



STATEMENT FROM BISHOP WILLIAM MURPHY **CONCERNING SUPREME COURT DECISION** **LEGALIZING SAME-SEX MARRIAGE**

Here is the statement issued by Bishop Murphy concerning the recent Supreme Court decision. I make his words my own as our Catholic Church continues to uphold the God-given, true meaning of marriage as being possible between only one man and one woman.—Msgr. Joe

“[The] wrongly-decided decision by the United States Supreme Court does nothing to alter the truth on the meaning of Holy Matrimony, a sacrament given to us by Jesus Christ. Holy Matrimony is a Sacrament, a covenant by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life. It is clear that the U.S. Supreme Court has chosen to accept a culture-driven redefinition of marriage. What is equally clear is that no other union is, or can ever be, its equal, and we have the God-given and constitutional right to proclaim religious truths, in the public square, as well as in our churches, just as we have been doing for almost 50 years in the ever-vigilant battle against another wrongly-decided decision, Roe V. Wade.”

MINISTRIES TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

OLPH seeks to be a place where all are welcome and can worship fully and actively. Please take note of the following:

Parking: Specially designated parking spaces can be found on the North and South Sides of the Church.

Entering the Church: A specially operated handicapped entrance is on the north side of the Church (in the Chase bank parking lot). A ramp is also found on the south side of the Church, near the handicapped parking spaces.

Hearing Devices: If you struggle to hear, listening devices are available. Simply go to the Sacristy (you can enter via the right of the Sanctuary) and ask for one. You'll need to leave some type of ID or “deposit” so we can be sure we get them back.

Special Seating: We have provided chairs with arms to make it easier to get up and down.


Doesn't our Church look wonderful? It often looks like the "place to be" because of the dedicated parishioners who care for the plants and flowers each week.

Our Homeless Van Ministry continues to serve those in need in our community as we minister to approximately 15 people each week.

OFFERERS NEEDED!

- Offerers sign up for the times they can help so you do not have to “go out” every time. Some go out once a month, some every other week, some a little more, some a little less.
- When you make a run, you meet at OLPH at approximately 7:00 P.M. and return at approximately 9:30 P.M.
- You never go out alone.
- We always try to balance between male and female offerers...we are in need of some male offerers.
- You can always come and “try it out”....and see if it’s for you.
- You must be VIRTUS trained and complete all offerer requirements for OLPH.



PREPARING FOR July 12, 2015 FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two.

Mark 6:7

Amos 7:12-15

When Amos prophesied the overthrow of the sanctuary, the fall of the royal house, and the captivity of the people, it was more than Israelite officialdom could bear. The priest of Bethel drove Amos from the shrine—but not before hearing a terrible sentence pronounced upon himself.

Ephesians 1:3-14

Ephesians was written by Paul while he was in prison, and is catechetical rather than pastoral; that is, its intent was not to address problems in a particular church, but rather to extol, enumerate and explain the great and comprehensive work of salvation which God in His goodness has brought about through Christ.

Mark 6:7-13

The preparation for the mission of the Twelve is seen in the call (1) of the first disciples to be fishers of men (Mark 1:16–20), (2) then of the Twelve set apart to be with Jesus and to receive authority to preach and expel demons (Mark 3:13–19). Now they are given the specific mission to exercise that authority in word and power as representatives of Jesus during the time of their formation.

Gospel Reflection Questions....

After reading next Sunday's readings and Gospel, take some time to pray on them before you come to Mass. Use the questions below to aid your reflection.

1. "Evangelizing" means to bring the Good News to all humanity, and through its influence to make humanity new, transform it from within. How can you transform humanity around you in your daily life?

2. Pope Francis said that the Gospel "must be proclaimed in poverty," and that Jesus wanted the disciples to have a "no frills attached" attitude—"no food, no sack, no money in their belts." How does this kind of detachment help disciples heal the "wounded and oppressed" mentioned below?

This is the mission of the Church: the Church that heals, that cares [for people]. I sometimes describe the Church as a field hospital. True, there are many wounded, how many wounded! How many people who need their wounds to be healed! This is the mission of the Church: to heal the wounded hearts, to open doors, to free [people], to say that God is good, God forgives all, that God is our Father, God is tender, that God is always waiting for us.
