After leaving us on June 26, Fr. Ignace will be a summer helping priest at St. Joseph Parish in Garden City, so he will still be close by, and you can keep in touch with him if you would like. Then, at the beginning of September, Fr. Ignace will return to his home diocese of Tshumbe in the Democratic Republic of the Congo to begin a new assignment, that of Director of Lay Apostolates for his entire diocese, an important position that is a testament to his Bishop's confidence in Fr. Ignace and a recognition of his many pastoral gifts and talents.

As you continue to be with us in these last days of your ministry here, Fr. Ignace, please know of our gratitude and appreciation for your presence this past year. We wish it could have been longer! You have always been such a joyful presence in the parish, and we thank you for the many ways you have enriched us with the gift of your priestly service.

## Next Week: Fr. Moise

Next week we bid farewell to Fr. Moise at the 11:00 a.m. Mass, followed by hospitality in our auditorium afterwards. ## Governor Cuomo's Abortion Expansion Bill

As was announced at all the Masses last weekend, Governor Cuomo released his abortion expansion legislation on June 4, legislation which is even more dangerous to the sanctity and dignity of life than was originally anticipated. Catholics must act **now** with one voice to combat this extreme legislation.

As your Pastor, I urge each and every parishioner of OLPH to become involved in this issue. Additional information can be found elsewhere in this week's bulletin with important details. We need Catholics throughout the Diocese to contact the Governor's office and the Long Island delegation of assembly members and senators. This is easily done through the Catholic Action Network at [www.nyscatholic.org](http://www.nyscatholic.org). Legislators will listen to **you** more than they will listen to clergy, so it is important for all Catholics to make their voices heard.

Please do all you can to become informed about the issues and to learn about what action you can take. We **can** have an effect on this important issue of public policy and religious freedom if we take action. Most importantly, let's all continue to pray for the conversion of minds and hearts for the upholding of the sanctity and dignity of all life, from the moment of conception until the moment of natural death, and let's also pray that we will uphold what truly brings dignity to the life and well-being of women and children everywhere.

## Tom Acemoglu's New Position

You read in last week's bulletin that Tom Acemoglu, our Director of Religious Education, has accepted a position in his home diocese upstate and so will be leaving OLPH at the end of July.

This is a great opportunity for Tom and his family and will be a very good move for them on a number of levels, and so of course I am very happy for him. At the same time, I am disappointed for us as we are losing a very fine man, a very fine Catholic, and a very fine Director of Religious Education. Tom and I have had a very good working relationship this past year since I arrived, and I was always impressed by his deep commitment to faith, his love for people, and his desire to catechize and evangelize. As anyone who has spent just a few moments with Tom realizes, his relationship with Jesus is real and is the center of his life, and he brings great zeal to his ministry. I was very pleased with the direction Tom was taking in our Religious Education Program; I think he has both built on the great foundation that was here and, at the same time, has brought new and exciting and helpful elements into it. I'm happy to say that we will continue with the course Tom has set and, because of his good work, we will be able to continue on solid footing.

There is a tremendous amount of change of personnel going on at OLPH at this time: three priests now, our DRE in the summer, and our music director in the Fall. This is all due to factors beyond anyone's control and the timing is just one of those coincidences of life. However, I am confident that the Holy Spirit is and will continue to be with us in these changes and transitions, and, as always in the power of the Lord's Resurrection, we have every reason to believe and hope that new life awaits us in His grace!

We are in the process right now of interviewing several applicants who have applied for the position of Director of Religious Education, and as soon as a decision is made I will inform you.

## New Altar Servers

This Sunday, we are installing new altar servers, and the boys and girls will begin serving next weekend, June 22-23. They are a wonderful group of young people, and it has been a real pleasure for me to spend the last couple of months training them. I have come to know them well, and I know they will be dedicated and reverent in the exercise of their ministry. With my college background in elementary education, working with the altar servers has always been something I have enjoyed in my parish assignments, as it gives an outlet to the "elementary school teacher" side of me! As Pastor, I enjoy getting to know the children and their families, and I think that's an important pastoral connection.

Congratulations to all our new altar servers!!! The parish is very grateful for the offering of yourself in this way, and your ministry and service to the parish is extremely important. We are so happy to have you as the newest of our liturgical ministers!

## Summer Appeal

This week you should have received the mailing of our **Summer Appeal**. This is an important new endeavor we are undertaking at OLPH, and I humbly ask the participation of all parishioners.

