# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

## Reverence While Receiving Holy Communion

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. What a gift to the Church this Solemnity is, as it calls us to focus on the great gift of the Eucharist in the life of the Church! The Eucharist should be seen as more than just one of the seven Sacraments; instead, it should be seen as the central Sacrament, the Sacrament *par excellence*, from which flows the very existence of the Church and the life of faith. The Church cannot exist without the Eucharist, and *vice versa*.

Today's Solemnity should cause us to reflect not only on what the Eucharist is as the Real Presence, the Body and Blood of Christ, but also on how the celebration of the Eucharist always draws us more deeply into the offering of Christ to the Father, and how our participation in that Sacrament transforms us to offer our lives to the Father more deeply in union with Jesus. Indeed, during this Year of Faith we are all invited to "Belong More Deeply" in being a Eucharistic People who live our lives with Christ at the center.

It has been suggested to me that it would be beneficial to review some important aspects that are a part of a reverent reception of Holy Communion at Mass, and I think today is the perfect occasion to do so. Please take a moment to note the following points:

**Remember to say "Amen":** The proper response after the minister says "The Body of Christ" or "The Blood of Christ" is "Amen." There should be no other response. "Thank you," or "I believe," or just saying nothing are not proper responses. Your "Amen" is an important part of the ritual act of receiving Holy Communion, as it is your proclamation of your belief of *what* you are receiving, *Who* you are receiving, and *what it means in your life*. Wait for the minister to say "The Body of Christ" or "The Blood of Christ" — don't say it as soon as you step up. The "Amen" is supposed to be a response of faith to what has been said to you.

**Make a proper "throne" if you are receiving in the hand:** Make sure your hands are flat, clean, and ready to receive the consecrated bread. Par-

ents, please check your children's hands before you leave home, to make sure they are clean! (Actually, make sure yours are clean, too...sometimes adults need to do better with this!)

**When the Sacred Host is placed in your hand, consume it immediately; do not begin to walk away:** Proper reverence demands that you immediately consume the Host by immediately using your bottom hand to place the Host in your mouth.

**When receiving on the tongue, open your mouth and put your tongue out:** You must remember to open your mouth and put your tongue out. It is irreverent and unsanitary for you to keep your mouth open only a little bit and for the minister to have to maneuver to try to get the Host into your mouth.

**You should not be chewing gum or have any lozenges or mint in your mouth:** It might seem incredible to have to say this, but ministers have encountered situations such as these. This actually leads to the next point:

**Remember that we are to fast from food and all liquids, except water and medicine, for one (1) hour before Holy Communion:** This is an important aspect of our spirituality, as we are asked to spiritually and physically, at least in a minimal sense, create an openness, emptiness, and sense of hungering for the Lord. It is important that we know the Eucharistic food we receive is not the same thing as other, ordinary food.

## Assignment of Clergy at OLPH

As you know, this month Fr. Ignace, Fr. Moise and Fr. Michael are leaving us for their new assignments. That means we are losing one full-time Associate Pastor (Fr. Ignace), one Associate Pastor who, although he also ministered in another parish, nonetheless functioned like a full-time Associate Pastor because he took duty, daily Mass, funerals and weddings and other parish work (Fr. Moise), and a resident (Fr. Michael). I was informed by the diocese this past week that the only replacement we would be getting would be a resident with only 1/5 (20%) of his assignment being at OLPH. Think about what that means: on paper, we are

losing 1 ½ priests and a resident and only getting 1/5 of a priest; in actuality, we are losing 2 priests and a resident and getting only 1/5 of a priest. No matter how you look at it, it's a gigantic loss for OLPH.

The resident we are getting is Father Robert Ketcham, who is being assigned to replace Fr. Michael as Chaplain at St. John the Baptist Diocesan High School. Exactly what having him work here "20%" of his ministry will concretely mean has yet to be worked out, and I am continuing discussions this week. No matter what, this is a big "hit" for OLPH, leaving Fr. John and myself to carry the load.

We have been hearing about the priest shortage for years now, and it is starting to hit home in earnest. We will make it work, but it will definitely involve adjustments, particularly in our weekday schedules, and we will have to depend on the cooperation and understanding of all of you. Figuring out how to make it work will be a work-in-progress over the next few weeks, and I will keep you informed.

### **Sacrament of Confirmation Last Tuesday**

Last Tuesday, May 28, Bishop Nelson J. Perez, Auxiliary Bishop of Rockville Centre and Vicar of the Eastern Vicariate of the diocese, administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to our young people at two liturgies, at 11:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. We take this opportunity to congratulate all our newly-Confirmed, and to assure them of our prayers and support. They are all receiving letters and other materials to encourage them to continue to be involved in the life of the parish, including an invitation to join our Youth Ministry, Youth Faith in Action. Please take some time this week to pray for all these newly-Confirmed young people, that the Gifts of the Holy Spirit sacramentally conferred through the laying on of hands and the anointing with Sacred Chrism will truly grow and blossom into great fruit in their lives and in the life of our parish.

I offer gratitude and appreciation for Mr. Tom Acemoglu, our Director of Religious Education, his secretaries Kristine and Christine, and all the catechists and other "offerers" who gave so much

of themselves to bring our young people to this Sacrament. All of you need to know how much your offering of self is appreciated, and what a significant difference it makes in building up the spiritual life of our parish.

### **Farewell to Fr. Michael Next Weekend**

Next weekend we bid farewell to Fr. Michael Holzmann as he prepares to leave residency at OLPH in order to begin his new assignment as Pastor of the Parish of the Holy Cross in Nesconset. I have written before about how great it has been to have Fr. Michael with us this year, and how it has been a big help to me as he has been both personal long-time friend, and now, this past year, an informal advisor to me. I am grateful for his time with us.

Our celebration for Fr. Michael will be **next Sunday, June 9, at the 5:00 p.m. Mass, followed by a Barbecue in his honor, at which we can offer him personal greetings of farewell.** Please make every effort to attend.

### **Adult Education Course: Understanding the Mass**

As you can see from the announcement elsewhere in the bulletin, I am offering a second Adult Education Course on the topic of liturgy. This one is entitled "Understanding the Theology of the Mass" and we will explore topics related to the meaning and celebration of the Mass. I think as a result of the course, participants will be able to "get more out of" their participation at Mass — and, certainly, I hope, they will be able to bring more TO their celebration of Mass! As those who took my first course know, we always have a good time and a few laughs along the way. All are welcome to attend; you need not have attended the first liturgy course in order to join in on this one. Those who have their Basic Certification can apply this course toward the earning of an Advanced Certificate. Sign-up information is in the ad in the bulletin; I hope to see you there.

## *Father's Day Novena*



## REACTION TO POLICY CHANGE IN MEMBERSHIP STANDARDS FOR THE BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

For over 100 years, thousands of children in Catholic parishes, schools and fraternal organizations have benefited from chartering Scouting units. The Catholic Church has maintained a strong relationship with the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) through the National Catholic Committee on Scouting (NCCS) for many years and we hope to maintain that relationship.

Today, the voting members of the BSA voted to change the membership standards for its youth members. The BSA proposed in its resolution that "no youth may be denied membership in the Boy Scouts of America on the basis of sexual orientation or preference alone." Its membership standards for adult leaders remain unchanged.

The Catholic Church teaches that people who experience a homosexual inclination or a same sex attraction are to be treated with respect recognizing the dignity of all persons. The Church's teaching is clear that engaging in sexual activity outside of marriage is immoral. Individuals who are open and avowed homosexuals promoting and engaging in homosexual conduct are not living lives consistent with Catholic teaching.






