

IN LOVING MEMORY OF
Father Anthony Trapani
Born July 1, 1942
Ordained May 26, 1973
Died August 8, 2013

Late last week, we learned of the passing of **Fr. Anthony Trapani**, Pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help from 2007–2012. Father Anthony took leave of OLPH last June and most recently served as the Associate Pastor of St. Patrick's in Bay Shore.

Ordained in 1973, Father Trapani served at St. Bernard Church in Levittown, St. Martha in Uniondale, and St. Rose of Lima, Massapequa, before beginning 20 years of active duty as a chaplain in the United States Navy in June of 1987. A veteran of the 1991 Persian Gulf War, he also served at Bremerton Naval Hospital for two-and-a-half years, and from February-July 2003 helped set up and operate a 250 bed fleet hospital in Rota, Spain for service personnel wounded in Iraq and Afghanistan.

Let us pray for Fr. Anthony and his family and friends who mourn his passing. May he know eternal peace with God and all the saints!

FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTORAL STAFF

In the upcoming weeks, you will hear from some of the members of our Pastoral Staff who serve here at OLPH. This week, we hear from our new Business Manager, Deacon Thomas J. Bast



Personal – my wife Kathy and I lived in Las Vegas for the past 10 years. We moved there after selling our house in Wantagh where we lived for more than 25 years. We have been married for 48 years and have three children, two boys and a girl; our daughter was killed 29 years ago at the age of seventeen. Our oldest son lives in Las Vegas with his daughter, our only grandchild, and our younger son is retired Navy and lives between Las Vegas and Los Angeles.

Diaconate - I actually thought about becoming a deacon in 1974 but our children were young (the youngest four) and I believed my place was with them and all that it entailed such as going to their games, events, etc. In 1987 the time seemed right and I applied to the diaconate and with the help and support of Kathy and the grace of God, I was ordained a deacon in May 1993.

I was very fortunate in my service as a deacon having served in three wonderful parishes; St. Frances de Chantal in Wantagh (my home parish at the time) as deacon and business manager. I was asked to transfer to Our Lady of Peace in Lynbrook and with the permission of Bishop Murphy, transferred in 1999 where I served as business manager, pastoral associate and deacon. When we moved to Vegas, I served in St. Joseph, Husband of Mary and was responsible for the Baptism program, all wedding paperwork and preparation, the Adult Confirmation program and as Advocate for the Tribunal. If that looks as if it was a lot, it was – but it's indicative of the shortage of priests in the Diocese of Las Vegas and across the country.

Professional - My business background is extensive, both experientially and educationally in business practices, law, finance, management, and computers in a banking environment. I was developing ATMs and home banking systems in the 1970s when it was all research and development.

I worked on main-frame computers from programmer-trainee through to project management. Later, I transferred to internal audit carrying out data processing, operational and financial audits. My business career required us to transfer to California where we lived for three years and then was transferred back to New York. During this time extensive domestic and international travel was required and Kathy was able to join me on some of these trips. Subsequently, I became Division Vice-President and Director of Telecommunications for a worldwide subsidiary of a large bank corporation.

Kathy owned two successful businesses and in the early 1990s we owned a business together. It was at this time and while in diaconate formation that I realized I wanted to give something back to the Church – my business expertise. Hence, I began using my talents as Parish Business Manager at St. Frances de Chantal and now, 20 year later, here at Our Lady of Perpetual Help.

Kathy and I are glad to be back on Long Island as we are true New Yorkers and I'm very happy and excited about being here with Msgr. Joe and I promise you, I will do my very best as Business Manager of OLPH. I ask for your prayers and support to meet the business and financial challenges of OLPH and if you have any questions, please don't hesitate to call or make an appointment to see me.



WORKING FOR JUSTICE...50 years later!

August 28, 2013 marks the 50th Anniversary of March on Washington led by Dr. Martin Luther King. On this occasion, the United States Bishops has released a statement, part of which is included here:

As we mark the 50th Anniversary of the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom that occurred on August 28, 1963, we call attention to this significant event in the history of the struggle for Civil Rights for African Americans and other minority racial groups in the United States.

Marking this 50th Anniversary of the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom, we join our voices to those who call for and foster continued dialogue and non-violence among people of different races and cultures, and who work tirelessly for the transformative, constructive actions that are always the fruit of such authentic dialogue. We rejoice in the advances that have occurred over the past 50 years, and sadly acknowledge that much today remains to be accomplished. However, we must always view the task that remains from the perspective of the continued call to hope and in the light of faith. Dr. King once stated, "We must accept finite disappointment, but never lose infinite hope." Those who participated 50 years ago in the March on Washington rooted themselves in infinite hope. Pope Francis wrote in Lumen Fidei, "Faith teaches us to see that every man and woman represents a blessing for me, that the light of God's face shines on me through the faces of my brothers and sisters." We also must join with one another rooted in infinite hope and, in light of what faith teaches, work to advance and fulfill the dream. We join the call for positive action that seeks to end poverty, increase jobs, eliminate racial and class inequality, ensure voting rights, and that provides fair and just opportunities for all.

The U.S. Senate has passed comprehensive immigration reform legislation by a large margin.
