FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Annual Report to Parish This Weekend

As you know from attending Mass, this weekend I am presenting my annual report to the parish. I thank you for your attention to this report which I have made an annual custom. I feel it is vitally important to make this report to you as part of my accountability and transparency to you as your Pastor. Every parishioner should have a basic understanding of where we are at and where we need to go as a parish, both in terms of our finances and in terms of our mission and ministries. This annual report gives a snapshot of that.

As I communicated to you in my presentation, “*we are getting there.*” Financially, we are in less dire shape than we were last year, and that is due to the tremendous generosity and cooperation of all of you. We have managed to secure some extraordinary income which gives us a little bit of a cushion, but we cannot rely on these extraordinary funds since these are one-time sources of income that could very quickly be used up. There are two keys to securing a solid foundation of financial security for the future: the renting of the Convent, and the ongoing weekly collections.

Let me reiterate that the Finance Committee, our Business Manager Deacon Tom Bast, our Facilities Manager Deacon Don Stamm, and I are working very hard to make sure everything is being done on our part to bring about that solid foundation of financial security: finding ways to increase revenue, controlling spending, being responsible to our budget, and pursuing every feasible lead to get the Convent building rented.

I ask for your continued support in being faithful to the weekly collections. Allow me to remind you of a request I made in my talk: although we are not undertaking a formal “increased offertory” campaign, I would ask you to prayerfully consider if it would be possible for each family to **simply give one dollar more in each parish collection each week**. That simple **one dollar each week** for the parish from every family in every collection would be a huge assist in assuring a positive cash flow and in keeping us on the road toward future financial stability. That weekly one dollar in each parish collection — I’m not including second collections or special collections, but simply each family’s parish contribution each Sunday and Holy Day — would total *under \$60 per year*. That small increase of one dollar per week on your part, when totaled up among all the families in the entire parish, would add up to a great deal. Thank

you for your prayerful consideration of this.

Along with the financial aspects of the parish, however, I give the annual report so that we can all get a glimpse of the mission and ministerial life of the parish. In this aspect too I am happy to say “*we are getting there.*” By that I mean there does seem to be a renewed sense of joy and a more positive outlook about OLPH. There is a tremendous spirituality and faith among parishioners which continues to grow and grow. We have introduced many new activities to build community and to provide opportunities for prayer; we are trying to highlight “big parish liturgies” as “major events” to build up our oneness in worship. Things are happening here, and will continue to happen!

I would like to reiterate one point from my talk: we are always looking to welcome greater involvement in our societies and our ministries, especially in our liturgical ministries. An ongoing goal in the year ahead, and beyond, will be to continue to increase the number of people who offer themselves in the various ministries and societies of our parish. There are so many opportunities for service to others, and we should see such service as constitutive of our life as Christians.

I would like us to continue to grow and move forward as a parish as OLPH strives to be a model parish and “the place to be” in the Diocese of Rockville Centre!

In-Pew Survey Next Weekend

An important part of our life together is the way we perceive our connectedness to the parish and to one another. A healthy and vibrant parish is one where there is a high level of engagement in the spiritual behaviors of **inviting, giving, thanking** and **servicing**. Notice how those four spiritual behaviors express the hallmarks of Catholic life: **inviting = evangelization; giving = communal life; thanking = liturgy (worship); service = diakonia**. A healthy and vibrant parish is one where the members are highly engaged in living those hallmarks of Catholic life.

As I have been writing about over the past few weeks, OLPH would like to undertake a process whereby we measure how well we as a parish are responding to God’s call to live out the spiritual behaviors mentioned above. Next weekend, we will be conducting an at-Mass, in-pew survey for this purpose. A copy of the survey is printed in this bulletin. Take a look at it and notice the questions that are

asked; think about and pray over what your responses will be. Notice that the survey is not intended to evaluate your individual faith or knowledge of Catholicism. Your opinions will be kept completely confidential, and neither OLPH nor the Gallup organization will reveal any individual responses to anyone! The survey has nothing to do with politics. What the survey does do is measure the parish's — not yours as an individual, but the parish as a whole — commitment to those fundamental attitudes and behaviors of inviting, giving, thanking and serving that indicate the spiritual health of a parish as a community.

The results of the survey will be analyzed, shared with you, and discussed by parish leadership, and the information will help us to devise an action plan for the future so that we might find ways to enhance our sense of belonging to and being engaged with the parish community.

All Souls Novena

I invite all parishioners to participate in our All Souls Novena of Masses by using the All Souls Day Novena envelopes which were mailed to you and which are available throughout the Church. All intentions will be prayed for during the All Souls Novena of Masses beginning on All Souls Day. This is a very powerful and meaningful way to remember and pray for your deceased loved ones as the Church highlights November as the month for remembering and praying for our beloved dead.

New Restrooms in Church and New Ushers Room

Finally, finally, finally! The new restrooms for the church are complete and are functional. I think they

came out very nice and help to create a dignified space as restrooms. There are two rooms on the south side of the lobby, with one room being handicapped accessible, and there is still one room on the north side of the lobby, in the ushers' room.

With these new bathrooms, there is no longer any need for anyone to use the restroom in the sacristy, so all Mass-goers are asked to use only the restrooms located in the lobby area. In addition, I ask everyone's cooperation in keeping the restrooms clean and orderly. For now, we will keep the restrooms unlocked while liturgies are taking place, and they will be locked when nothing is taking place in the church. We'll see how this works out.

It's a good thing I paid attention when I took that class "Restrooms 101" in the seminary. The things you have to be familiar with to be a Pastor...! :)

In conclusion...

Together, let's aim high in Christ. Together, let's bring out the best in each other. Together, let's be the best we can be in Christ.

And let's always remember: LOVE IS A GIFT.






(PLEASE NOTE: This is not the Book of Intentions and only the names of the deceased, without any intention, should be written in this book when it is placed in the Chapel.)

Offer the Gift of Yourself in the Wedding Rehearsal Ministry


Our parish is in need of people who are willing to offer themselves to do wedding rehearsals for couples preparing for marriage.


New Restrooms Are Complete




We are happy to announce that all renovations of the Church restrooms are now complete and new restrooms are fully operational. There are two (2) new restrooms located at the south end of the main entrance lobby. One of these restrooms is handicapped accessible. In case of necessity, a third restroom is also available in the Ushers Room at the north end of the lobby.

We ask your cooperation in keeping these restrooms neat and orderly, for the sake of all. Hand dryers have been installed to eliminate the need for paper towels, which unfortunately are often disposed of improperly, causing plumbing blockages.

With the completion of the new restrooms in the lobby area, there is no longer any need to use the restroom in the sacristy up front; only the restrooms at the lobby entrance at Wellwood Avenue should be used. Thank you.
