## PASTOR'S PAGE

### *An amazing weekend!*

Those who were able to come to Mass last weekend, our first weekend back with public Masses since the coronavirus shutdown, experienced a celebration of the Eucharist that was amazing, beautiful, deeply meaningful beyond words, and quite emotional. There were tears in many eyes (mine included!), and it was obvious to see how much it meant to all of us to be back. As I said in my remarks at each Mass, though, I won't consider us as really being "back" ("mission accomplished," so to speak) until we are able to all gather together without any limits on attendance, all able to gather with as many of us as can fit in the church. Until then, we continue to take our steps of phasing things in along the way.

I want to thank everyone who cooperated with the special procedures we had to implement; everyone was very kind, open-minded and charitable. These special procedures will continue for a while, so I need to ask for your continued cooperation. Thanks to all who functioned, and will continue to function, as Ministers of Hospitality, to ensure that all ran, and will continue to run, smoothly: our great Ushers, and those parishioners who have come forward to serve as Special Ministers of Hospitality to supplement and assist our regular Ushers. Once again, we see how the great people of OLPH make this "the place to be."

If you are not yet able to return to Mass for one reason or another, please do not worry about that. Know that we miss you and we look forward to having you back. The bishop continues to grant a dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass, so you are not committing a sin by missing Mass. Your safety and security come first. We will not be complete until you are back, and we await that day, but please do not return until you are able. We continue to be united in prayer and in faith, and we will continue to provide a recording of the Mass posted on our website.

It is my fervent hope that in the ensuing weeks more and more restrictions will be lifted and we'll be able to slowly, step by step, return to a completely normal celebration of the Eucharist.

### *Some extraordinary work was done...*

During the time when the church and the offices were shut down, we had a number of people who were more or less our own "essential workers" who continued to work on an occasional basis, doing things as they needed to be done to allow us to continue to operate on a very minimal level of sustenance. I always hesitate to list names, for fear

of leaving someone out, and let me apologize in advance if I have missed anyone (please let me know), but I thought you should be aware of their names; these are the folks who went "above and beyond" in helping to keep things going:

The priests, deacons and staff members who contributed daily reflections; Joselyn Kalt, who kept up with our website and social media presence; Chris Ferraro and Fr. Frank, who assisted with social media, our YouTube page, recording the Mass, and other related responsibilities; Mark Costantino, our Head Sacristan; Tom Crennan, our Business Manager, and Linda Coppola in our Business Office; Carole Carrano, our Parish Secretary; Bill Hughes, from our Maintenance Department; Jenine Jimenez-Spina, who contributed reflections for children on YouTube; Carmel Becker, who continued to do the bulletin each week from home, for posting on line; and the offerers who kept our St. Vincent de Paul ministry open to serve the needs of the poor.

In all, I would sum it all up in six words which summarize my experience of OLPH every day: "so, so many good, good people!"

And, of course, we have to give a very deep and heart-felt thank you to all the folks in our society who put themselves out there on the front lines in time of danger: all the medical personnel (doctors, nurses, hospital staff, other hospital workers such as maintenance, *etc.*); first responders such as police, fire, EMT's, *etc.*; and those who worked in grocery stores, drug stores, other merchants, truck drivers, and other services which we rely on so much. May God's blessings be on ALL of you!

### *Happy Father's Day!*

Allow me to offer blessings and best wishes to all fathers celebrating Father's Day today! May God bless you for the many sacrifices and offerings you make for your children. We should be grateful to you not just on one day, but all year long, for the important role you play. The role of a father giving witness as a Christian man within the family is one that is unique and irreplaceable. I ask that all fathers never underestimate the important role they play in the faith formation of their children. Unfortunately, in some families, raising the children in the faith is something that is relegated to the mother alone, and that is extremely unfortunate. I ask all Christian fathers to take seriously their role and responsibility in being a witness to their faith to their children, and perhaps especially to their sons. I'll say it again: no

one can replace the importance of the father in the life of a family.

