Return of the Pastor's Column!

So...how's your summer going? Mine is going very well (summer is my favorite season!), although, unfortunately, the time is passing by much too quickly! What about you?

I took some vacation time in July, was back for a spell in July, then took a little more time at the beginning of August, and have been back from vacation for a while now, even though I continued to take a break from writing a weekly column. But...the time has come to resume these weekly ramblings from your verbose Pastor! So... here we are! The bulletin will now be thicker again!

Live Stream

As you have seen announced in the bulletin, we have had to unfortunately suspend the live streaming of our 10:00 a.m. Sunday Mass, and also of funerals and weddings when it might be requested. We were encountering more and more technical difficulties with the live streaming system to the point where it became unusable. We are looking into it and trying to solve the problems as best we can, and we will try to get back on board with this if it is at all possible, but I cannot say when that will be, so I need to ask your patience and understanding. I don't know exactly how this will turn out. I want to thank Bob Mehm, Fr. Frank, and Jill Delano for their leadership with this.

By the way, if you or someone you know has expertise with this type of thing and would be willing to help us out, please have them contact our Business Manager, Jill Delano, to discuss it with her. We cannot afford to get into all sorts of expensive equipment and solutions, but we're certainly open to whatever guidance and technical assistance some knowledgeable person might be able to give to us.

Fr. Jacob

On a positive note this summer, you have seen that Fr. Jacob Onyumbe has returned to grace us with his priestly presence and ministry. He was a little delayed in getting here, but he finally arrived and will be with us until the end of September. It's always good to see Fr. Jacob and to have him with us!

Summer Appeal

Our **SUMMER APPEAL** is going very well, and I want to thank everyone who has contributed to it. I will announce to you the grand total for the **SUMMER APPEAL** sometime in September, when we consider the Appeal to be closed.

We have asked for a gift of \$150, but whatever amount you can send would be greatly appreciated.

Parish Leadership and Engagement

As we gear up for another "ministerial year" which will begin in September, I would like to share these thoughts concerning parish life.

As Pastor, my vision for parish life has, of course, liturgy at the center. Our worship must be the heart and soul and source and summit of our life together as disciples of Christ. As such, however, robust liturgical celebrations must flow from and to a robust communal and pastoral life.

I truly believe that robust communal and pastoral life comes from having an active and engaged laity, especially lay leadership. It is the parishioners who make a parish what it is! For many years we enjoyed a high degree of lay involvement and a flourishing of many, many activities, but unfortunately, like everything else in our world, Covid took its toll on all of that. We have returned to some of that pre-Covid robustness, but in many ways our parish life is "leaner" — not everything started up again after Covid, and not everyone returned.

Maybe some of this is unavoidable, part of the natural rhythm of things; maybe some scaling down would have happened anyway. I have a theory that Covid simply accelerated what was already taking place in terms of where Church life in general was headed; we find ourselves now where we would have found ourselves anyway 5-10 years from now. I think an important question to ask, though, is how much of it is indeed unavoidable, and how much of it can serve as a call for us to try to renew and

enhance our parish life and ministries?

OLPH is also facing a serious problem which is common to all parishes, not just ours, and it's the problem of the shrinking number of people who offer to do things. The older generation of active parishioners who carried the ball for so long are either dying off or just cannot be as active. We're simply not getting the same number of people as we did in the past stepping forward to say "I'll do that."

Parish leadership will be exploring these questions in the year ahead, and we'll be holding Parish Leadership Meetings involving the four major Advisor Boards (Pastoral Staff, Pastoral Council, Liturgy Committee and Finance Committee) and the heads of all the parish ministries, groups and societies to hash all this out together.

Fostering involvement and engagement in, and responsibility for, the mission and life of the parish among everyone is a goal I have for the upcoming year.

Offering the Precious Blood

While we're on the subject of our parish life together, I would like to offer one heartfelt word of thanks and appreciation for an aspect of our liturgical life about which I am very proud, and about which you should be proud, too, and that is the fact that we offer the Precious Blood to the assembly at so many of our Masses. So many of you asked that we return to this after Covid, and, although we were not able to implement it as fully as we were doing pre-Covid, we nonetheless do so at the vast majority of our liturgies. This means so much to so many people — the priests and deacons included — and I am thrilled that we do so.

The liturgical life of our parish is a model for other parishes in so many ways, and I frequently receive questions from other priests asking about how we do things here.

