



Children's Liturgy of the Word resumes next week

Another one of our beautiful and much-needed ministries will be starting up again next week! Next Sunday at the 10:00 a.m. Mass, we will resume the Children's Liturgy of the Word, with children first grade and older being dismissed every first and third Sunday of the month at the 10:00 Mass to celebrate the Children's Liturgy of the Word. It's all explained in detail elsewhere in this bulletin.

Tremendous thanks go to Jenine Spina who runs the Children's Liturgy of the Word program, attending to every detail so carefully and so lovingly, and to all who serve in this ministry as Shepherds, Heralds, Junior Lectors, Cantors, and especially as Homilists. All of you are giving a tremendous gift to the children of the parish through this ministry! I do hope all our children first grade and older will take advantage of this special outreach to them.

The GOLDEN TICKET

I'm thrilled to announce that this year's **GOLDEN TICKET Raffle** is officially underway! Yes, the **GOLDEN TICKET** is returning once again! This is always a huge success here at OLPH, in addition to being a great deal of fun. Many, many thanks to Meg Danaher and Bob Meade, who have headed this up each year, and who are doing so again this year. This is always a big money-maker for the parish, and I'm sure with a little effort on everyone's part, it will be the same again this year. Make sure you are a part of it!

You know how it works: there are a limited number of tickets sold — exactly 500 — at \$100 per ticket; that's a total of \$50,000. Cash prizes will total \$20,000, leaving a \$30,000 profit for the parish (do I need to rehash again how desperately we need that income?). Each ticket purchased entitles the ticket holder to attend the party and to bring one (1) guest.

We will provide beverages at the party, but if you're looking to have snacks or munchies or sweets — or even dinner! — we encourage you to bring your own. Be creative and make it fun! Bring your favorite homemade treat or family favorite, and maybe even share it with others! That will definitely add to the good time.

Trust me — you don't want to miss out on this great parish event! It is always a great time. Buy your own ticket, go in with others on several tickets, and maximize your chances to win. Help us out by spreading the word to family and friends; you don't

have to be a parishioner of OLPH (heck, you don't even have to be Catholic!) in order to purchase a ticket and win a prize.

Tickets are now on sale, and are available at the rectory during regular office hours, and from the Chairs of the event, the aforementioned Bob Meade and Meg Danaher. SUMMER APPEAL total

As you know, I always keep you in the loop concerning the results of our fundraising efforts, so let me announce to you the total for this year's Summer Appeal. Thanks to your generosity, we took in a total of \$52,200. THANK YOU, THANK YOU, THANK YOU! OLPH parishioners are always so, so generous!

Interestingly, the 2023 total is down from last year's amount of \$60,525 (and even more so from 2021, when the total was \$65,277). I guess this is understandable given the horrible economic conditions everyone is facing, and so please know that I am extremely grateful to everyone who participated and made a gift to the Appeal. Your generosity to, dedication to, and love for, OLPH truly make this parish "the place to be."

The good news is that 100% of that money stays right here in the parish, unlike what happens when there is a summer bazaar and vendors need to be paid. The bad news is that the money has already been spent, as it has been used for our own ever-increasing bills and expenses, including ongoing repairs.

We're still looking to sign up new Altar Servers!

Don't forget that we're still in active recruiting mode for new altar servers; see the information elsewhere in this bulletin. Girls and boys 4th grade and older are invited and encouraged to sign up. The deadline for signing up is **October 2**, which is coming soon, because I will begin the training sessions shortly after that. C'mon, moms and dads and grandmas and grandpas — encourage your kiddies to sign up! I look forward to working with all our new Altar Servers!

We're now also looking for more Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Ushers

Actually, we're looking to add to the ranks of ALL our liturgical ministers — Ushers, Lectors, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, both as Extraordinary Ministers to assist in the distribution of Holy Communion at Mass, and, for those who wish to do so and go on for further training, to bring Communion to the sick and the homebound. We are actively recruiting for those ministries also!

