THE PASTOR'S PAGE

Children's Liturgy of the Word Resumes This Sunday!

It is a pleasure for us to resume the Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 9:30 a.m. Mass this Sunday. As you know, at the 9:30 Mass starting this weekend, children first-grade and older are dismissed after the Collect (Opening Prayer) to move to a separate chapel which we have set up in the north sacristy. There they hear the readings, but from a simpler translation taken from the *Lectionary for Masses with Children*. Then those readings are "broken open" for them as a reflection is discussed with them so that they can understand the message of the readings. After this time of reflection and discussion, the children pray the Prayer of the Faithful, and then return to the main section of the church for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Ideally, parents discuss with their children what each heard in their homily — the adults in the church and the children in the Children's Liturgy of the Word — and the Word of God can then really come alive in the faith life of a family.

How blessed we are to have so many people of all ages who offer their time and presence in this ministry: we have adults who offer reflections to the children; we have adults and older teens who act as "shepherds" to accompany the children; we have young people who serve as readers and cantors to the children. I am especially grateful to Jenine Jimenez who coordinates the overall aspects of this liturgical ministry, and to Francine Schnabel who assists with the readers for this ministry. To all who offer themselves in this ministry, please know what a wonderful gift you are giving to the children of the parish!

Allow me to remind you, in conjunction with this, that we continue to have available children's envelopes, for the children to make a financial offering to the parish out of their allowance or out of other money they earn, and children's bulletins, for two different age levels, in order to reinforce the message of the readings at home. We are doing our best to try to form the children of our parish into being "full, active and conscious" participants in the action of the liturgy.

Columbus Day

This Monday we celebrate Columbus Day, a holiday which commemorates Christopher Columbus' landing in the new world on October 12, 1492. In addition to honoring this achievement of Columbus that changed the course of world history, it is also a day that has become associated with Italian-Americans celebrating their heritage. As a full-blooded Italian American, I have always enjoyed celebrating my heritage on this day. As with all holidays, I hope the day provides you with an opportunity to take some extra

leisure time as a way of resting and renewing yourself in the midst of what I'm sure is a very busy life.

"For Lease" Sign

If all is on schedule, by now you may have noticed that we have posted a "For Lease" sign in front of our Convent building. As you are aware, we are still trying to rent out the Convent in order to make use of the empty space and to realize some desperately-needed revenue for the parish. While we have had much interest in the space in the two-plus years since I have been here and actively pursuing this, nothing has come to fruition yet. It is hoped that this sign will generate even more interest.

We took great care to make sure it was placed in front of the correct building. I would hate to give the impression that we were leasing out the church or the rectory! (*Although, if we could make some money renting out Fr. John's or Fr. Ethel's rooms...hmmm...*)

Trip to the Cloisters

I am very much looking forward to Tuesday of this week, as that is the day I am leading, along with Chris Ferraro, our parish trip into Manhattan to the Cloisters Museum, with a stop at the Mother Cabrini Shrine, where we will celebrate Mass. The Cloisters Museum and Gardens is a branch of the Metropolitan Museum of Art devoted to the art and architecture of medieval Europe. Of particular interest to us will be the connections with monastic religious life and the exhibits dealing with the objects used in the sacred liturgy. Each year when I was on faculty at the seminary I would take the first-year men on a trip to the Cloisters, and I always found it edifying and enjoyable. I'm sure that this trip with parishioners will be no different.

The day will include a visit to the Mother Cabrini Shrine which is in upper Manhattan right near the Cloisters. The Chapel of the Shrine houses the most precious remains of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini. After her death in 1917, Mother Cabrini was buried in West Park, New York. In 1933, her remains were moved to the Chapel of Mother Cabrini High School. Following Mother Cabrini's canonization in 1946, there were so many pilgrims coming to pray that a new shrine was built in 1957 on the grounds of Mother Cabrini High School. Today, the Shrine continues as a center of welcome for new immigrants and pilgrims of many nationalities who come to pray and reflect.

We'll also be having a little free time in Manhattan and then a meal at the famous Carmine's restaurant. With all that we have planned, let's pray that the weather cooperates!

Annual Report to the Parish Next Weekend

Next weekend I will be speaking at all the Masses delivering my annual report to the parish, as has been my custom since coming here. I feel this is an important thing for me to do as your Pastor in the interest of transparency and accountability. It's important for each and every parishioner to feel that she or he has a stake in and a commitment to the life of the parish. Like it or not, finances and other "temporalities" (the "this world" aspects of the life of the parish) are realities that we must look at and discuss from time to time. This annual report gives me the chance to personally share with you where we are at with our finances, our buildings and grounds, and the overall state of the parish, with an eye toward how those impact our ministerial efforts and our spiritual life together. This report provides an opportunity for us to look at where we have been, where we are, and where we hope to go in the future. As you will hear, there is much to be hopeful about concerning the future of OLPH, but there are definite challenges we face, challenges that everyone in the parish will be asked to make a commitment to overcoming together

if we are going to continue to move forward and grow.

