



REMINDER REGARDING THE COMMUNION FAST

Please remember that we are supposed to observe a Communion Fast before receiving Holy Communion. This means we do not eat any foods or drink any liquids for one hour before receiving Holy Communion, the only exception being water or medicine. This also means that we are not to chew gum during Mass, and certainly not while we are coming forward to receive Holy Communion. Let's be sure we are appropriately prepared to receive Holy Communion by observing this important rule of the Church.

Evangelio (Mateo 13,44-52): *El* Reino de Dios es el Más Preciado Tesoro

El reino de Dios vale más que cualquier otra cosa en el mundo. Por él habríamos de estar dispuestos a renunciar a todo lo demás. ¿Qué tesoro es tan valioso para vender todo lo que se tiene? ¿Qué merece desprenderse de cuanto se posee para conseguir otro bien? ¿Qué hallazgo puede producir inmensa alegría? No cabe la menor duda que lo que encontró el hombre tiene un valor inestimable, inmedible, y lo más grande en valor, es el Reino de Dios, y por él se puede renunciar a todo, y ésta sería la mejor decisión tomada.

Perla fina es llamado el reino de los cielos para indicar que quien lo descubre en el Evangelio, lo prefiere a cuanto pueda ofrecer el mundo. Otra interpretación de gran enseñanza espiritual es que Jesús dio todo lo que tenía por la Iglesia y por cada alma (Gál. 2, 20) que para Él es una perla de gran valor (Juan 10, 39; Cant. 4, 1; 7, 11 y notas). Así se ha dado también a estas parábolas un sentido profético, aplicando la perla preciosa a la Iglesia y el tesoro escondido a Israel, por cuya caída Él extendió su obra redentora a toda la gentilidad. Cf. Rom. 11, 11 y 15.

PREPARING FOR

Sunday, August 6, 2023 THE TRANSFIGURATION OF THE LORD

Jesus was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light.

Matthew 17:2

Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

In the book of Daniel, God is presented as the Lord of human history. This reading is a part of a vision in which the Son of Man, who represents the kingdom of the holy ones of God, comes down from heaven and is given dominion by the "Ancient One," who represents God. The Son of Man in the passage was later taken to be a messianic figure.

2 Peter 1:16-19

In this letter, Peter, among other things, is combating heretics and scoffers who are looking upon Jesus' resurrection and second coming as empty fantasies promulgated by mere human beings to control the lives of others. Refuting those who accused early Christians of perpetuating a lie, Peter recalls the transfiguration experience on Mt. Tabor, when he heard God himself speak and affirm Jesus as his beloved and favored Son. Hence, Peter's readers should embrace the message that they had been given about Christ as the true Word of God.

Matthew 17:1-9

In this indescribable event, Jesus and his three apostles experience the glory of God. They are, as it were, transported into another reality. The references to Jesus' face dazzling as the sun and his clothes radiant as light are reminiscent of Old Testament appearances of God, such as in the first reading today. The presence of Moses and Elijah symbolize "the Law" given to Moses and the prophets. In Jesus, both converge and are brought to fulfillment. The response of the apostles is one of incredible joy and holy terror. They are so over-awed that they do not want to leave. "Let's build three booths." But they are also overcome with fear. Spiritual theologians tell us that the "experience of the holy" can cause us to be overjoyed and, at the same time, terrified. Sometimes that which we deeply desire, such as intimacy with God or another, we are also most terrified of. We are afraid of losing ourselves to another. The heavenly voice tells the apostles to listen to Jesus, for he is God's anointed Messiah. In the dark days ahead, this mountaintop experience will sustain both Jesus and the apostles.

1. In the Transfiguration the disciples were invited to behold Jesus in his glory—to stop talking and listen to him. Do you ever ask yourself when you saw or heard Jesus during the day?

2. In his Lenten discussion of the Transfiguration, what was a main way Pope Francis suggested for us to "listen to Jesus"?

"God the Father says it to everyone: to me, to you, to everyone, all people! ... 'Listen to Jesus'" Don't forget.


"But also let us listen to Jesus in his written word, in the gospel. I pose a question to you: do you read a passage of the gospel everyday? Yes, no ... yes, no ... half of the time ... some ves, some no. It is important! Do you read the gospel? It is so good; it is a good thing to have a small book of the gospel, a little one, and to carry in our pocket or in our purse and read a little passage in whatever moment presents itself during the day. In any given moment of the day I take the gospel from my pocket and I read something, a short passage. Jesus is there and he speaks to us in the gospel! Ponder this."