If you are not already involved in one of those ministries, **NOW** is the time for **YOU** to step forward and make this important offering of service to the parish. Pray about it and consider it seriously. It is a tremendous blessing to serve in one of these ministries. I know everyone feels they are not worthy enough, but the truth is no one is worthy, not even we priests; nonetheless, we respond to the call to serve the Lord and His Church. (Am I putting enough pressure on you? Good!)



THE OFFERINGS OF BREAD AND WINE

If the announced intention at Mass is for your intention, or if you have memorialized the bread



and wine, and you would like to carry those offerings forward at the Presentation of the Gifts during Mass, please be sure to let the ushers know this before the Mass begins. They will be happy to have you do this. If no one steps forward to specifically request this, then they will select people from the assembly.

FOR THOSE WHO CANNOT COME FORWARD IN PROCESSION TO RECEIVE HOLY COMMUNION

If you are, or if someone you are with is, unable to walk in procession to receive Holy Communion, please alert one of the Ushers **before Mass begins**. The Usher will be glad to arrange to have one of the ministers bring Holy Communion to the pew. Please remember to inform an Usher before Mass begins; do not wait until the time of Communion. Also, if at all possible, please sit in the front half of the church, to make it easier for the minister to come to you. Thank you.

FOR THOSE WITH CELIAC DISEASE

Special hosts are available for those with Celiac Disease who cannot receive Holy Communion using the usual bread. These hosts contain less than 0.001% gluten content and are approved for the Roman Catholic Church by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. If you need to receive Holy Communion using one of these hosts, please stop in the sacristy before Mass begins to discuss this with the priest. We will be happy to accommodate you.

REMINDER REGARDING THE COMMUNION FAST

Please remember that we are supposed to observe a Communion Fast before receiving Holy Communion. This means we do not eat any foods or drink any liquids for one hour before receiving Holy Communion, the only exception being water or medicine. This also means that we are not to chew gum during Mass, and certainly not while we are coming forward to receive Holy Communion. Let's be sure we are appropriately prepared to receive Holy Communion by observing this important rule of the Church.

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD

CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD EVERY FIRST AND THIRD SUNDAY at 10:00 a.m. MASS BEGINS ON SUNDAY, OCTOBER 1!

Allowing children to participate fully in the liturgical life of the parish is an important goal which we strive to attain here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help. Children should have every opportunity to understand what worship is all about and to be formed by the rites of the Church, especially the celebration of the Eucharist. In order to achieve this goal, we are happy to resume the **Children's Liturgy of the Word**, which will take place **every first and third Sunday of the month** at the 10:00 a.m. Mass **beginning again on Sunday**, **October 1**.

Where does the idea of the Children's Liturgy of the Word come from?

It comes out of the *Directory for Masses with Children* which tells us in paragraph 17, "Sometimes, if the place itself and the nature of the community permit, it will be appropriate to celebrate the Liturgy of the Word, including a homily, with the children in a separate, but not too distant, room. Then, before the Eucharistic liturgy begins, the children are led to the place where the adults have meanwhile celebrated their own Liturgy of the Word."

How does the Children's Liturgy of the Word work?

After the Collect (the Opening Prayer of the Mass), children **first-grade and older** are invited to come forward to the sanctuary to receive a special dismissal. They are then escorted to a separate chapel set up in the north sacristy of the church, where they listen to that Sunday's readings as proclaimed from the *Lectionary for Masses with Children*. These are the same readings everyone else is hearing in the church, but in a slightly different translation that is easier for children to understand. A special homily is then given to the children to help them understand the readings. This Liturgy of the Word concludes with the Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful), as the children pray intercessions together. Meanwhile, the Liturgy of the Word has continued as usual in the church. The children return to the church at the beginning of the collection/presentation of the gifts, and participate in the Liturgy of the Eucharist as usual.

What is the purpose of the Children's Liturgy of the Word?

The purpose of this is not to offer a babysitting service, nor is it to isolate the children or to make them feel unwelcome. Rather, it is actually an act of hospitality to them: they will be given the chance to listen to the Sunday readings and participate in a homily that will be on their level, and yet still be a part of the worshiping assembly, since they participate in all other parts of the Mass. It does require a certain maturity level and ability to focus, so it is intended for **first-grade children and older**, not kindergartners, pre-schoolers or toddlers. **Parents do not accompany their children;** we have specially trained adult "shepherds" who will keep watch.

