

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

We have been experiencing First Communions and Confirmations, with their attendant festivities, and now we seem to be in the midst of "graduation season," high school and college. I take this opportunity to offer congratulations, blessings and best wishes to all who are graduating from some form of education at this time of year. May this time of transition be for you a time of excitement, growth and discovery of the importance of your gifts and talents.

We are experiencing some transitions of our own in several of our ministries here at OLPH. After offering many years of generous and extraordinary service, Debbie McDonough is stepping down from coordinating our Family Life Ministry, and will also retire from assisting in coordinating the Altar Servers. Louise Perrotta is stepping down as President of the Legion of Mary after her years of capable and devoted leadership. Pastoral Formation Institute Graduates

On Wednesday evening of this week the Diocese of Rockville Centre will be celebrating the

graduation ceremony for those adults who are completing a course of study in the Pastoral Formation Institute (PFI), and I will happily be in attendance at the ceremony. The Pastoral Formation Institute of the Diocese of Rockville Centre is a two-year process of personal, intellectual, spiritual and pastoral formation for adult Catholics. Parishioners who go through PFI are an asset to their parish because of the deepened sense of faith and deeper knowledge of our tradition that they bring to their ministries, in addition to the insights into pastoral ministry they obtain.

I am proud to announce that this year we have Joan Baffa and Vito Tandoi completing the two-year program. I am very grateful to them for the time, effort and sacrifices they have made to give themselves to this program of formation, and for the enrichment they will bring to their ministries at OLPH. Congratulations, Joan and Vito; OLPH celebrates your accomplishment!

I consider those who go through PFI to be a great gift to the parish, and so I ask many more parishioners to think about enriching their faith by attending the diocese's Pastoral Formation Institute. If you would like more information about it, please feel free to contact me and I will be happy to discuss it with you. I would like many parishioners to go so that our parish can benefit from your deeper formation.

Summer Appeal

Letters went out this past week announcing our second annual **SUMMER APPEAL**. We began this endeavor last year, and it was met with great success. Like last year, this year's **SUMMER APPEAL** will be a crucial part of the ongoing support and stewardship that you provide as we continue down the road toward financial stability.

As you know, the way the **SUMMER APPEAL** works is very simple: it is a direct request for your help, with no meetings, no time commitment on your part, and no phone calls. Every dollar goes directly into the parish operating budget to meet ongoing day-to-day expenses. It takes the place of a summer carnival and therefore saves us any costs that would have to be paid to outside vendors. Every dollar stays right here in the parish.

Keep in mind that OLPH is like most parishes in that attendance, and therefore collection revenue,

traditionally goes down over the summer months. However, the parish has the same bills to pay, and therefore the **SUMMER APPEAL** becomes an important part of keeping a balanced budget.

Believe me, I wish that as your Pastor I did not have to ask for money; it is not one of my favorite things to do (I would rather be planning great and uplifting liturgies for us to celebrate!). As I do so, however, I want you to know first and foremost that I already recognize and sincerely appreciate how much you are already giving to OLPH on a regular basis. Also, I recognize that many of you continue to feel the effects of our poor economy and poor job situation, and some of you are only beginning to get back on an even keel after Super Storm Sandy.

Last year, I requested that each family set aside a little more than one dollar (\$1) per day during the time of what might be considered the "summer months" from mid-June through Labor Day, and therefore I asked you for a donation of one hundred dollars (\$100) to the **SUMMER APPEAL**. Because the response was so great last year, I will ask only for the same amount. However, if you can give more, I will be very grateful. Many parishioners responded positively to my request last Fall for \$1 more in the weekly collection. In that same spirit, if you can increase your donation to the **SUMMER APPEAL** to \$105, I would very much appreciate it. Of course, if you must give less, I appreciate your sacrifice in giving whatever you can.

I thank you greatly and express my heartfelt appreciation for your participation in this year's **SUMMER APPEAL**.

New Administrative Assistant to the Pastor

I am happy to announce that we have hired someone to function as my Administrative Assistant. Josephine Vagelatos has begun working in that position, and we are happy to welcome her on board at OLPH.

