

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What are you doing for Lent?



Well, this is it! We are now in the last few days of liturgical Ordinary Time, and we are gearing up to begin the holy season of Lent which begins this Wednesday with Ash Wednesday. I strongly encourage you to take the season seriously and to spend time reflecting on how you will enter into the Church's traditional penitential practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

Starting this weekend we are making available to you a special booklet *What Am I Doing for Lent This Year?* They are available on the pew ledges throughout the church. The booklet is free of charge and can assist you in your spiritual reflections during the season.

Also, look for special information elsewhere in the bulletin that provides a liturgical catechesis concerning the meaning of Ash Wednesday.

Mardi Gras

Of course, what kind of a Lent would it be if it were not preceded by a **Mardi Gras**?! The announcement for our parish's celebration of Mardi Gras has been running in the bulletin, and I wanted to take a moment to call your attention to this fun and community-building evening.

It begins with **Evening Prayer** for families (the liturgy will be "kid-friendly!") in the church, and then continues in the auditorium for the festivities. Hey, we all need to go a little wild before we settle down for the serious business of Lent, right?

Most importantly, perhaps, is that the evening concludes with the **burning of palms to be used for Ash Wednesday**, with a special brief prayer service to accompany that. What a great way for us to celebrate together and to teach our children how our liturgies and our liturgical seasons connect with our life! I hope you will plan on joining us.

6:30 p.m. Sunday Mass In Polish Will Be Discontinued

Last Sunday I spoke at the 6:30 p.m. Sunday night Mass, our Mass in Polish, to make an an-

nouncement in person to the people who worship at that Mass. The comments that follow are an adaptation and summary of what I said there.

The Mass in Polish was made possible because of the generosity of the four priests, Father Stan, Father Janusz, Father Piotr and Father Piotr, who took time out of their busy schedules to come here from other parishes to celebrate this Mass. It is now quite a few years that they have been doing this, and what was supposed to be a temporary situation wound up becoming more permanent than anyone intended. No one ever expected, certainly not those four priests, that they would continue to do this for so long.

Back in the middle of December these priests informed me that, because of increasing responsibilities in their own parishes, they would no longer be able to come here to celebrate this Mass. This is perfectly understandable and, in fact, it is a step that probably, for their own sake, should have been taken a long time ago. First and foremost I wish to thank Fathers Stan, Janusz, Piotr and Piotr for the tremendous gift of themselves they have made over these years in coming to our parish. They are to be commended for the service they have given.

After discussing the situation with our parish Pastoral Staff and with the parish Liturgy Committee, the decision was made that for the time being we will not be able to continue with this Mass in Polish. The last Mass in Polish here will be at the end of this month, on the last Sunday, February 24; after February 24, we will not be having a Mass in Polish for the foreseeable future.

Allow me to make some additional points to contextualize things concerning this decision. First and foremost, remember that no one is to blame for this, least of all the four Polish priests who have been serving so well. Their commitment must be to the regular assignment given to them by the Bishop, and so they must devote their energies to the parishes to which they have been formally assigned.

Second, as Pastor I am still very concerned about meeting the legitimate needs of our Polish-speaking parishioners. This does not mean that I do not care about the spiritual needs of our parishioners. It does not mean that I am saying, "Good-

bye, go somewhere else,” and that’s all there is to it.

Third, the Polish priests will be welcomed back any time as any visiting priest would be when they are requested because of a close personal or family relationship. I do ask that as much as possible baptisms not be scheduled privately, but that all parishioners come to see your parish priests, and that children of the parish be baptized at the parish baptisms on the second and fourth Sunday of every month by the priests and deacons of the parish.

Fourth, I think that as difficult as this might be at first, we can also see this as a wonderful pastoral opportunity. I think this is an opportunity for us to re-evaluate and to re-assess exactly what the needs of our Polish-speaking parishioners are; it’s an opportunity for us to explore together how we can best meet those needs. These are complex pastoral questions that cannot be answered quickly or easily.

We are doing this same type of thing with our Spanish-speaking community. We did something very similar with our Youth community a short time ago, as we temporarily halted our Youth Ministry and took the time to re-evaluate, re-assess, and then build anew. There are discussions that need to take place, and these pastoral concerns will be part of what we do as a parish into the future. We want to avoid quick or hasty answers that might look good in the short-term but actually are not helpful in the long-term. There are conversations that we need to have as a parish, especially among the Pastoral Staff and Liturgy Committee. But all of this will take time and patience.

As I said, though, this can be an opportunity for grace; for example, it’s a chance for parishioners who have attended only the 6:30 p.m. Mass in Polish week after week to become more integrated into the life of the parish by attending other Masses here and becoming more involved in various ways, as much as possible, in different parish activities. There are changes we are making in other parts of parish life, including the celebration of Mass, and we want there to be a unified, consistent approach in all areas of parish life. As a Pastor, I am very concerned that we not have three separate, parallel parishes — one English, one Spanish, one Polish — but rather, that we are one

parish. Together, we have to figure out what that means.

For now, though, we just simply do not have the resources to continue with this Mass. If anyone absolutely must worship in Polish, know that our neighbor close-by, Our Lady of the Assumption Parish in Copiague, has Mass in Polish, including a late-day one on Sunday, at 5:00 p.m. Again, though, let me be clear: I am not saying, “Good-bye, go somewhere else;” it is my fervent hope that we will remain together in this parish, even though for a while, at least, the Mass in Polish will not be taking place.

