### **REMINDER REGARDING THE COMMUNION FAST**

Please remember that we are supposed to observe a Communion Fast before receiving Holy Communion. This means we do not eat any foods or drink any liquids for one hour before receiving Holy Communion, the only exception being water or medicine. This also means that we are not to chew gum during Mass, and certainly not while we are coming forward to receive Holy Communion. Let's be sure we are appropriately prepared to receive Holy Communion by observing this important rule of the Church.

La palabra de Dios es viva y activa:

### *Primer Lectura (Isaías 55,10-11): La Palabra de Dios es Creadora*

El profeta Isaías proclama un mensaje de esperanza: La Palabra de Dios siempre produce resultados y es un acto creador. La promesa de salvación de Dios se cumplirá.

### *Segunda Lectura (Romanos 8,18-23): Esforzarse con Esperanza por una Nueva Creación*

San Pablo proclama un mensaje de esperanza. Somos hijos de Dios, que pasamos con Cristo a través del sufrimiento en nuestro camino de esperanza hacia la libertad de Dios para nosotros y para un mundo nuevo.

### *Evangelio (Mateo 13,1-23): Una Semilla Que Produce Fruto*

#### **1. La Semilla de la Palabra**

#### **2. Un Sembrador Generoso**



**3. 



**PREPARING FOR Sunday, July 16, 2017—  
THE FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

*Jesus said, "The seed sown on rich soil  
is the one who hears the word and understands it,  
who indeed bears fruit and yields a hundred or sixty or thirtyfold."*

Matthew 13:23

**Isaiah 55:10-11**

Just as waters sent from heaven (rain and snow) are essential for growing crops to feed our stomachs, the Word that comes from the mouth of God is essential for feeding our minds and hearts. The prophet Isaiah poetically gives us a picture of the water cycle we learned in science class: the rain falls from the sky, waters the ground, and then evaporates back up to begin again. Just so with God's Word. He speaks it ("And God said, 'Let there be light...')", it accomplishes his purpose ("...and there was light") and returns to him. Isn't this what Jesus did? He is the Word made flesh and was sent to be with us, died for our sins, and returned back to the Father.

**Romans 8:18-23**

Paul writes to us today of hope and confidence in the midst of suffering: "The sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us." For a mother, her groaning with labor pains is transformed to wondrous joy when her child is born. We should also have such a hopeful attitude that no matter what we are going through now, as long as we are following God earnestly, our present sufferings will fade and we shall soon share in God's glory.

**Matthew 13:1-23**

Jesus gives us a familiar story today, the parable of the sower and the seed. Both the seed that the farmer scatters and the ground it is thrown on can be taken to be us as we listen to the Word of God. Do we hear what God is saying to us when we're at Church or when he speaks to our hearts during prayer? What do we do with what we hear? Are we good soil producing good fruits? Do we try yet fail to act on this Word in our daily lives? Do we even really try at all or do we get too distracted by the cares and pleasures of the world? It's never too late to start trying!

**Gospel Reflection Questions....**

*After reading next Sunday's Gospel take some time to pray on it before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.*

1. Jesus mentions "cares of the world and lure of wealth" as rocky ground and thorns that keep the seed from taking root. What is your "rocky ground?" Are you a busy pathway where the Word is sown but then is trampled? And can the thorns of worldly anxiety choke the Word when it comes to you?

2. According to Pope Francis, what do we do about receiving the "seed" if we know our soil or field is a place filled with stones and thorns? A field is a place for sowing seeds. "... When we accept the word of God, then we are the Field of Faith! Please, let Christ and his word enter your life; let the seed of the Word of God enter, let it blossom, and let it grow. God will take care of everything, but let him work in you and bring about this growth.

"... In silence, let us all look into our hearts and each one of us tell Jesus that we want to receive the seed of his Word. Say to him: Jesus, look upon the stones, the thorns, and the weeds that I have, but look also upon this small piece of ground that I offer to you so that the seed may enter my heart. In silence, let us allow the seed of Jesus to enter our hearts. ... Allow it to grow, and God will nurture it."




