## THE PASTOR'S PAGE

### *St. Agnes Medal of Service Award*

This afternoon at a 3:00 p.m. prayer service at St. Agnes Cathedral in Rockville Centre Bishop Murphy will award the Saint Agnes Medal of Service. This annual award was instituted eight years ago to recognize members of our diocese who have contributed their time and talent to the Church in an extraordinary way. An individual or a couple is chosen from each parish in the diocese because of their consistent, generous and meaningful contributions in varied ways to the life of their parish.

I am pleased to announce that this year's OLPH recipients of the St. Agnes Medal of Service are **Peter and Grace Tapinis**. Pete and Grace are long-time parishioners who have always been 100% willing and available to do so many different things to support parish life at OLPH. Grace is very active in the St. Vincent de Paul Society and was of tremendous service to families after Superstorm Sandy. Pete offers his skills as a painter to the parish, in addition to being a catechist, an extraordinary minister of Holy Communion, and a member of the RCIA team. All who know them know how much they have done to help make OLPH an active, warm and welcoming parish.

I offer my gratitude and appreciation to Pete and Grace for who they are and for all they have done for OLPH and I very much look forward to being with them at the prayer service this afternoon as this wonderful and distinguished honor is presented to them.

### *Catechetical Service Awards*

Each year the Diocese of Rockville Centre holds a Catechetical Service Awards ceremony to recognize those who have offered themselves in the ministry of catechist for a significant number of years. The awards given are: the St. Pius X Award for 10 years of service; the St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Award for 20 years of service; the Pope John XXIII Award for 25 years of service; and the Bishop John R. McGann Award for 30 or more years of service (given in five-year increments). Elsewhere in this bulletin, in the Religious Education section, you can see the names of this year's recipients from OLPH and the category of the award they are receiving. It will be my

pleasure to be with these outstanding catechists at the awards ceremony this Tuesday evening at St. Agnes Cathedral.

Each week as I visit classes and am generally present to the Religious Education program I am amazed and awestruck at the dedication and love of all of our catechists. Think about the offering they make to the parish: week after week they give up their time and use their energy in order to share our Catholic faith with the young people of the parish. In addition, especially in the levels that include preparation for the sacraments, there is extra time that is demanded of the catechists. Also, catechists are asked on an ongoing basis to be part of experiences for their own formation and enrichment as teachers of religion. At times it is a thankless task because, sometimes, children and parents do not provide all the cooperation one would hope for. Nonetheless, the positive aspects and rewards of this ministry far outweigh any of the difficulties, and if you engage catechists in conversation about why they do what they do, you will see the sparkle in their eye and you will feel the warmth of the Holy Spirit as they describe what the children mean to them and what it's like to share their faith.

Everyone in the parish should join me in prayerful gratitude and appreciation for the remarkable service given by all our catechists, and, especially at this time, those who are being recognized this year at the Catechetical Service Awards.

### *All Saints Day*

This coming Saturday is November 1 (*I know...this is where we all say, "November already??!!!"*), which on our liturgical calendar is, of course, the Solemnity of All Saints. All Saints is one of those Holy Days in the United States that, when it falls on a Saturday or Monday, the obligation to attend Mass is suspended. However, just because it is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year does not mean that we cannot or should not attend Mass, so I encourage everyone to attend the 8:00 a.m. Mass on Saturday, November 1. We will celebrate the Mass with the appropriate degree of solemnity for the day with music.

I think All Saints Day is one of the most beautiful days in our liturgical tradition. What a

gift it is to have a day that remembers all the saints known and unknown to us who enjoy the glory of heaven!

The Gospel for All Saints Day is the Beatitudes, which are for us the guidelines — the outline for the way of living — that lead to true joy and holiness in our life here on earth and, when lived properly, to the attainment of happiness in the next life.

This solemnity has very ancient roots in our liturgical history, beginning in the East as early as the fourth century as a feast in honor of all the martyrs, and being celebrated in Rome by the early seventh century.

The prayers of this Mass remind us of the beauty of what we are celebrating: in the Collect we recognize that all the saints are intercessors for us, and we have the support and grace of their prayers; the Prayer over the Offerings asks that “we may experience their [the saints’] concern for our salvation;” and the Prayer after Communion reminds us to look forward to the day when we, hopefully, “pass from this pilgrim table to the banquet of our heavenly homeland” to be with the saints in the new and heavenly Jerusalem. Listen for these phrases and for this imagery when these prayers are prayed at Mass.

#### *The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls Day)*

Following immediately upon All Saints Day is The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed, also known as All Souls Day. This day is unique on the liturgical calendar: it is neither a solemnity nor a feast, but rather a commemoration, and yet it outranks other feasts and even takes the place of the Sunday in Ordinary Time since November 2 falls on a Sunday this year. This day when we commemorate our beloved dead is one which resonates deep in our hearts, and the custom of praying for the dead has been our custom since the earliest days of the Church. A central tenet of our Catholic faith is that our prayers can be of assistance to the dead. The hope that is part-and-parcel of the Christian understanding of death is acknowledged every time we pray the Creed: “I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.”

