

## PASTOR'S PAGE

### *Pope Francis' Catecheses on the Holy Mass*

*Msgr. Joe's regular Pastor's Column is on hiatus for the summer, but in its place we continue with our series presenting Pope Francis' catecheses on the meaning of Mass, given at his Wednesday audiences in 2018. This excerpt is taken from the Holy Father's audience of Wednesday, April 4, 2018; with this catechesis, the Holy Father began to reflect on the meaning of the conclusion of the Mass.*

\*\*\*\*\*

The last time [in the prior catechesis] we arrived at Communion and the Prayer after Communion. After this Prayer, the Mass ends with the blessing imparted by the priest and the dismissal of the people. As it began with the Sign of the Cross, in the name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, it's again in the name of the Trinity that the Mass is sealed, namely, the liturgical action.

However, we know well that while the Mass finishes, the commitment opens to

Christian witness. Christians don't go to Mass to carry out a weekly task and then forget; no. Christians go to Mass to take part in the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord, and then to live more as Christians: the commitment of Christian witness opens. We leave the church to "go in peace" to bring God's blessing to our daily activities, in our homes, in work environments, among the occupations of the earthly city, "glorifying the Lord with our life." However, if we leave the church chatting and saying, "Look at this," "Look at that..." talking too much, the Mass has not entered our heart. Why? Because we are unable to live the Christian witness. Every time I go out of the Mass, I must leave better than I entered, with more life, with more strength, with a greater desire to give Christian witness. Through the Eucharist, the Lord Jesus enters in us, in our heart and in our flesh, so that we can express in life the Sacrament received in faith.

### *The Supreme Gift*

#### **New Pastoral Letter Commemorates Fiftieth Anniversary of Humanae Vitae**

Fifty years ago, on July 25, 1968, Pope Paul VI issued an Encyclical Letter entitled *Humanae Vitae*, "On Human Life". On October 14, 2018, Pope Francis will canonize his predecessor as Pope Saint Paul VI.

In this anniversary year, Bishop John O. Barres of the Diocese of Rockville Centre has issued a Pastoral Letter entitled *The Supreme Gift: The Gift of Life*, commemorating the encyclical of this soon-to-be-canonized saint. This teaching of the late Holy Father is in many ways more important today than at any time before.

In his letter, Bishop Barres wants to teach the people of the diocese the important truths of *Humanae Vitae*, because these truths very much need to be reexamined today in light of the problems we face in our time.


Please take a copy of *The Supreme Gift* home, read it, and discuss it as married couples and as families. Bishop Barres says: "Understanding the teaching of *Humanae Vitae*, believing it, and living it, is one of the first and most important answers to the crisis of our time. I truly believe that the future Pope Saint Paul VI wrote the letter more for our times than even for his own. Today, it can become the first step in repairing the injury between men and women, husbands and wives, parents and children, the family and society."

At the Mass of Beatification of Pope Paul VI in 2014, Pope Francis said of his predecessor:

"When we look to this great Pope, this courageous Christian, this tireless apostle, we cannot but say in the sight of God a word as simple as it is heartfelt and important: thanks! Thank you, our dear and beloved Pope Paul VI! Thank you for your humble and prophetic witness of love for Christ and his Church! ... In [his] humility the grandeur of Blessed Paul VI shines forth: before the advent of a secularized and hostile society, he could hold fast, with farsightedness and wisdom – and at times alone – to the helm of the barque of Peter, while never losing his joy and his trust in the Lord."

### **REMINDER REGARDING THE COMMUNION FAST**

Please remember that we are supposed to observe a Communion Fast before receiving Holy Communion. This means we do not eat any foods or drink any liquids for one hour before receiving Holy Communion, the only exception being water or medicine. This also means that we are not to chew gum during Mass, and certainly not while we are coming forward to receive Holy Communion. Let's be sure we are appropriately prepared to receive Holy Communion by observing this important rule of the Church.



**Free Speech Narrowly Upheld by the Supreme Court:**

In a 5-4 decision, the Supreme Court ruled in favor of **pro-life pregnancy centers** by holding that a 2015 California law requiring these centers to promote abortion clinics alongside their pro-life services violates the First Amendment.

**"Advertising or promoting abortion runs directly counter** to the very reason pregnancy centers exist — namely, to enable and support women who want to choose life for their children. The government

has no business forcing these centers to violate their First Amendment right to freedom of speech and, in doing so, work against their life-affirming mission," said the Family Research Council president.

**Justice Anthony Kennedy said the First Amendment bars compelling people to betray their beliefs.** He wrote, "Governments must not be allowed to force persons to express a message contrary to their deepest convictions. Freedom of speech secures freedom of thought and belief. This law imperils those liberties."

**Many are concerned** that the matter of protecting the First Amendment, freedom of speech, was such a close decision.



### Lecturas del domingo 29 de Julio del 2018

#### Primera Lectura: Pan para los Pobres (2 Reyes 4:42-44)

En un tiempo de hambruna, el profeta Elías ordena que el pan destinado para una ofrenda religiosa se reparta entre los pobres hambrientos. Como no hay bastante, Dios se encarga de que haya incluso más de lo necesario para saciar a todos.