The high quality of our liturgies would not be possible without the commitment, dedication and devotion to liturgy of so many parishioners, most especially those who serve not only as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, but in all of our ministries. I am grateful to all of you.

By the way, this fall we will be calling for more people to step forward to become liturgical ministers: Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Ushers, Altar Servers and Music Ministers (in fact, we're calling for new Music Ministers now). I expect a hearty and vigorous response to this, with many new people stepping forward to become liturgical ministers.

OLPH Bob Dobres Memorial Golf Outing

You have seen the bulletin ad running, but let me take a moment to highlight this year's OLPH Bob Dobres Memorial Golf Outing, which will take place on Friday, September 15. This is an important fund raiser for both the Knights of Columbus and for the parish, so please be sure to support it in some way — by playing golf, and/or by attending the dinner, and/or by participating in the raffle. I enjoy being part of the day not by playing golf (sports and I are never, ever a good combination!) but by being present to help get the day started and by being a part of the festivities at the end of the day.





FOCUS ON RELIGIOUS FREEDOM

Learn and Live God's Gift of Religious Freedom: Part 2

- 9. Of the five freedoms in the First Amendment of the Constitution, religious freedom is first and asserts a robust exercise of faith and morals in every part of our lives free from government intrusion. Supporting religious freedom are the other four First Amendment freedoms: freedom of speech, of the press, of assembly and of redress of grievances.
- 10. The United States is not a "Christian Nation" that would be a theocracy but is founded on the Judeo-Christian ethic, which says all men are created equal and must be free to follow their conscience in the service of their God.
- 11. "The wall of separation between church and state" was a phrase used by President Thomas Jefferson to assure the Danbury Baptists that their rights of conscience and free exercise came from God, not from government, and are protected from government control by the First Amendment.
- 12. Tolerance is not a virtue, per Archbishop Chaput. The toleration of extreme evil is itself evil. "There is no other subject on which the average mind is so much confused as the subject of tolerance and intolerance. Tolerance applies only to persons, but never to principles. Intolerance applies only to principles, but never to persons."—Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen
- 13. Elie Wiesel, Nobel Laureate and Holocaust survivor, said, "We must always take sides. Neutrality helps the oppressor, never the victim. Silence encourages the tormentor, never the tormented." "Silence is consent." We must learn to never apologize or be ashamed of Christ, the Catholic Church, the Bible, our faith and religious practices. The supposed tolerance that requires people of faith to be silenced is a lie and is the worst of intolerance.

If we silence ourselves, self-censor our speech, for fear of offending, we will place the strongest shackles on America's liberties. Christ told us that to follow Him we must pick up his cross. Christ promised us suffering for his sake.

PREPARING FOR

Sunday, September 3, 2023 TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

Matthew 16:25

Jeremiah 20:7-9

During a turbulent time in Israel's history, Jeremiah is called by God to deliver a message that his people do not want to hear. Jeremiah must denounce corruption in the temple liturgy and condemn the people for dabbling in foreign cults, for their many breaches of the covenant, and for ignoring the poor. Prophets are not known for their "feel good" messages. He does not want the job but God, the stronger one, prevails. As a sensitive and caring soul, Jeremiah does not enjoy being the "object of laughter" and having "everyone mock him." The people beat him up and throw him in a dark dungeon. But the divine fire received at his call cannot be extinguished. For Jeremiah, the only thing worse than being God's prophet is saying "no" to God's call.

Romans 12:1-2

Having spoken eloquently in chapters 1-8 on what God has done for us in Christ Jesus, Paul now, in chapters 12-13, calls for a moral response. In acknowledgment of God's goodness, followers of Christ are to seek to make Christian values permeate every aspect of their lives. Authentic liturgy is not something that just takes place in church. Ideally, our whole life is an act of worship to God. Offering ourselves to God means conforming to his will and not to the temptations of the world.

Matthew 16:21-27

Last week, Jesus praised Peter for recognizing him as the Messiah. This week, Jesus rebukes Peter for suggesting that he avoid the Cross. Peter has yet to learn that Jesus will not be a regal warrior type of hero, but a humble, suffering Messiah. Jesus goes on to speak about the cost and rewards of discipleship. Disciples (that includes us) must be willing to embrace the crosses of life and die to themselves, i.e., to their false self: proud, vain, self-seeking. Jesus, not oneself, must be the center of one's life. In dying to the desires of the false self, we will discover and grow into our true (Christ) self.






