

PASTOR'S COLUMN

Fifth Sunday of Easter

We continue to celebrate these fifty days of Easter Time "overcome with paschal joy," as the words of the Prefaces for Easter Time in the Eucharistic Prayer tell us, and, on this Fifth Sunday of Easter, the liturgical season still reverberates with the joy and enthusiasm of the sacramental initiation that occurred at the Easter Vigil, and also with the theme of our sacramental initiation in general. The Collect (Opening Prayer) for this Sunday's Mass makes explicit reference to "those you [God] were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism." The prayer goes on to ask that the baptized will "bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal." Notice how the meaning of Baptism continues to be center stage in the liturgical meaning of Easter Time! To further highlight the meaning of Baptism, in that prayer we also ask God to "constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us," so that all of us as the baptized may "bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal." The work of our renewal and redemption through Christ's death and resurrection continues to be at work within 115

The saving work of the Paschal Mystery is what takes place at each and every Mass; thus, our Prayer over the Offerings acknowledges "the wonderful exchange effected in this sacrifice" that makes us "partakers of the one supreme Godhead." I am always deeply struck by that word "exchange" whenever it is used in the liturgy; it is such a powerful image! We bring the offering of our life, uniting our offering with Christ's offering, in the offering of the celebration of the Eucharist, and particularly through the concrete offerings of bread and wine. Then, God gives those offerings back to us, transformed, in the transformed bread and wine which have become the Body and Blood of Christ. As a result of this heavenly "exchange," we have new life in Christ! Our newness of life in Christ must show itself in our living a worthy way of life — in the words of the Prayer after Communion, passing "from former ways to newness of life."

Continue to reflect on the newness of life that comes to us through Christ's death and resurrection and through the Sacrament of Baptism, and on what it means to be baptized. The glorious fifty days of Easter Time give us a special season to unpack the meaning of the mystery of being baptized and of being sharers in Christ's life, death and resurrection. Also reflect on the new life you have experienced this Easter Time — how the Risen Christ has given you new life and deeper joy in different ways.

First Communions

We're beginning "First Holy Communion Season"! Indeed, insofar as Easter Time is the most appropriate time to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation, how wonderful it is that First Holy Communions take place during Easter Time. (Don't forget that Eucharist is not only one of the three Sacraments of Initiation, but is, theologically, the culmination of our initiation into the life of union with Christ.)

Our celebrations of First Holy Communion begin this coming Saturday, May 4, with a Mass at 11:00 a.m. Then, as always, we will be celebrating a large number of First Holy Communions at parish Sunday Masses. Our schedule this year is: Sunday, May 5 — 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 Noon; Saturday, May 11 — 5:00 p.m.; and Sunday, May 12 — 12:00 Noon.

There is no better way for children to celebrate First Holy Communion than within the Sunday assembly, as the Church celebrates the Eucharist on the Lord's Day, our primary holy day! I am thrilled that over the years since we introduced this option more and more families are making this important connection and are taking advantage of this option. So many parishioners love it, too, as you comment to me how much you enjoy seeing the children, and how being a part of the celebration enriches your own faith and your appreciation of the Eucharist. I hope you are fortunate to be at a Mass at which we are celebrating First Holy Communion!

Please remember to pray for all of this year's First Communicants and their families.

Help carry the canopy in our Eucharistic Procession!

This week we're starting to run the ad to ask for parishioners to come forward to offer to help carry the canopy we carry over the Blessed Sacrament during our outdoor Eucharistic Procession on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, which this year will be on Sunday, June 2. Recall how beautiful this was last year! What graces and blessings will be brought to you and your family as you help us to give this public witness to the Lord's Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament! The Procession will take place as the conclusion to the 12:00 Noon Mass on that day.

We need people to carry the canopy at each of its four corners, and we are looking to use more than just four people, so that folks can take turns during the Procession. An entire family can take a turn! What a great way to get your young ones involved in Eucharistic devotion! What an amazing thing for a family of a First Communicant to do! In addition, a husband and wife, or an engaged couple, or a dating couple could sign up to take a turn together, and members of a parish group or organization could sign up.

All the information is in the ad elsewhere in this bulletin, so take a look, and then return your response. Let's continue to make this Eucharistic Procession a huge success, as we have each year in the past. Let's give an amazing public witness to all of Lindenhurst about our belief in the Lord's Real Presence in the Eucharist.

Parish Wedding Anniversaries Mass

May 7 is the deadline to respond to attend this year's Parish Wedding Anniversaries Mass, so don't forget to return your response if you have not already done so. As you know, this is the occasion when we affirm the graces and blessings married couples give to the Church, and it's geared toward couples celebrating an anniversary on any five-year mark (5, 10, 15, 20, etc.), and couples married any year over 50 years. We ask you to limit attendance to immediate family members only, due to space limitations. Also, while we're happy to provide this free of charge, if you would like to make an extra donation to help cover the costs for the



PREPARING FOR

Sunday, May 5, 2024 SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Love one another as I love you.