As the letter explains, although traditionally in many parishes the attendance and amount of collection revenue decrease over the summer, the expenses our parish has to face continue year-round. Hence, after consulting with our parish Finance Committee and receiving their advice and input, we are running this **Summer Appeal**, which will be a crucial part of the ongoing support and stewardship that you, the parishioners, provide.

Every dollar received in the **Summer Appeal** will go directly into the parish operating budget to meet ongoing day-to-day expenses. Please know that I recognize and sincerely appreciate how much everyone is already giving to OLPH on a regular basis, and I am not asking people to give what they cannot afford. However, I would like to request that each family set aside a little more than one dollar (\$1) per day during the time of what might be considered the "summer months" from the mid-June through Labor Day, and therefore consider a donation of one hundred dollars (\$100) to the **Summer Appeal**. If you can give more, I will be very grateful; if you must give less, I appreciate your sacrifice in giving whatever you can. You can make your check out to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish and place it in the postage-paid envelope that was sent along with the letter, which can either then be mailed back to us or dropped in the collection basket at Mass any weekend. (If you wish, you could use your own stamp to mail it back, thus saving us postage.)

## Evening Office Hours at the Rectory

When I arrived at OLPH almost a year ago, rectory office hours had been cut back as a cost-saving measure. The rectory was closed on Monday mornings, during the lunch hour on the other days of the week, and there were no evening hours. It was and is my opinion, however, that the rectory reception desk should be open at hours that are convenient to parishioners, so I set a goal to get expanded hours for the rectory front desk.

I am happy to report that we have been able to achieve that goal. First we restored Monday morning hours and made sure the desk was covered during the lunch hour. Now we are able to put the last piece in place: **starting this Monday, June 17, we will now have evening office hours at the rectory**. The reception desk will be open until 9:00 p.m. Monday through Friday evenings. Should you need to come in for a Mass card, or need to call to ask to speak to or leave a message for a priest, you will now be able to do so. In addition, the presence of a receptionist will make it easier for the priests when we have appointments with parishioners in the evening. So, the new hours the rectory reception desk is open are 9:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, with Saturday and Sunday hours remaining the same, 9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. (those hours are sufficient on the weekend). We are happy to be able to provide this pastoral service to all our parishioners. It's all part of the forward direction we are moving in at OLPH!

## Staff Planning Afternoon

Another goal we have been working toward is greater coordination and collaboration among the members of the professional Pastoral Staff and all the ministries and activities in the parish. Toward that end, I would ask you to keep us in your prayers on Monday, June 17. On that day, the Pastoral Staff will attend the 12:00 Noon Mass together and then spend the entire afternoon meeting to plan the calendar and other pastoral endeavors for the upcoming "ministerial year," September 2013-June 2014. We hope that such pastoral planning, including trying to come up with a coordinated overall Parish Calendar (including usage of the facilities) will make for a smoother and more beneficial exercise of all the ministries and activities that take place at OLPH.

## There are no Assigned Seats!

Notice the heading of this section: **there are no assigned seats!** Every once in a while I will hear a story about how a person is told that he or she cannot sit in a particular place because it is "someone else's seat." Well, there are no assigned seats, and no one "owns" a

seat. It is true that people tend to sit in the same seat week after week, but that does not give anyone exclusive ownership of a pew or of a seat. Except in the cases where a pew is reserved for particular people for a particular reason, all seating is open to everyone equally — even to non-regular Church-goers! It's just a simple fact of Christian hospitality that we should not make someone feel uncomfortable. So, unless the row has a "Reserved" sign on it because we need that row for a particular reason, anybody should feel free to sit anywhere. If you want a particular seat, make sure you get there early enough to get it, and please be understanding if someone else is sitting in "your" seat.

The one **exception** to this, other than when pews are reserved for a special occasion, is **seating for the handicapped and infirmed**. Many times those who have difficulty walking will sit in a front-row pew, often on the left center side, or even on the far left in front of the Divine Mercy chapel. **We should be aware of those who need special seating for reasons of health or immobility and should be willing to graciously yield our seat to them if necessary.** This is when we **should** allow "assigned seats" for these special needs. Thank you for your cooperation with this.

### **Ministry of Consolation: The Coordinator**

As we continue to look at the various roles in the Ministry of Consolation, let's explore the ministry of the Coordinator.