I thank you for your indulgence each year in accepting the presentation of this report. As I mentioned, I feel I owe it to you to keep you informed and updated.



Below is an excerpt from Cardinal Sean O'Malley's statement for Respect Life 2014.

“In his 2013 Day for Life Greeting, Pope Francis conveyed that “even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God’s creation, made in his own image, destined to live forever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect.” We see Pope Francis living out the truth of these words in his actions.

We want to be part of a society that makes affirmation and protection of human rights its primary objective and its boast. Yet to women faced with an unexpected pregnancy, abortion is often presented as their only ‘choice’. A large percentage of children pre-diagnosed as having Down syndrome are never given the chance to live outside their mothers’ wombs. Elderly members of our families fear they will become burdensome and seek physician assisted suicide. We see these and many more of our brothers and sisters pushed to the periphery...

...Although we set aside October to particularly pray for respect for all human life, let us never cease this urgent work.”




29 Semanas del tiempo ordinario

Primera Lectura (Is 45, 1.4-6): La primera lectura nos habla de un Pagano, Instrumento del Plan de Dios. El rey Ciro, sin saberlo, sirve a los planes de Dios liberando a los judíos del exilio, porque Dios es el Señor de la historia y lo califica con el alto nombre de “ungido del señor”. En realidad no fue poco lo que hizo en favor de Israel puso fin a la deportación a babilonia restituyo los objetos de oro y plata apropiados por Nabucodonosor y reconstruyo el templo de Jerusalén. El señor es que guía los hilos de la historia. Dios en la elección de los hombres siempre él es el primero en salir amuestro encuentro.

Segunda Lectura (1 Tes 1,1-5b): Palabras de Aprecio. San Pablo da gracias a Dios por la joven comunidad cristiana de Tesalónica; es una comunidad ideal de fe, esperanza y amor. Lo mismo sigue ocurriendo hoy en día porque Dios es el mismo de ayer hoy y siempre no solo en tesalónica sino en tu vida y en la mía.

Evangelio (Mt 22,15-21): ¿Qué significa dar al cesar lo que es del cesar y a Dios lo que es de Dios? Que es del Cesar si todo es de Dios? Iglesia y Estado. Pertenece a las dos ciudades: a la humana y a la de Dios y debemos dar a cada una lo que le es debido. Solo quien da a Dios lo que es de Dios, sabe lo que debe dar al cesar. Lo que es de Dios, el amor a Dios imitando a su hijo, en el amor a los hermanos. El que busca esto encuentra la respuesta también a lo demás. Los valores del evangelio deben ser nuestra guía.

Preguntas de la reflexión del evangelio de san Mateo 22: 1-14

El motivo de estas reflexiones anticipadas es para que usted tenga una preparación previa antes de la misa.  29th Sunday in Ordinary Time
 “Give the Lord glory and honor” - Psalm 96

Isaiah 45:1, 4-6

Applied to kings, “anointed” originally referred only to those of Israel, but it is here given to Cyrus, the King of Persia, because he is the agent of the Lord; that is, he is providentially appointed to facilitate what God has planned. And as did King Cyrus, the nations will also come to know that Israel’s God is the only God; cf. also vv. 20–25.

1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b

When Paul parted from Barnabas (Acts 15:36–41) at the beginning of what is called his second missionary journey, he chose Silvanus (Silas) as his traveling companion. Soon afterwards he took Timothy along with him (Acts 16:1–3). Paul was now clearly at the head of his own missionary band. Paul’s thankful optimism regarding the Thessalonians’ spiritual welfare is tempered by his insistence on their recognition of the selfless love shown by the missionaries. In an age of itinerant peddlers of new religions, Paul found it necessary to emphasize not only the content of his gospel, but also his manner of presenting it, for both attested to God’s grace as freely bestowed and powerfully effected.

Matthew 22:15-21

The series of controversies between Jesus and the representatives of Judaism (see Mt 21:23–27) resumes. These controversy stories (22:15-22:46) hold a critical position in Matthew’s narrative flow. They are the Jewish leaders’ counter attack to Jesus’ three parables of judgment against them (sons, tenants, banquet).

Gospel Reflection Questions....

After reading next Sunday’s Gospel (Matthew 22:15-21) take some time to pray on it before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.

1. In this Gospel, are the Pharisees more interested in taxes or in undermining Jesus’ influence? Since the universe and everything in it is made in God’s image, what does belong to God? Are you a caretaker of the earth?

2. Do God’s and Caesar’s worlds have to be separated? What would it look like if they were joined together?