Participating in the Children's Liturgy of the Word continues to teach children how to participate in Mass, since they do the same things that are being done in the main body of the church.

Ideally, parents and children then talk to each other on the ride home or later in the day about what they heard in their respective homilies. In this way, God's Word continues to be alive and active in the family's faith life.

Suppose I want my child to stay with me in the main body of the church?

That's fine; parents are in no way required to send their children to the Children's Liturgy of the Word, and no child is forced to participate. Children are welcome to stay in the main body of the church and to participate in the Liturgy of the Word there, where the usual readings and homily will take place. Since we think this is a great opportunity for children, though, we do hope you will encourage your child to participate.

What about the weeks when the Children's Liturgy of the Word is not held?

On weeks other than the first and third Sunday of the month, children simply stay with their parents for the entire Mass, being formed in what it means to participate in Eucharist through their weekly attendance. We hope that parents will continue to talk about the readings and other parts of the Mass with their children on an ongoing basis!

We are in the process of **recruiting new Altar Servers!** Being an altar server is a great way to be involved at Our Lady of Perpetual Help. You make an important contribution to the life of the parish and you perform an important ministry. Besides, it's fun!!! You serve at weekend Masses and other special events, attend some meetings throughout the year, and have fun parties!

Why not become an altar server? We would love to have you, and we will provide plenty of training — no prior experience is necessary!! If you are a boy or a girl who is in the 4th grade or older (it's o.k. if you are in 5th, 6th, 7th or 8th grade, or even older!), you are invited to become an altar server. Parents, why not mention it to your daughter or son to get them interested? Training will start soon, so sign up now. 

The First Amendment to the U.S. Constitution definitively protects the conscience rights and free exercise of faith of all Americans. Each year, however, the denials of First Amendment religious freedom become more numerous, unmistakable, and severe. The increased vandalism and destruction of statues, shrines and churches parallels an increasing intolerance for believers and their right to worship, let alone bring their faith into the public square of ideas as was intended by our founders. Founding Father John Adams said, "Our Constitution was made only for a moral and religious people. It is wholly inadequate to the government of any other."

Americans whose religious freedom is denied can contact multiple law firms, mostly supported by donations, which focus on defending their conscience rights as well as their right to openly live their faith in schools, communities, work, the military and the larger public square. For example, First Liberty Institute of Plano, TX successfully defended Coach Kennedy, a school football coach fired by his school district for taking a knee after football games to pray, silently and alone, on the 50-yard line. Over time players from both teams voluntarily came to join Coach Kennedy in silent prayer. After seven years of court action the Supreme Court's opinion was that Coach Kennedy and all public school teachers may engage in brief personal prayer in public view of others, including students.

Another example is the lawsuit filed by Becket Law to gain access for Catholics to Colorado's universal government-funded preschool at the public or private school of the parents' choice. The state, however, denies this benefit to students in Catholic preschools.

Also, Thomas More Society attorneys successfully challenged Illinois state's new law which attacked pro-life maternal healthcare centers. Alliance Defending Freedom attorneys have defended prospective adoptive parents against several states' laws which deny adoption to parents who do not agree with the state's gender ideology.

Knowing there is support available to protect religious liberty empowers us to preserve that liberty.

Lecturas del Domingo 25th del Tiempo Ordinario - Ciclo A Domingo 24 de Septiembre del 2023

"Busquen al Señor mientras se le encuentra. Invóquenlo cuando todavía está cerca", dice el profeta Isaías. Dios mismo sale en nuestra búsqueda, dice el mensaje de hoy.

Que el Señor se les haga encontradizo, y que permanezca siempre con ustedes.