The Coordinator's job is to do exactly what the title suggests, that is, to coordinate all the details. This is a

ministry that is very heavily centered on telephone work. The Coordinator is the person who receives the call from the rectory after the funeral is booked at the church, and who then sets everything in motion. The Coordinator, working off of lists, calls and assigns all the ministers needed: the Companion, who works with the family (the role described in last week's bulletin); the computer person who will devise the booklet (worship aid) for the Funeral Mass; the cake baker; and the liturgical ministers for the Funeral Mass (greeters, readers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, altar servers). This ministry is perfect for an organized, detail-oriented person who does not mind making phone calls and who enjoys keeping lists and assigning people to various tasks. It's a great job for someone who may not want to work directly with families, but who nonetheless would like to be involved in helping to organize all the people needed to minister to a family.







## Catholics for Freedom of Religion

### America's 1<sup>st</sup> Freedom: Religious Liberty

The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) mandate, as of Aug 1, 2013, forces religious institutions, hospitals, schools and charities, as well as conscientious objecting individual employers, to provide contraception, sterilization and abortion inducing drugs as part of health insurance benefits. The fines for not complying with this HHS mandate are crippling and threaten the very existence of these institutions and businesses, seeking to coerce them into bending to the dictates of an unjust law.

## Declaración de los obispos del Estado de Nueva York

Junio 4, 2013 -

La siguiente es una declaración del Cardenal Timothy Dolan y los obispos del Estado de Nueva York:

Estamos profundamente afligidos por la introducción de un proyecto de ley en el Estado de Nueva York hoy que reduciría las restricciones en las leyes del estado sobre el aborto tardío y se corre el grave riesgo de ampliar el acceso al aborto en cualquier etapa de la gestación. Esta legislación podría agregar una amplia e indefinida excepción en "salud" para el caso del aborto tardío y derogar parte de la ley penal que regula las políticas del aborto, abriendo la puerta para que personal no médico practique abortos y potencialmente se despenalicen incluso los abortos forzados o coaccionados. Además, encontramos que la protección conciencia en el proyecto de ley es imprecisa e insuficiente, y estamos preocupados por la libertad religiosa de nuestros centros de salud. Mientras que los patrocinadores del proyecto dicen que esto sería simplemente "codificar" la ley federal, esta es selectiva en su codificación. En ningún caso se refiere a las partes de las leyes federales que limitan el aborto, como la prohibición de fondos de los contribuyentes, la prohibición del aborto de nacimiento parcial o protección para los no nacidos víctimas de violencia.

Como los pastores de más de 7.2 millones de católicos neoyorquinos, totalmente nos oponemos a esta medida, y exhortamos a todos nuestros fieles a hacer lo mismo, vigorosa y sin excusas. Invitamos a todos los hombres y mujeres de buena voluntad a unirse en este esfuerzo y derrotar este intento serio para ampliar la disponibilidad del aborto en nuestro estado y para codificar la propuesta más radical sobre el aborto de cualquier estado de la nación. Apoyamos los nueve primeros puntos en la agenda del gobernador que aumentan la verdadera dignidad de la mujer. Nos comprometemos nosotros mismos a examinar estas propuestas y trabajar con la legislatura en todos los esfuerzos que contribuyan a garantizar una real equidad para todas las mujeres y los hombres. Nuestra posición sobre estos asuntos será compatible con todos los esfuerzos de la Iglesia Católica en todo el mundo para mejorar la dignidad de la mujer. Tomar directamente la vida de un niño en el vientre materno de ninguna manera aumenta en la dignidad de la mujer.

En lugar de ampliar el aborto y hacer los abortos más frecuentes, nos gustaría proteger tanto a la mujer y al niño en el vientre materno. En Nueva York, donde uno de cada tres embarazos termina en aborto (y se eleva de 6 a 10 en algunas comunidades), está claro que nosotros como Estado hemos perdido de vista la dignidad del niño. Nos comprometemos con todos nuestros esfuerzos para derrotar a esta propuesta. Hacemos un llamado a todos los neoyorquinos prósperos a unirse con nosotros y con todo el liderazgo en Albany que comparte nuestra convicción que no tenemos necesidad que un proyecto como ese se convierta en ley. En vez de eso necesitamos mejorar y promover la vida y la dignidad de todos los seres humanos desde el momento de la concepción hasta el momento de la muerte natural.


Please make sure the correct amount is checked on the outside of your envelope.