John 15:12

Acts of the Apostles 10:25-26, 34-35, 44-48

This reading is the climax of a longer story that is very important. Cornelius is a Roman centurion, a Gentile (non-Jew), who has a vision. Peter, many miles away in another city, also has a vision. When they meet, as we hear today, it becomes clear that these two visions were meant to convert Cornelius to belief in Jesus Christ but also to convert Peter to the belief that God's love is for everyone, Jews and non-Jews alike. God pours out his Holy Spirit on Cornelius and his whole household even though they were not Jewish, a fact that initially astonished Peter. However, Peter came to see by this that "God shows no partiality." We today are the beneficiaries of that impartial love as God's Holy Spirit is available to all of us through our baptism.

1 John 4:7-10

We hear today one of the most beautiful poems in the New Testament. When we hear this poem we think with our hearts not with our heads. It is a wonderful poem about the tender love that God has for us. Indeed, we hear forms of the word "love" ten times in the space of a few short lines. This is meant to draw those who hear it into an experience of a loving relationship with God who loved us so much that he sent his only Son to die for us. This is the foundation of our relationship with God and with one another.

John 15:9-17

Today's Gospel is a continuation of Jesus' teaching on the "vine and branches" we heard last Sunday which he gave to his disciples at the Last Supper. Before he leaves them he wants them to understand how and how much he loves them. Surely his disciples had previously noticed the loving relationship Jesus had with his Father. Now Jesus is telling them that this relationship extends to them, too. "As the Father loves me, so I also love you." This shows how the disciples, and we today, are to love one another: "Love one another as I love you." That's a tall order sometimes but comes with the assurance that doing so will make our joy complete. That's good news indeed!


Gospel Reflection

- 2. According to Pope Francis, how can we get to know and love God?

"This is the doctrine of two Commandments: the most important is 'You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' To get to the first we must ascend the steps of the second: that means that through our love for our neighbor we can get to know God, who is love. Only through loving can we reach love."

 - b. The first screen will ask the name of your organization-from the drop down list select **Rockville Centre-Safe Environment**.
 - c. Follow all directions on the next screens.
 - d. One screen will have the **Codes of Conduct**. Please acknowledge the Codes of Conduct.
 - Continue with the registration process and select the class you will attend.
 - f. After selecting the class, you will be instructed to complete the background screening application.
 - 2. Background Screening Application:
 - a. Sterling Volunteers is the company providing the background screening.
 - b. Follow all the directions to complete the background screening application. DO NOT STOP ONCE YOU BEGIN THE APPLICATION! If you stop-you are locked out of the process due to security procedures.
 - c. You will need to provide your Social Security #; if you do not provide a Social Security # you will be charged a fee.
 - d. After completing the application, hit the 'Submit Button'

A Day Set Apart: Sunday

hat are your childhood memories of

Sunday? Was it a day that began with worship? Was it a time set aside to spend with family and friends? Were there special meals or other family rituals?


Sunday, for my family, meant going to Mass first thing in the morning. Since my hometown was largely populated by Italians, Sunday was the day we ate pasta.

I can still smell the aroma of homemade tomato sauce that filled our house. In the afternoon, we would sit on the front porch, go for a ride to visit relatives, or visit the graves of our loved ones at the cemetery. Then we would stop at a fast-food restaurant or go for an ice cream. It was a special day, sacred in fact, because we did things on Sunday we didn't normally do during the rest of the week.

Whatever your childhood memories of Sunday, chances are that your current experience is different. Times have changed. Now many people use Sundays to catch up on the work that didn't get done the rest of the week. Sundays have become filled with scheduled school and sports activities, leaving little time to observe the special nature of Sunday as directed in the book of Deuteronomy:

Observe the sabbath—keep it holy, as the Lord, your God, commanded you. Six days you may labor and do all your work; but the seventh day is a sabbath of the Lord your God. You shall not do any work. (Deuteronomy 5:12–13)

The Sabbath is a day to praise God for God's goodness and to make the day holy as God did in creating the Sabbath. As Genesis 2:3 states, "God blessed the seventh day, and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work he had done in creation."



Sunday frees the faithful to fulfill the command "to love one another" in ways that may have been passed up during the week.

Scholars of the Talmud say the Sabbath was created not because God needed rest, but in order to make rest holy, to demand rest of humankind so that by regularly resting in God they could become new people. Believers are encouraged to keep the day by setting aside weekly routines, relaxing, and partaking in only those things that refresh our spirits. Work, after all, will never be complete.

Sunday does not just serve our renewal. Sunday frees us to fulfill the Lord's command to "love one another" in ways often passed up during a busy week. Our very celebration of the Sunday Eucharist calls us to this service. As Pope John Paul II notes in his apostolic letter *Dies Domini*, 69, the Sunday Eucharist commits the faithful even more "to all the works of charity, of mercy, of apostolic outreach."