I thank everyone for your patience and understanding, and, most importantly, for your prayers for the Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish community.

In conclusion...

Together, let’s aim high in Christ. Together, let’s bring out the best in each other. Together, let’s be the best we can be in Christ.

And let’s always remember: LOVE IS A GIFT.

ASH WEDNESDAY

THE MEANING OF ASHES

Lent begins with ashes on our brows, reminding us of fundamental truths about ourselves. The dust of the ashes reminds us that death is inevitable for each of us. The ashes speak of repentance and of our need to convert our lives. The words at the imposition of ashes call us to repent and to believe in the Gospel. The ashes speak of a fire that has grown cold, a fire that needs to be rekindled within us by the time we gather around the new fire at the Easter Vigil. We seek to rise from the ashes of our sinfulness to a fuller life with Christ.

But before we can embrace the new life of the resurrection, we must embrace the cross. Before coming to the font of life-giving water, we must travel the desert. To embrace new life, we must be willing to embrace death. To become our true selves, we must slay the false selves behind which we have been hiding. Though it sounds negative, the dying to self to which we are called is the only way to fullness of life, and thus it is a profoundly positive step in our spiritual life, a step that begins with being signed with ashes.

COMMUNAL MEANING OF ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENT

We make our Lenten journey through the desert in the company of the catechumens and candidates preparing for the initiation sacraments at Easter. This is the origin of Lent.

What we have come to call Lent developed in the fourth century, when three intersecting movements coalesced. The first was a paschal fast that gradually developed from two days into a forty-day observance. The second was the pattern of initiation that gradually developed into a full catechumenate with an intense period of spiritual formation leading to the sacraments at Easter. The third was the order of penitents, which sought a second conversion for those who sinned seriously after baptism. Modeled on the catechumenate, this process of the order of penitents culminated with reconciliation just before Easter.

Thus the forty-day fast was understood as the final stage of preparation for those called to baptism and also as a time for reconversion for the already-baptized. As the whole community accompanied the elect and the penitents through this season, it came to be seen as a time for baptismal renewal for all the members of the church.

In subsequent centuries, however, both the catechumenate and the order of penitents gradually disintegrated. Lent was still seen as a penitential season, but the emphasis was on individual works of self-denial and on personal identification with the passion and cross of Christ. Lent was still a preparation for Easter, but the baptismal focus was largely lost, and the communal nature of conversion was ignored. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving were held up as Lenten activities, but they became private rather than corporate. The liturgical reforms of the Second Vatican Council called for a recovery of the ancient tradition of a communal understanding of Lent.

We are to journey through Lent together, then, as though we were all catechumens. We are to listen to the readings and pray the prayers as though we were approaching the waters of life for the first time. We seek to understand and thus to enter into the experience of the elect, those called to enter into the paschal mystery of Christ Jesus through the waters of the font. Thus we all prepare together to come to the water again, to be more deeply converted to Christ and to renew our baptismal promises with conviction.

DON'T JUST "RECEIVE" ASHES

As a parish, we wish to highlight that ashes are never just *received*, but rather that being branded with ashes is a sign of a **commitment** we make. The ashes are a sign that together we are all enrolled in the "order of penitents" and that we are committing ourselves to cooperate with God in **changing our life**. Ashes should not be passively received, but **actively accepted as a challenge**.



THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

MINISTRY OF PRAISE

It isn't February, already? Is it? Where did the time go? It was only Christmas yesterday. As I get older, time just seems to fly by. I remember being in grade school and thinking how time dragged and how long it was until a special holiday, or birthday. The days just didn't pass fast enough. And now!

People seem to have no time. "I'm too busy? Lots to do." Hurry, hurry, rush, rush. There's a little prayer I know. "Be still and know I am God". Be still. When do I have time to be still? Well! Here's your chance. Lent. Christ went into the desert to be still. To pray. To set his priorities. The church invites us to do the same. Be still; go into the desert. But where is the desert? The desert is within you. You have to make time to be still.

Any relationship takes time. Time to be together. Time to do things together. God desires time with us. We have to do our part. We have to make time, to be still so we can hear that small whisper from God that says I love you just as you are. We have to give God time to gaze upon us and listen to what God has to say. It isn't always easy. We have to create quiet time; an early morning, a train or bus ride, turning off the TV or iPod. In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus asks

the apostles could they not stay with Him for an hour. Maybe an hour is too much. What about 10 or 15 minutes? That's a good start. Try it.

In the parable of the Prodigal Son, when the father sees the son coming towards him, he doesn't sit by and wait for the son to come, and explain why he's coming back, what mistakes he's made, or failures he has endured. Jesus says the father rushes off to meet the son with hugs and gifts. Jesus' parable was an insight into the heart of God. When God catches a glimpse of our willingness to spend more time, more quality time with God, God, like the father of the prodigal son, will rush out to meet us more than half way. The Holy Spirit will inspire us so that each one of us will find a way to be still. Trust in the unconditional love of God to show you how you can create some quiet time to be closer to Him. Take a step into your desert and God will slowly draw you in. Don't just give up something for Lent; give something to God for Lent- your time. May you be showered with God's many hugs and gifts.