There are many different choices of Mass prayers for the priest to use on All Souls Day, but

all of them in one way or another proclaim the centrality of the Paschal Mystery in understanding the meaning of Christian death: because of Jesus’ Death and Resurrection, death leads to new life for all those united to Christ. Therefore, because of our faith in the Risen Christ, we can find hope in death. The words of one of the Prefaces for the Eucharistic Prayer in Masses for the Dead sum this up well: *“In him [Christ] the hope of blessed resurrection has dawned, that those saddened by the certainty of dying might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Indeed for your faithful, Lord, life is changed, not ended, and, when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven.”*

Each year OLPH celebrates a special **All Souls Mass of Remembrance** with a solemn reading of the names of all those for whom we have celebrated a Funeral Mass over the course of the past year. This year this Mass will be celebrated at the **12:30 p.m. Mass next Sunday, November 2**. Families of those who have died have received a special letter of invitation, and we invite all parishioners to join in celebrating this special Mass. Hospitality will follow.

There is one final point I must add at this time: I must offer words of deep gratitude to all who offer themselves in our Ministry of Consolation, assisting families at the time of the funeral rites. Week after week these caring, compassionate and dedicated offerers minister to families and provide for them a very warm and faith-filled presence of Church to people at a very important and sensitive time. Thank you to all who work in any capacity in the Ministry of Consolation! I know they are always looking for more people to join them, so if you can consider becoming a part of this very important, beautiful and life-giving ministry, please feel free to contact me.

#### *In conclusion...*

Together, let’s aim high in Christ. Together, let’s bring out the best in each other. Together, let’s be the best we can be in Christ.

And let’s always remember: LOVE IS A GIFT.

We will celebrate a special All Souls Parish Mass of Remembrance on **All Souls Day, Sunday, November 2 at the 12:30 p.m. Mass**. At this Mass we will pray by name for all who have died in our parish community over the past year. All families who have celebrated a funeral Mass at OLPH in the past year are being specially invited, and all parishioners, whether or not they have experienced a loss, are invited to come and join in prayer.

Following the Mass, all are welcome for hospitality. Please consider participating in this Mass to join together in prayerful solidarity with our brothers and sisters who have lost a loved one in the past year.



### *All Souls Day Novena*

All Souls Day Novena envelopes are now available throughout the Church. These envelopes are a meaningful way for you to have your deceased loved ones prayed for in the Novena of Masses for All Souls Day. Take an envelope, fill out the name of the deceased, and return the envelope with your donation. Envelopes may be returned either in the collection basket or at the rectory. Special Masses will be offered for nine (9) days for these intentions for the deceased.

## **ALTAR OF REMEMBRANCE**

During the month of November, we remember in a special way our loved ones who have died.

This year, our Liturgy Committee will prepare a special Altar of Remembrance in the Divine Mercy Chapel. **Beginning November 1st, you are invited to place a picture on the altar so that we may remember your loved ones and pray for each other.**


#### **Every Saturday and Sunday**

## PREPARING FOR

### Sunday, November 2, 2014: All Souls Day

*“For this is the will of my Father,  
that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him may have eternal life.”*

*John 6*

#### Wisdom 3:1-9

Wisdom 3:1-4:19 is a larger unit within the book that treats three situations that the ancient Israelites would have considered curses: suffering, childlessness, and an early death. Suffering is seen by the Wisdom author not as a sign of God's displeasure, but as an experience of purification. This is an advance from early Judaism, which would attribute the good or bad circumstances of life as either a divine endorsement or punishment. The divine purpose of a soul's purification and refinement is not punishment, but the means to making our union with God possible.

#### Romans 5:5-11 or Romans 6:3-9

Through baptism, believers share in the death of Christ and thereby escape from the grip of sin. Through the resurrection of Christ, the power to live anew becomes reality for them. But the fullness of participation in Christ's resurrection still lies in the future. The persecutions that attend Christian commitment are to teach believers patience and to strengthen this hope.

#### John 6:37-40

After Jesus miraculously fed thousands with five barley loaves and two fish, the crowds pursued Him. They wanted Jesus as their king, so that He might continue to provide for their every need in life. But as Jesus points out, He had come as food for their souls, and it was He who came to seek *them* out, to draw them to the Father who had sent Him.

### Gospel Reflection Questions....

*After reading next Sunday's Gospel (John 6:37-40) take some time to pray on it before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.*

1. What was the will of the one who sent Jesus, as mentioned in the Gospel of John? Was this a plan from all eternity?

2. Jesus promised eternal life to everyone who believes in him. Do your deceased loved ones have eternal life? Do you think God sometimes gives us signs that they are safe? Have you ever received such a sign?


