

PASTOR'S PAGE

Columbus Day

Happy Columbus Day weekend to all, as with the Monday holiday we commemorate Christopher Columbus' landing in the new world on October 12, 1492. Additional good wishes to all who take this occasion to celebrate their Italian-American heritage on this holiday, as I do. For those who are off from work on Monday, it's nice to have a three-day weekend, right? I hope the day provides you with an opportunity to take some extra leisure time as a way of resting and renewing yourself in the midst of all the busyness and craziness that make up life in our world today.

Msgr. Hamilton

I have some updated and final information concerning Msgr. Hamilton which I can now share with you. As many of you may know, since last May when Msgr. Hamilton was discharged from a stay in the hospital, he has been living at St. Pius X Residence for Retired Priests at Dominican Village in Amityville. Over the past several months, Monsignor has found that he is very satisfied with the care and style of living there. He is receiving much-needed attention and personal assistance, which is the very reason for this residence for retired priests. In my visits to Monsignor he reports that he is happy with the facility and he enjoys living with the other retired priests and the camaraderie they share.

Therefore, Msgr. Hamilton requested that Bishop Murphy officially transfer his living assignment from being in residence at OLPH to being a resident of the St. Pius X Residence for Retired Priests, and that request has been granted by Bishop Murphy, with the accompanying official letter of transfer received. As a result, Msgr. Hamilton's residence is now officially the residence for retired priests at Dominican Village in Amityville. Allow me to share with you Bishop Murphy's words to Msgr. Hamilton: "This Diocese and all the fine priests and people who help make it what it is owe you a debt of gratitude for your many years of service — as an associate and a pastor, as a professor at St. Pius X [High School Seminary] and editor of *The Long Island Catholic* and a wise advisor on a Diocesan level. I hope you can truly relax and enjoy the years at Pius X."

I hope you will join with me in echoing Bishop Murphy's words of admiration and gratitude to Msgr. Hamilton as we keep him in our prayers for many years of grace, happiness and peace in his retirement.

Scouting at OLPH

IMPORTANT NOTICE AFFECTING ALL CHILDREN OF THE PARISH

As required by the Diocese of Rockville Centre, Sacraments of Initiation are to be celebrated in the home parish of the child. Therefore, all families of OLPH with children celebrating First Communion and Confirmation are to have their children celebrate those sacraments at OLPH. As Catholics, our faith identity is centered in our Eucharistic identity, namely, the Sunday worshipping community we belong to (where we celebrate Mass Sunday after Sunday). This community is our primary community and the community in which our faith is lived, day in and day out.

Because of this, and because each year of religious formation builds on the prior one, **all school-aged children who are parishioners of OLPH, regardless of where they attend school, must be registered with our Religious Education Office for all years of religious formation (not only for sacrament-preparation years).**

- Children **in all grades** who attend **public school** attend religion classes in our Religious Education Program, and they and their parents also participate in various non-classroom religious formation experiences.
- Children **in all grades** who attend a **Catholic elementary school** need not attend the Religious Education classes, but they must be registered with us, and they and their parents participate in all the non-classroom religious formation experiences, especially but not only in sacrament-preparation years.
- Children **in all grades** who are **homeschooled** must also be registered with the Religious Education Office; they may or may not be required to attend the Religious Education classes, depending on their homeschool curriculum, but regardless, the homeschooled children and their parents are to attend the various non-classroom formation experiences, especially but not only in sacrament-preparation years.

If you are a parishioner with children in a Catholic elementary school or who are homeschooled and you are not yet on record with our Religious Education Office, please contact the office immediately. If you know of anyone who should be registered, please let them know of this policy. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.



PREPARING FOR

Sunday, October 16, 2016—The Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night? Will he be slow to answer them? I tell you, he will see to it that justice is done for them speedily.”

Luke 18:7-8a

Exodus 17:8-13

Moses intercedes for his people using the staff he previously used when God parted the Red Sea to allow the Israelites to escape from Egypt. This time he uses it as Joshua leads them in battle with the Amalekites who are trying to deny them entry into the land God promised them. Noticing that Israel has the better of the battle whenever Moses has his hands raised, Aaron and Hur help him keep his arms up during the long hours of the battle. What we see here is the importance of persistence in prayer. Moses, the nation’s leader, not on his own but with the help of assistants, asks for God’s help and mercy for the people who give their lives to protect the Promised Land. God hears his persistent prayer by giving Israel the victory.

2 Timothy 3:14 – 4:2

Paul speaks to his protégé Timothy lovingly and wisely about the role God’s Word can (and should) play in his life. His words are just as powerful today to anyone who remains open to his Word and desires that it become the fuel that drives their heart. Paul writes from prison anticipating death on account of preaching the Word so he is speaking of what he knows. He speaks of the power and awesomeness of the Word. “All Scripture is inspired by God,” he says, and then goes on to list the many ways it is useful and can enrich our lives. Knowing it intimately equips us for every good work so that we can make a difference in our world by patiently sharing it with others.

Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks in a parable today about the necessity to pray always without becoming weary. An unjust judge feared neither God nor man but he gave a widow justice because she was persistent in her prayer. At an even deeper level, Jesus is asking us to be persistent in faith, not simply in saying prayers. We must return to God again and again, not with long discourses, but with simple faith that in humility of heart and in plain language places our needs before him with confidence in his merciful love. Our all-merciful God will indeed respond to the faith of earnest and humble believers.

Gospel Reflection Questions....

After reading next Sunday’s Gospel take some time to pray on it before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.

1. What does Jesus’ injunction, “Pray always ...” mean to you? Do you think Jesus means only prayers of petition? What does Jesus want to make clear to you about petitioning God? Discuss this statement: “When you pray for rain, take an umbrella.”
2. In his address for the “Angelus,” Pope Francis asks, “Why does God want us ‘to cry out day and night’ to the Lord? Doesn’t God already know our needs?”

And this is a good question, that leads us to deepen a very important aspect of the Faith: God invites us to pray with insistence, not because he doesn’t know what we need, or because he doesn’t listen to us. On the contrary, he always hears and knows all of us, with love. In our daily journey, especially in difficulties, in the fight against evil outside of ourselves and within us, the Lord is not far away, he is at our side; we fight with him beside us, and our weapon is prayer, which makes us feel his presence alongside of us, his mercy, even his help.