Let's also keep in our prayers today those who perhaps find Father's Day to be a difficult time — fathers who have lost children; children who have lost their fathers; husbands and wives who are having difficulty conceiving a child; fathers and children who are estranged from one another; fathers whose children are ill and suffering.

### *Summer Appeal*

It's the time of year when we are again drawing attention to our annual **SUMMER APPEAL**. You should have already received your 2020 **SUMMER APPEAL** mailing. I respectfully and humbly ask that everyone take this **SUMMER APPEAL** very, very seriously and participate in it by making your contribution, and, I hope, by being able to offer the requested amount, \$125, if not more.

As you might expect, due to the interruption in Sunday Masses and other parish activities, we did experience a loss of parish income. Lost income from collections and other sources (votive candles, for example) totaled, as of this writing, **over \$112,000** (even more than at the time the letter was written). I ask you to keep that in mind as I beg for your support in our annual **SUMMER APPEAL**, as I do every year at this time.

As you know, our **SUMMER APPEAL** is a direct request from me, as your Pastor, to you, with no meetings, no time commitment on your part, and no phone calls. **Every dollar you give stays right here in the parish**, unlike with bazaars and other events where fees must be paid to vendors. Allow me to say **THANK YOU** to all who have made the **SUMMER APPEAL** so successful in prior years! I am very, very grateful, and I am once again pleading for your help.

This year, monies from the **SUMMER APPEAL** will be used for two purposes. First, it will be used to help offset losses in income due to the coronavirus shutdown. In addition, we hope to be able to use monies from this year's **SUMMER APPEAL** for projects which we have on our agenda, such as facilities modifications we have had to make because of the coronavirus (e.g., purchasing plexiglass screens in the offices and sanitizing equipment), upgrading our technology equipment, including our campus WiFi access and video capabilities in the church (the importance of which the shutdown highlighted for us), upgrading the security cameras on our grounds, and

much-needed repairs to our parking lots.

So, I am requesting a donation of **one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125)**, which is the same as last year's request. Believe me, I know well, and deeply, deeply appreciate, that many of you already give very generously to OLPH on a regular basis all year long, and that you support other parish fund raisers. I also understand that you yourself may have been negatively impacted by the coronavirus shutdown. However, please understand that this year especially the **SUMMER APPEAL** is essential for our ongoing financial health, and so I do not hesitate to beg for your generosity. If you are able to give \$125, and perhaps even more than that amount, I would be extremely personally grateful. Of course, if you must give less, I appreciate your sacrifice in giving whatever you can.

You can make your check out to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish, with the notation "2020 Summer Appeal," and place it in the envelope provided in the mailing, which can either then be mailed back to us or dropped in the collection basket at Mass any weekend. **Thank you for your support and generosity!**

### *Sale of Convent*

Just a brief word to update you: as you know, we have a buyer for our Convent building, and I wanted you to know that, even with the pandemic, the process has continued to move forward. We have continued to receive all diocesan approvals, and all the pieces are falling into place. If all goes well, I'm hoping that everything will continue moving smoothly for the selling of the Convent. More information will be coming as appropriate.

## **SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR BEING IN CHURCH**

### **FOR THE SAFETY OF EVERYONE, ALL WHO ENTER MUST:**

- ▶ **WEAR A FACE MASK OR FACE COVERING — NO EXCEPTIONS**

## **THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION**

**Confessions are being celebrated in the school building, in classrooms in the “new school” annex along High Street every Saturday, 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. until further notice.**

**Each priest will be in his own classroom.**

**These are the protocols that must be followed for going to Confession:**

- ▶ **Entry is only via the blue doors at the north end of the hallway (off of the small parking lot)**
- ▶ **Exit is only via the doors at the south end of the hallway (into the large parking lot)**
- ▶ **Everyone — priests and penitents — is required to wear face masks or face coverings**
- ▶ **Lines on the floor will indicate a 6-foot social distance between those waiting on line outside each classroom**
- ▶ **Signs on easels outside the classroom will indicate the name of the priest who is in the classroom**
- ▶ **Social distancing and plexiglass dividers will keep a safe distance between priest and penitent, whether the penitent celebrates anonymously or face-to-face (both options are available)**







## CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF RELIGION



### Persecution of Churches Continues in America

Prohibiting the reception of Holy Communion was one condition for churches to reopen, according to a May 26 Executive Order in Howard County, Maryland. "There shall be no consumption of food or beverage of any kind...including as part of a religious service," the order stated. "If singing takes place, only the choir or religious leaders may sing."<sup>(1)</sup>

This order coincided with statements from Dr. Anthony Fauci, who recommended churches should stop distributing Communion. "I think for the time being, you just gotta forestall that," Fauci said.<sup>(2)</sup>

Days later, the Maryland county reversed this Executive Order. "For the Catholic community, the reception of Communion is central to our faith lives and to our public worship."<sup>(3)</sup> "We are pleased to hear that Howard county will be lifting restrictions on faith institutions..." said the Archdiocese of Baltimore.<sup>(4)</sup>

A family of 12 in Virginia has filed a First Amendment lawsuit against Virginia Governor Northam over his COVID-19 Executive Order barring residents from freely assembling for religious worship and forbidding public gatherings of more than 10 people.

The Center for American Liberty (CAL) is representing the family in its case against the restriction, which, in addition to stopping them from frequenting secular establishments as a group, bars them from "going to the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession), receiving the Sacrament of the Eucharist (Holy Communion), and praying on their private property with their priest and other believers."<sup>(5)</sup>

"The Executive Orders wrongly and unconstitutionally classify the exercise of religion as non-essential," said a CAL attorney. "Gov. Northam's restrictions on religious expression are overly broad, discriminatory, and unconstitutional. Our plaintiffs have been blessed with 10 children. [This Order] discriminates against them because of the size of their family...while smaller families do not face such a prohibition."<sup>(6)</sup>







## PREPARING FOR Sunday, June 28, 2020

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time  
*Jesus said, "Whoever finds his life will lose it,  
and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it."*

Matthew 10:39

### 2 Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a

We hear in this first reading of an act of kindness and its reward. Elisha was a prophet and as such was constantly traveling in order to preach the Word of God far and wide. In the city of Shunem, a wealthy and influential woman and her husband decided to add onto their house to make place for Elisha to stay when he passed through. As a way of thanking her, Elisha promised that she would bear a son who would take care of her in her later years. This woman illustrates how we are to receive a prophet and the Word of God: with openness and eager welcome. Elisha's response illustrates that God has rewards in abundance for those of us who welcome him with open arms.

### Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

In this letter, Paul teaches the members of the church in Rome what their baptism meant. Being baptized into Jesus means sharing in his death but then also sharing in his resurrection. Here, then, is the real Good News: since "death no longer has power over him" we no longer need fear death! Just as Christ's death means that he will die no more, so too we who are baptized are dead to sin and alive in newness of life "living for God in Christ Jesus."

### Matthew 10:37-42

In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus gives five lengthy speeches. We hear today the conclusion of the second of these speeches as Jesus instructs his apostles to go out on their mission. First, he tells them of the demands and then he tells them of the rewards. In order to be worthy of him, his disciples must put him above all else, even family and friends, and take up their cross to follow him. Although it may seem a paradox, Jesus says that whoever does this will lose their life but as a result will also find life, new life that is even better than the first. Rewards are promised to those who receive the apostles because they are really receiving Jesus himself. Just as the wealthy woman of the first reading, all who welcome prophets and righteous people will receive the rewards of one.

*"... Access to safe drinkable water is a basic and universal human right, since it is essential to human survival and, as such, is a condition for the exercise of other human rights. Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water, because they are denied the right to a life consistent with their inalienable dignity. This debt can be paid partly by an increase in funding to provide clean water and sanitary services among the poor."*
