is more fully expressed when Holy Communion is received under the two Species, even though we know that Catholic doctrine teaches us that Christ, whole and entire, is received even under only one Species. According to ecclesiastical norms, the faithful normally approach the Eucharist in a processional manner, as we have said, and receive Communion standing with devotion, receiving the Sacrament either on the tongue or in the hand, as preferred.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist ends with the Prayer after Communion. On behalf of everyone, with that prayer, the priest thanks God for having shared the banquet and asks that what was received may transform our lives. The Eucharist makes us strong in order to produce fruit in good works to live as Christians. Let us approach the Eucharist; receiving Jesus, who transforms us into him, makes us stronger. The Lord is so good and so great!

### *The Supreme Gift*

#### **New Pastoral Letter Commemorates Fiftieth Anniversary of Humane Vitae**

Fifty years ago, on July 25, 1968, Pope Paul VI issued an Encyclical Letter entitled *Humanae Vitae*, “On Human Life”. On October 14, 2018, Pope Francis will canonize his predecessor as Pope Saint Paul VI.

In this anniversary year, Bishop John O. Barres of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has issued a Pastoral Letter entitled *The Supreme Gift: The Gift of Life*, commemorating the encyclical of this soon-to-be-canonized saint. This teaching of the late Holy Father is in many ways more important today than at any time before.

In his letter, Bishop Barres wants to teach the people of the diocese the important truths of *Humanae Vitae*, because these truths very much need to be reexamined today in light of the problems we face in our time.

Please take a copy of *The Supreme Gift* home, read it, and discuss it as married couples and as families. Bishop Barres says: “Understanding the teaching of *Humanae Vitae*, believing it, and living it, is one of the first and most important answers to the crisis of our time. I truly believe that the future Pope Saint Paul VI wrote the letter more for our times than even for his own. Today, it can become the first step in repairing the injury between men and women, husbands and wives, parents and children, the family and society.”

At the Mass of Beatification of Pope Paul VI in 2014, Pope Francis said of his predecessor:

“When we look to this great Pope, this courageous Christian, this tireless apostle, we cannot but say in the sight of God a word as simple as it is heartfelt and important: thanks! Thank you, our dear and beloved Pope Paul VI! Thank you for your humble and prophetic witness of love for Christ and his Church! ... In [his] humility the grandeur of Blessed Paul VI shines forth: before the advent of a secularized and hostile society, he could hold fast, with farsightedness and wisdom – and at times alone – to the helm of the barque of Peter, while never losing his joy and his trust in the Lord.”







# CATHOLICS FOR THE FREEDOM OF RELIGION

## FOCUS ON RELIGIOUS FREEDOM



### Supreme Court Narrowly Upholds Religious Freedom:

In a 7-2 decision, the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Colorado courts and found that baker Jack Phillips was not guilty of discrimination when he declined to design a wedding cake for a same-sex couple because of his religious beliefs. **However, the decision is narrow** since the court found that CO exhibited anti-religious bias due to: (1) hostility aimed at Phillips' religious beliefs; (2) the different treatment CO gave a parallel case **allowing bakeries to refuse to make**

**cakes criticizing same-sex marriage.**

Therefore, a definitive decision, resolving the underlying dispute between "non-discrimination" principles and freedom of speech and religion, will have to await another case and another decision.

Justice Anthony Kennedy wrote, "(CO) was neither tolerant nor respectful of (Phillips') religious beliefs."

### Religious Persecution — International Report:

**Nigeria:** In 2014, Boko Haram (meaning "Western Education is Forbidden") abducted 270 mostly Christian girls from a boarding school in Chibok. The leader said, "I abducted your girls; there is a market for selling humans." Only the Christian girls are allowed to be sold into slavery and prostitution.

By 2018, about 60 of these girls had escaped, others were released after payments made, and about 100 are still in captivity. But, once again, Boko Haram has kidnapped over 100 mostly Christian schoolgirls in their campaign to spread panic and terror.

To date, Boko Haram has killed more than 20,000 people and forced 2 million others to flee their homes in predominantly Christian southern Nigeria. (thespectator 5/8/14; telegraph.co.uk, 1/15/18; bbc.co.uk, 5/19/17; adflegal.org, 6/4/18 ;washingtonpost.com)

# PREPARING FOR

## Sunday, July 29, 2018

### THE SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks,  
and distributed them to those who were reclining,  
and also as much of the fish as they wanted.*

John 6:11

**2 Kings 4:42-44**

This is only one of a series of miracles performed by Elisha, the faithful disciple and successor of the prophet Elijah. It was Elisha's custom to travel about all over the land of Israel in order to observe how the people lived, to help them where necessary and to teach them the knowledge of God. But as a prophet, Elisha was also given the authority to rebuke and the power to punish in the face of evil or lack of faith. Here, when the people hesitate to take him at his word that God has the power to feed a large crowd of people with just 20 barley loaves, Elisha forcefully points out, through words spoken by God Himself, that this miracle was in fact a prophesy fulfilled.

**Ephesians 4:1-6**

Paul pleads for unity in the church. Christians have been fashioned through the Spirit into a single harmonious religious community (one body), belonging to a single Lord (in contrast to the many gods of the pagan world), and by one way of salvation through faith, brought out especially by the significance of baptism. But Christian unity is more than adherence to a common belief. It is manifested in the gifts Christ Himself gives to individuals, which they are to then use for the service of others, so as to make the community more Christ-like.

**John 6:1-15**

John's particular account of Jesus' miraculously feeding thousands of people with what might only feed one family is presented in the midst of other miracles and teachings of Jesus which set him apart from any other prophet or human for that matter—and the people obviously know it. In telling us that the time for celebrating the Passover was at hand, John was not simply observing that it was spring, and therefore the grass upon which the people sat to eat their fill would have been lush. The multitudes were following Jesus everywhere despite the fact that it was the Passover season, when they ought to have been on their way to Jerusalem!

**Gospel Reflection Questions....**

*After reading next Sunday's readings and Gospel, take some time to pray on them before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.*

1. Pope Francis says that the "food was shared fairly ... no one was deprived." What are the implications for us regarding the inequality of resources and starvation all over the world?

"Jesus fed the multitude with five loaves and two fish. And the end of this passage is important: 'and all ate and were satisfied. And they took up what was left over, twelve baskets of broken pieces' (Lk 9:17 and Jn 6:12). Jesus asked the disciples to ensure that nothing was wasted: nothing thrown out! And there is this fact of 12 baskets: why 12? What does it mean? Twelve is the number of the tribes of Israel. It represents symbolically the whole people. And this tells us that when the food was shared fairly, with solidarity, no one was deprived of what (s)he needed. Every community could meet the needs of its poorest members. Human and environmental ecology go hand in hand."

*Pope Francis, General Audience Saint Peter's Square, June 5, 2013*

2. What do you think God is more likely to do, miraculously drop food where there is starvation or inspire people to help their neighbors solve their problems? If the latter, how can you help (through the Holy Spirit) in third world countries, your city, diocese, parish, office, or neighborhood?