When I arrived here in June of 2012, Patti Chavis, the Parish Secretary, graciously agreed to take on, in addition to the duties she already had, further administrative work to assist me and, therefore, for all intents and purposes, to function as my secretary/administrative assistant. As you can imagine, however, as I have be-

come more and more rooted in OLPH, the demands of being my administrative assistant have grown exponentially, and it became more and more burdensome for Patti to do two jobs at once. A careful analysis of our improved financial situation showed that we could handle paying for a part-time position without benefits (as we all know, it's the benefits that are quite expensive).

So, effective immediately, Josephine will now be Administrative Assistant to the Pastor, and she will be handling those duties for me. I know you will all extend the same kindnesses and courtesies to Josephine that you have extended to Patti as you work with Josephine from this point forward. Patti will continue to handle all the duties associated with being a parish secretary (the requests for the facilities calendar, general messages, sacramental information, parish databases and contributions, working with the receptionists, *etc.*) and Josephine will pick up all the duties that are directly related to assisting and supporting my ministry as Pastor. I am grateful to Patti and wish to publicly thank her for her generosity in assuming these extra duties for these past two years, which she did with good humor and a spirit of openness to serving the good of the parish. Thank you, Patti!



PUBLIC POLICY: Action Needed**A Statement from Timothy Cardinal Dolan
and the Bishops of New York State**

Calling on Governor Cuomo and Leaders in Albany: Don't Let Us Down

More than 200 Catholic schools have closed in the last 15 years throughout New York State, as families and parishes, who strongly believe in the value of Catholic education, struggle to keep up with increasing costs. Many of our public schools also desperately need help.

To address these needs, the NYS Catholic Bishops joined a broad coalition of faith groups, community organizations and labor unions backing legislation called the **Education Investment Tax Credit**. The measure would encourage increased charitable donations to generate more private scholarships as well as additional resources to public schools. It also helps all teachers provide needed materials and supplies for every classroom in New York.

The vast majority of legislators support the bill. Why? It's because the legislation will help all children, regardless of where they go to school. It's a win-win for all families!

Although Governor Cuomo assured us he would fight to include the proposal in the state budget, in the end, we were left out.

As the legislative session ends in Albany this coming week, we pray that Governor Cuomo won't let us down. We ask that you join us in that prayer. Pray that Governor Cuomo will put children ahead of politics and fight for the Education Investment Tax Credit.

We also ask that you contact him immediately with that same message. You can send a message to the Governor through the website of the New York State Catholic Conference: www.nyscatholic.org.

Registration for all students who will participate in the Our Lady of Perpetual Help Religious Education Program for the 2014-2015 academic year will be held on:

Students entering grades 2-8 who did not attend the OLPH program in the past academic year (2013-2014) must also register on the above dates.

Parents registering their children for the first time must bring the original copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate as a requirement for registration.





PREPARING FOR

Sunday, June 22, 2014: The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

"So that everyone who believes in Him may have eternal life"

(John 3:15)

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

Back in Egypt, the enslaved Hebrew people never did without, but yet did not have what they really needed: the Lord as their God. The Lord allowed them to suffer great hunger and thirst in the wilderness, so that they would learn to turn to Him for all their needs; to learn that life is not sustained through eating and drinking, but in trusting that the Living God will provide, just as He promised.

1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Before they became converts, the Christians of Corinth either witnessed or participated in bloody sacrifices to their culture's pagan idols. To continue such practices, Paul explains, is not only fruitless, but sinful. In their Christian worship, in eating of the one loaf and drinking of the one cup, they participated in the very body and blood of Christ. Even the sacrifices of Israel to the Lord are ineffective and to be abandoned, because the one true atoning sacrifice has been accomplished in Christ.

John 6:51-58

Recent Jewish biblical and historical scholarship seems to show that there was a greater diversity of belief among the people to whom Jesus preached than previously supposed, and that there was nothing "un-Jewish" about faith in Jesus as the awaited Messiah who would suffer and die and rise again. But Jesus' teaching on the eating of His flesh and drinking of His blood as the way to eternal life caused many of these disciples to leave Him.

Gospel Reflection Questions....

After reading next Sunday's Gospel (John 6:51-58) take some time to pray on it before you come to Mass.

1. When Jesus gives us himself in the Eucharist, does he give us his presence, or does he give us himself in the action of the whole Paschal Mystery (passion, death, resurrection)? Discuss.

2. God was with his people on their journey, nourishing them with manna and water. How does God respond to your needs on your journey? What is different about the food God gave the people in the desert and the food he gives us?