#### Segunda Lectura: Un solo Pueblo, ya que Dios es Uno (Efesios 4:1-6)

Yo, el prisionero por el Señor, os ruego que andéis como pide la vocación a la que habéis sido convocados. Sed siempre humildes y amables, sed comprensivos, sobrellevaos mutuamente con amor; esforzaos en mantener la unidad del Espíritu con el vínculo de la paz. Un solo cuerpo y un solo Espíritu, como una sola es la esperanza de la vocación a la que habéis sido convocados. Un Señor, una fe, un bautismo. Un Dios, Padre de todo, que lo trasciende todo, y lo penetra todo, y lo invade todo.

El apóstol Pablo exhorta a la comunidad cristiana a ser una. Nuestra unidad da testimonio de la Trinidad, que es la fuente y modelo de toda unidad.

#### Evangelio: Pan para los hambrientos (Juan 6:1-15)

En la multiplicación de los panes, Jesús se revela a sí mismo como quien da pan a los hambrientos. Él usará esta misma señal posteriormente, en la eucaristía, para revelarse a sí mismo como el pan de vida.

¿Quiénes somos nosotros a los ojos de Dios? ¿Qué puede hacer Dios con nosotros? Después de todo, no somos más que pequeñas criaturas en un vasto mundo. La liturgia de hoy nos muestra que Dios puede hacer muchas cosas por medio de nosotros; y con lo poco que tenemos para ofrecer... Cuando le damos nuestro tiempo, nuestra vida, nuestros talentos y lo poco que podemos hacer, él los convierte en bendiciones para muchos. Él puede hacer grandes cosas con nosotros, pero tenemos que ponernos a su disposición. El evangelio de hoy nos muestra lo que Jesús pudo hacer para satisfacer las necesidades de una gran muchedumbre con el irrisorio regalo de un muchacho: cinco panes y dos peces. Le pedimos al Señor que nos haga ser siempre generosos de corazón, con lo poco o mucho que tengamos.

#### **Tomó Pan y dio Gracias**

Siempre que los cristianos vienen a la eucaristía oyen lo que Jesús hizo por la gente. Tomó pan, dio gracias, y dio el pan a los allí presentes, diciendo: "Tomen esto, todos ustedes, y coman. Este soy yo, que me entrego a mí mismo por ustedes". Oímos en el evangelio de hoy que un día Jesús alimentó a una muchedumbre hambrienta. Él es quien puede saciar las hambres de toda la gente de nuestro mundo. Es más: Él quiere que le compartamos a él con todos y para todos, y, como Señor nuestro, quiere que nos repartamos también a nosotros mismos, los unos a los otros. Pidámosle en esta eucaristía que nos enseñe verdaderamente cómo hacerlo.

**Hermanos:** Hemos partido y compartido pan con el Señor. Esto nos compromete a contar con todos los recursos humanos, para poder compartir alimento, justicia, cultura y libertad con los que viven en necesidad.

Él nos invita también a partir y repartir a todos el pan más alto del evangelio, la eucaristía, que satisface las hambres más profundas de cada corazón humano.

# PREPARING FOR

## Sunday, August 5, 2018

### THE EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

*I am the bread of life;  
whoever comes to me will never hunger,  
and whoever believes in me will never thirst.*

John 6:35

#### Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15

The Lord had obviously taken the Israelites far outside of their comfort zone in leading them into the wilderness—where there was no sign of life or sustenance. In their anxiety, they lost faith in God and in Moses, and found themselves wishing they had died quickly along with the Egyptians, rather than by the slow and painful death they feared awaited them in the desert. The Lord had not abandoned them, but knew it would take several generations' worth of testing before they would truly learn to trust and obey Him.

#### Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

In this passage from his letter to the Ephesians, Paul seems to capture in just a few words the long, hard lesson the Israelites needed to learn in their wilderness journey: that they needed to leave behind their old way of life, their former selves, in order to become the new people of faith and holiness which God was calling them to be.

#### John 6:24-35

The people who went out of their way, going so far as to cross the sea in looking for Jesus, were very much like those Israelites who wanted to go all the way back to Egypt, where they at least knew they would be fed. As Jesus points out to them, they were not looking for Him and what God had to offer them through Him, but only for more miraculous meals. When Jesus tells them that He instead came to give them the Father's "true bread from heaven," and that this bread was in fact Himself, they begin to doubt Jesus' messianic identity and to ask Him for further proof.

1. According to Pope Francis, in the Eucharist we are we given something that keeps us from hardening our hearts and allows us to love someone who doesn't love us. What is that something?

*Christ's gift of himself in the Eucharist is not only a model for the Christian life, but acts to transform us interiorly. Every time that we participate in holy Mass and we are nourished by the body of Christ, the presence of Jesus and of the Holy Spirit acts in us, shaping our hearts, communicating interior attitudes to us that translate into behaviors according to the Gospel. Thanks to Jesus and to his Spirit, even our life becomes "broken bread" for our brothers.*

*To love someone who doesn't love us ... it's not easy. Because if we know that a person doesn't wish us well, then we also carry ill will. [Nevertheless,] we must love even someone who doesn't love us, opposing evil with good, with pardon, with sharing, with welcome. ... [In the Eucharist we are given] the creativity of charity, the capacity to give hope to the disheartened, to welcome the excluded."*


