

## PASTOR'S PAGE

### Labor Day

So, this is the time when we all lament, "*Where did the summer go?*" Indeed, the lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer always fly by all too quickly. Labor Day weekend is here, and along with it has also arrived what has come to be regarded as the unofficial end of the "summer season."

As we celebrate Labor Day this year, let's remember to honor the contributions made by all those who labor in our country and who, through their work, contribute to the strength, prosperity and well-being of us all. Whatever work we are engaged in, our labor should always be seen as a spiritual offering to God; we can do that if we undertake that work with a spirit of generosity and selflessness, regarding our tasks as opportunities to make others' lives, and the world in general, a better place.

I think it would be a great spiritual practice to get into the habit of offering a little prayer each day before you begin your workday or your daily tasks, whatever that might mean in your particular circumstances; it could be something as simple as: "*God, accept my work today as a gift that will serve to do your will and build up your kingdom of love.*"

I want to take this opportunity in particular to say thank you to all who work as paid employees at OLPH. They do an amazing job, and they keep things going in big ways and in small. I hope they know that their labors are not just a paid job, but that they also serve to build up the Kingdom of God through the work of the parish. May God bless them for the work they do for the Church — especially since we all know that working for the Church is "a labor of love," in that the Church does not pay very well!

Perhaps this Labor Day you, alone or as a family, could take a moment to pray this prayer of the Church, taken from the Mass for the Sanctification of Human Labor: "*O God, who through human labor never cease to perfect and govern the vast work of creation, listen to the supplication of your people and grant that all men and women may find work that befits their dignity, joins them more closely to one another and enables them to serve their neighbor. Through our Lord Jesus Christ your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.*"

### The Golden Ticket

You've seen the ad running in our bulletin, so guess what's back — yes, for its second year, **THE GOLDEN TICKET!** This was a huge success last year, even beyond what we were anticipating, and we hope to have another success this year. For that to

Trust me — you don't want to miss out on this! Buy your own ticket, go in with others on several tickets, and maximize your chances to win. Help us out by spreading the word to family and friends; you don't have to be a parishioner of OLPH (heck, you don't even have to be Catholic!) in order to purchase a ticket and win a prize.

Tickets will be on sale at the rectory during regular office hours, and will be sold outside Masses on several weekends in the coming months. Thank you for your help with this vitally important parish fund — and fun! — raiser.

### Religious Education Program starting up

As school starts up at this time of year, so too does our Religious Education Program begin to gear up for another "ministerial year." Meetings for catechists have been taking place, to orient them and give them important information for the upcoming year. Each week, the Religious Education Office has a page in the bulletin, giving important information and updates about the program. I hope all families with children enrolled in the program take note of this page each week, but actually every parishioner should read it and know what's going on in this major aspect of parish life. Keeping informed will give you a new appreciation of how elaborate our program is, with its many different facets; it involves not only the formation of children, but also includes many different components for parents and various prayer and worship experiences for parents and children together, so that we can support the parents in their role as the primary religious educators of their children.

Catechetical Sunday is September 15 this year, so in a couple of weeks I'll be writing more about this vital ministry in our parish. For now, take a moment to offer a prayer for everyone involved in the ministry

of catechesis to children in our parish.

#### **Fr. Jacob's Adult Faith Formation Course on Acts of the Apostles**

Formation in the faith is not something for children alone, however; all of us throughout our entire life should continue to learn about our faith and grow in our understanding of our Catholic tradition. I hope it is obvious to you that here at OLPH we place a high priority on adult faith formation by regularly offering adult education courses. These courses are offered for your own personal enrichment, and they can also be used to earn Basic and Advanced Religious Studies Certificates from the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

I hope you have noticed the latest class we are offering: it's being offered by our good friend, summer-helping-priest and Scripture-Scholar-in-Residence Father Jacob, and the topic is the Acts of the Apostles and the Beginning of the Church. You all know how great Fr. Jacob's preaching is, but did you realize that in his home country he is Professor at the John Paul II Regional Major Seminary of the Kasai and at Notre Dame University of Tshumbe? As a Scripture scholar, Fr. Jacob has much to offer.

I hope you will take advantage of this great opportunity to learn more about the Acts of the Apostles in the New Testament. The information and sign-up can be found elsewhere in this bulletin.

At this time of year when many things are starting up again I take this opportunity to remind all our heads of ministries and organizations that you should consistently make sure the rectory has the most updated information concerning the members of your ministry or group, notifying us of new members and of those who are no longer active. 



## PREPARING FOR

**Sunday, September 8, 2019**

**TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

*Jesus said, “Whoever does not carry his own cross  
and come after me cannot be my disciple.”*

Luke 14:27

### **Wisdom 9:13-18b**

Today's first reading seeks to remind us humans of the great limitations we have. It's hard enough for us to understand human affairs, the stuff of everyday life going on around us ("scarce do we guess the things on earth"), so trying to understand heavenly things is bound to be beyond our ability. What are we to do? Often the best way to learn is through questions that force us to consider the issues and come to our own conclusions, guided by God's "holy spirit from on high." Only by his grace and wisdom, not ours, will our paths be made straight.

### **Philemon 9:10, 12-17**

In this poignant letter, Paul is an old man writing from prison to Philemon, a leader of the Christian community in Colossae, about his young runaway slave named Onesimus whom Paul has met and converted to Christianity. Paul's encounter with Onesimus has resulted in a deep father-son bond between them, such that Paul would gladly keep the young man with him to help in his ministry. However, Paul sends the boy back to his former owner because he wants Philemon to make the choice to release Onesimus freely rather than under compulsion. While the details of this arrangement may seem foreign to modern sensibilities, the important point for us is that God always gives us the freedom to choose to do the right thing rather than forcing us to do so because of his great love for us.

### **Luke 14:25-33**

Jesus speaks to us today about total dedication and extreme detachment. A disciple is to follow Jesus by "hating his father and mother" and must "renounce all his possessions." Such statements as these may be very hard for us to hear. The old Law of Moses required allegiance and care for one's father but Jesus says the Kingdom of our heavenly father takes precedence over all things, even our parents of flesh and blood. Following Christ not only requires placing him ahead of all other values and concerns, it also demands a willingness to carry our cross and suffer with him. Jesus wants would-be disciples to understand the consuming dedication required of those who undertake to follow him.

### **Gospel Reflection Questions....**

*After reading next Sunday's readings and Gospel, take some time to pray on them before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.*

1. Is following Jesus a one-time choice or do you have to make it daily? Which would you rather have, all the possessions you could ever want, without Christ, or Christ and no possessions? Can you name some people who lived/live in Christ and have possessed nothing? What does this freedom allow them to do?
2. "Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." Do crosses make discipleship desirable? Is there anything that makes us want discipleship, even though it involves crosses? How would Pope Francis answer?

"The human heart desires joy. We all desire joy; every family, every people aspires to happiness. But what is the joy the Christian is called to live out and bear witness to? It is the joy that comes from the *closeness of God*; from his *presence* in our life. ...

Jesus has come to bring joy to all people for all time. It is not just a hopeful joy or a joy postponed until paradise, as if here on earth we are sad but in paradise we will be filled with joy. No! It is not that, but a joy already real and tangible now, because *Jesus himself is our joy*, and with Jesus joy finds its home; ... joy is at home in Jesus.

And our joy is just this: to be his disciples, his friends."
