# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## Year of Faith and Belong More Deeply

This week, in conjunction with the start of the Universal Church's Year of Faith, our diocese launches its BELONG MORE DEEPLY initiative, and our parish is taking full part in it. As is being explained at all the Masses this weekend, we are asking YOU to accept your baptismal commitment to be an evangelizer and to help someone you know BELONG MORE DEEPLY to our parish life.

It's simple, and it doesn't put anybody on the spot. Let me review for you what it entails. We ask you to identify someone who you think would really benefit from coming back to the Church, and from being invited to BELONG MORE DEEPLY by reconnecting with their faith life. This weekend you are asked to write that person's name on a card we have provided, along with YOUR contact information, and to return that card in one of the designated baskets. We will collect those cards, and, as a group, those names will be prayed for each week at Mass in the Prayer of the Faithful.



Part One of your role as an **evangelizer**: PRAY FOR THAT PERSON DAILY. Part Two of your role as an **evangelizer**: in the not-too-distant future you will receive a letter listing different parish events during Advent; your job is to **invite that person to accompany you to one or more of those events**. We will not be putting that person on-the-spot by labeling them as "returning Catholics" or "fallen-away Catholics." **All we are looking to do is to reconnect that person with the faith life of our parish and give them the chance to experience the good things that are happening at OLPH, both spiritually and socially. The best way for that to happen is through YOUR PERSONAL INVITATION TO THEM.** There is no high-pressure and no "sales gimmick" to bother them. All it takes is a committed Catholic — YOU — to give WITNESS that you have something that's worthwhile and important in your life, namely, BELONGING TO THE CHURCH. You're telling them that you have something SO GOOD that you want to SHARE it and have someone else experience it.

I urge you to read Bishop Murphy's Pastoral Letter *You Too Go Into the Vineyard*; copies are available around the church, or you can go to [www.drvc.org](http://www.drvc.org) and read it or download it there.

## St. Agnes Medal of Service Award



Each year Bishop Murphy bestows the Saint Agnes Medal of Service on people in every parish throughout the diocese whose love of the church has been shown through their devotion to the Holy Father, to our diocese and to their parish. Recipients of the Saint Agnes Medal of Service are the people in our midst who build up our parish communities by extraordinary service in parish ministry, parish administration, or some significant volunteer role.

I am proud to say that **Mr. Robert Dobres** will be receiving the Saint Agnes Medal of Service Award for OLPH this year. Bob has been a devoted member of OLPH for over fifty (50) years. He has served as, and is still, a Parish Trustee and a member of the Finance Committee. He has coordinated the Catholic Ministries Appeal for many years and is heavily involved in the Knights of Columbus. These are but a few of the contributions Bob has made to the life of the parish over so many years. Bob will be receiving the Saint Agnes Medal at a special Prayer Service of Thanksgiving today, Sunday, October 14, at 3:00 p.m. in St. Agnes Cathedral, and it will be my pleasure to be present for the ceremony as Bob and so many faithful Catholics throughout the diocese receive their medals. ***Congratulations, Bob, and thank you for all that you have done and will continue to do for OLPH! You make us proud!***

## World Mission Sunday

Next weekend, Oct. 20-21, the Church celebrates World Mission Sunday. The celebration of World Mission Sunday each year is an important experience of worship, catechesis and worldwide sacrifice "reaffirming the Church's desire to engage with greater courage and zeal in the *missio ad gentes* [mission to the nations] so that the Gospel may reach the very ends of the earth" (*Message of Pope Benedict XVI for World Mission Sunday 2012*). The collection taken up for World Mission Sunday is an important one, and I would ask you to be as generous as possible in the second collection next weekend. Your participation *can* and *does* make a difference to the poor of the world who long to come to know the hope and the love that only Jesus Christ can give. By participating in the collection, you can become a "missionary of faith" during this YEAR

OF FAITH.

## All Souls Novena

November is traditionally a month of remembrance for our beloved dead, a time when Catholics pray in a particular way for all of our loved ones who have gone before us in faith, through death into eternal life. The month begins with the celebration of The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day) on November 2.

This year we will be celebrating a special **All Souls Solemn Mass of Remembrance at the 7:00 p.m. Mass on Friday, November 2.** I'll speak more about that in a future Pastor's Column.

Starting this weekend, envelopes will again be available for you to share in the All Souls Novena of Masses which we will be celebrating. Upon submitting the names of your deceased loved ones through the use of those envelopes, they will be prayed for in a particular way throughout the Novena of Masses. Please be sure to participate in this meaningful spiritual practice.