Primera Lectura (Isaías 55,6-9): Busca los Caminos del Señor

Dios está muy cerca de nosotros. Deberíamos buscarle y aprender a pensar y a obrar al modo de Dios. Mi meta y mi oración es que en este mensaje usted que crea en Cristo aprenda a buscarlo continuamente para mantenerse en el amor de Dios. No ay una persona para la que este texto sea irrelevante, es para todos. Buscar a Dios por medio de su Hijo Jesucristo debe ser nuestro principal objetivo. Eso requiere una actitud de entrega, diligencia, perseverancia, confianza y humildad. Para buscar al Señor, ¿qué acciones podemos tomar? acción es para todo el que crea en DIOS y en su hijo Jesucristo y si tomamos en serio la decisión de buscar a Dios, también tenemos que tomar en serio la decisión de apartarnos del pecado. Que nuestra conducta y nuestros pensamientos sean agradables a Dios. Porque no podemos vivir en Dios si practicamos o planeamos el pecado. Nunca es tarde para comenzar.

Segunda Lectura (Filipenses 1,20c-24, 27a): Para Mí, "Vida" Significa Cristo

Para Pablo no tiene mucha importancia vivir o morir. Si vive, sirve a Cristo; si muere, estará con Cristo. Pero está dispuesto a seguir trabajando generosamente al servicio del evangelio. La muerte para un hombre carnal y mundano es una gran pérdida por que pierde todas sus comodidades de este mundo y todos sus sueños y metas; pero para el verdadero discípulo del señor es una ganancia porque al morir se al liberado de todas sus debilidades y miserias humanas, de todos los males de esta vida, y lo lleva a poseer el bien principal, la vida eterna.

Evangelio (Mateo 20,1-16a): Dios Es Generoso para con Todos. Un Dios Increíblemente Bueno

Cuando se nos ocurre pensar en ello, con frecuencia no podemos entender la bondad extrema de Dios. ¿Por qué es tan paciente con los pecadores? ¿Por qué regala sus dones a gente que, en nuestra opinión, no los merece, o los desperdicia? Pero los caminos de Dios no son nuestros caminos, sus pensamientos no siempre son nuestros pensa-



mientos. Pidamos en esta eucaristía a Jesús, el Señor, que nuestros pensamientos y nuestras obras vayan siendo, cada vez más, como los de Dios. El dueño de la viña pregunto a los que habían trabajado por más tiempo y más fuerte "que no puedo ser generoso con lo que es mío. El punto es que la gracia, la misericordia, el amor, el perdón son de Dios y la da a quien él le parece. PREPARING FOR

Sunday, October 1, 2023 TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

At the name of Jesus every knee should bend, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Philippians 2:10-11

Ezekiel 18:25-28

In this reading, Ezekiel tells his fellow exiles in Babylon that each individual will be held responsible for his/her individual sin. For the Israelites this was a radical new teaching. Until now, they believed in what is called "corporate responsibility" which meant that they were now paying for the sins of their ancestors. (Hence the words, "the Lord's ways are not fair.") Ezekiel states clearly that we are responsible only for our own sins. If the sinner repents he will experience a whole new beginning with God. Conversely, if the virtuous person sins, he will pay for his sins.

Philippians 2:1-11

While in prison, Paul has heard from his visitors about the bickering and divisions occurring amongst his beloved Philippians. From the deepest recesses of his heart he appeals to them to change their destructive ways. Because they have been baptized into Christ, they are called to live in a fellowship that should be characterized by love, humility, mutual respect, altruism and unity. As their model for this transformation process, Paul holds up for his readers Jesus who, even though he was God, was willing to surrender his equality with God in order to become fully human. He was willing to forgo his innocence to take on the sins of humanity.

Matthew 21:28-32

This is the first of three consecutive parables in Matthew on the theme of judgment day and how we will be responsible for our poor choices. The one who is faithful to the call will be rewarded, and the one who does not respond will be sorry. When Jesus asks the chief priests and elders which of the two sons did the Father's will, he is inviting them to pass judgment on themselves. The first son stands for sinners (tax collectors, prostitutes, etc.) who initially said "no" to God, but are now saying "yes" to Jesus. The second son represents Jesus' audience, the religious leaders of the Jewish people. They are the recipients of God's revelation. They, or their ancestors, at one time said "yes" to God, but now they are saying "no" to him by their rejection of Jesus. The first group in cooperation with the grace of God was able to have a change of mind and thereby open their hearts to Jesus. The latter group refused to have a change of mind and heart and therefore were shut out of the kingdom.