## Confessionals

Some time within the next few weeks you will notice that renovation work will begin on our Confessionals. This work is part of the "Restoring God's Glory" capital campaign begun under Fr. Trapani, and it will be paid for out of that fund which is restricted to use for ongoing repair and renovation in and around the church. Renovation of the Confessionals is much-needed from both the structural perspective and the ritual perspective. In terms of physical structure, the lighting, ventilation and overall construction of the Confessionals need to be updated. In terms of the ritual perspective, the opportunity for face-to-face Confession needs to be added to three of them: right now, only one Confessional affords the opportunity of face-to-face Confession; the other three do not.

Thus, three of the Confessionals will be redone so as to offer both the option of anonymous Confession and face-to-face Confession, and the one that currently offers both options will be updated to match the other three (the work on this one should entail only redecorating, not actual construction work). The work will be done on one Confessional at a time so that we do not lose use of them to any large degree.

As a result of this work we will be able to enjoy four beautiful, inviting, aesthetically-pleasing holy spaces that will encourage participation in the Sacrament of Penance. Let's see if we can't make the Confessional a place you *want* to be!

## Wedding Rehearsal Ministry

As announced elsewhere in this bulletin, we are looking for people who might be interested in assisting in conducting wedding rehearsals. This is an important ministry and a great way to *offer* yourself in service to others and to the parish. Take a look at the ad and think and pray about it. It's not especially labor-intensive, but it is much-needed and would be a fun thing to do. You would be part of a "pool" of people who would be called on to do this only every few weeks. It's something husbands and wives or friends could do together; maybe you and your spouse are friends with another couple and the four of you would like to be a team! ## THIS WEEKEND....

### *Prayer and Commitment Weekend*

Today at OLPH everyone will be asked to complete a prayer and commitment card for someone you know who is away from the Church. If you have not turned in your card yet this weekend, you can do so next weekend.

On this card, you'll be asked to write down the name (or a pseudonym) of someone you want to belong more deeply. We will not contact this person in any way—this is only a commitment of prayer. The prayer cards will be displayed in our Marian Chapel and we'll include these intentions in the Universal Prayer throughout the next few weeks.

We ask you to provide us your name, address and e-mail address so that as in the weeks ahead we will ask for your help in inviting others to belong more deeply to the life of the Church.

Together, using the Belong More Deeply Prayer (on the left of this page), let us pray for one another and those we hope to return to the life of the Church.

Bishop Murphy's recent pastoral letter, *You, Too, Go Into the Vineyard*, gives each of us much to think and pray about. Bishop Murphy writes: *"In Belong More Deeply, I spoke of two groups. The context was Christmas and the two groups I spoke of were the shepherds who came joyfully in response to the angels' voices and found the Lord, worshipped and adored Him, and placed their lives at the feet of Mary and her Divine Son. The others were the Magi who were wise men from a distant country who saw the star and were fascinated by that star and wanted to follow it to see if they could discover in their wisdom what it is that God's message would be for them. They came, they adored the Lord, they gave Him their gifts, and then they went back by a different way. No doubt they were touched by the Lord and were changed for the good even by that brief encounter."* (p. 5)

### Questions for Reflection

1. Who is a person of the "Magi" for you—one who has left the Church after a time?
2. Reflect on this person's journey. What was their reason for leaving? Can this be addressed in this time of prayer and reflection? How?




## BRINGING FORWARD THE OFFERINGS OF BREAD AND WINE

# PARISH SOCIAL MINISTRY



*As we prepare for upcoming elections, we will publish excerpts from *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship* from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.*

## Faithful Citizenship

### Call to Family, Community, and Participation

46. The human person is not only sacred but also social. Full human development takes place in relationship with others. The family—based on marriage between a man and a woman—is the first and fundamental unit of society and is a sanctuary for the creation and nurturing of children. It should be defended and strengthened, not redefined or undermined by permitting same-sex unions or other distortions of marriage. Respect for the family should be reflected in every policy and program. It is important to uphold parents' rights and responsibilities to care for their children, including the right to choose their children's education.

48. The principle of subsidiarity reminds us that larger institutions in society should not overwhelm or interfere with smaller or local institutions, yet larger institutions have essential responsibilities when the more local institutions cannot adequately protect human dignity, meet human needs, and advance the common good.

### Rights and Responsibilities

49. Human dignity is respected and the common good is fostered only if human rights are protected and basic responsibilities are met. Every human being has a right to life, the fundamental right that makes all other rights possible, and a right to access to those things required for human decency—food and shelter, education and employment, health care and housing, freedom of religion and family life. The right to exercise religious freedom publicly and privately by individuals and institutions along with freedom of conscience need to be constantly defended. In a fundamental way, the right to free expression of religious beliefs protects all other rights. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities—to one another, to our families, and to the larger society. Rights should be understood and exercised in a moral framework rooted in the dignity of the human person.




